If we get \$194,000.00 we will have overspent \$12,000.00. In the department of Zoning and Planning we have overspent \$5,000.00, all other departments very close to the budget. Mr. Hayward read a letter from the Northeastern Illinois Planning Commission for contribution for year beginning May 1st, 1972. Mr. Tucker suggested that it be held until next month and put into 1972 business.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Fentress reported that the engineering work for the 1972 MFT has been completed. The request for bids has been sent out and the proper publication has been made and the sealed bid opening will occur at 10 A.M., May 8th at Wight Engineers and either himself or Mr. Renshaw will be present. Mr. Fentress also reported that on Monday the 17th of April the first BACOG Transportation Committee Meeting was held. It was headed by John Gleason and there were about 7 people there representing the various Villages involved. The only progress made was that it was decided that they determine what agreement or disagreement they had with the Barton Aschmann recommendations for roads. And that they would use that as a departure point to see whether they thought their recommendations for the future placement and improvement, widening, or creation of roads were in accord with or not in accord with them and would render a report when they had further chance to study it. Someone was appointed to go to Barton Aschmann and find out their basis for the given recommendations, 04/28/12

what their studies were and why they made the recommendations they did before they would say catagorically that they were against it or for it. The next meeting is going to be the early to mid part of May.

Mr. Fentress reported that the summer mowing for the shoulders of the roads and the cleanup project contract for the Village roads will not be with Mr. Scully this year. A Mr. Brommelkent will be doing this work. Mr. Fentress reported that he had patterned a contract with Mr. Brommelkent which involves the same roads at the same price. Mr. Frieking will continue to mow Cuba Township.

Mr. Hayward brought up the matter of the bridge of Merri-Oaks and Mr. Fentress is going to check on it and report on it next month.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. Grigsby reported 84 miscellaneous routine calls, 11 motor vehicle accidents, 30 traffic citations issued, and 3 major cases. (2 thefts and 1 recovery of a stolen vehicle which was stolen from Carpentersville.)

Mr. Grigsby reported that the two new cars are in service and are considered satisfactory. Replacement of these vehicles will be every six months.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Bateman absent - no report.

HEALTH: Mrs. Thompson absent. Mr. Hayward reported that Mrs. Thompson had taken the responsibility for getting a proper insignia for a design which she has not done so far and that this should be done within the next year.

BUILDING: Mr. McLaughlin read a resolution of an agreement with Barrington for building inspection services. A copy of which is to be kept in the Village files. The fee of the building inspector and the fee charges for building permits to be investigated and discussed at a future meeting. A motion was made that we adopt this resolution and seconded.

Roll call. 4 ayes, 0 nays, 2 absent. Resolution adopted.

Mr. McLaughlin read a note from the Village Clerk in regards to building permits issued 2 years ago to a Mr. Apollo. A second person has taken over and wants to know if these permits are still in effect. Was decided to turn this matter over to legal consel.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craig absent. Mr. Hayward reported that the Magnum's airstrip hearing was really in our favor because the courts ruled that they would have to comply with out building codes. Mr. Hayward also reported the Old Heidelburg case is still pending.

NEW BUSINESS: President Hayward read a letter from the Products of the Blind wanting to solicit in the Village. The matter was turned over to the Police Chief to handle.
