# MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

A regular meeting of the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held on May 22, 1972 at Countryside School in the Village of Barrington Hills at 7:30 P.M.

Meeting was called to order by the Clerk. In the absence of President Hayward, a motion was made and seconded appointing John McLaughlin as President Pro-Tem. Motion carried. Roll call.

Mr. Tucker made the following corrections: Appropriation adjustments - Public Safety Account # 601 to be decreased \$ 300.00; Account # 610 to be increased \$ 300.00. Final total being \$ 4,600 rather than \$ 4,300. A motion was made and acconded approving the minutes. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Mr. Welby submitted the Treasurer's Report for the month of April. He noted that the overall spend-in for the year was \$ 9,000 above our income. This year's budget showed spending of \$ 24,000 more than last year; however, the Village spent \$ 27,000 less than budgeted. A motion was made and seconded approving the Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.

FINANCE: Mr. Tucker submitted theefollowing bills to the Board for approval:

A motion was heard and seconded approving the bills for payment. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Mr. Tucker requested all the budgets for 1972-72 fiscal year be handed to him by June 14th in as much as it is necessary to have the 1972-73 Appropriation Ordinance published by July 31 and the Levy Ordinance filed by the second Tuesday of September.

Mr. Tucker made a motion that Lester Witte & Company be authorized to audit our 1971-72 books. Motion was seconded.

Motion carried. Mr. Welby will notify Lester Witte & Company.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Fentress announced the bids for the 1972 MFT program. Liberty Asphalt was low bidder with a bid of \$33,536.00. A motion was made and seconded that the Village accept Liberty's low bid. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays 1 absent. Motion carried.

Mr. Fentress announced that the light at the intersection of Helm Road and Route 62 is in service.

Mr. Craig announced that the Village has to bring Hart Road up to grade by August. Wight gave an estimate of 7 to 8 thousand. Liberty Asphalt gave an informal bid of 9 thousand. The Village could close the road, however we might be subject to public protest and a suit for damages as the public has the right to use it. Wight said that the work might be done for less if general funds were used, eliminating the MFT paperwork costs. Mr. Fentress was directed to explore with Wight the costs of 2 sets of bids or an alternate bid.

Mr. Fentress announced that a group of residents on Helm Road had cleaned that road up on May 20th.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. Grigsby reported 97 routine calls and investigations, 18 accidents, 52 citations, 2 burglaries, 2 thefts and 1 missing person.

He next announced the promotion of Daniel Piper to Patrolman 2nd Class with a salary raise in accordance with the salary schedule.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Bateman had no report.

HEALTH: Mrs. Thompson reported that she expects the **results** of tests to two septic systems overflow by next meeting. Dye tests

are also being made in Lake County along Hart Road. Mrs. Thompson added that the Board ought to consider an ordinance requiring the cleaning of septic systems every two years. More investigation will be done concerning enforcement of such an ordinance. Mrs. Thompson noted the "Turnberry" sign at the intersection of 62 and 63 and questioned the legality of the sign. Mr. Renshaw was directed to check it out.

Mrs. Thompson hopes to have some Village stationary by the next meeting.

BUILDING: No report.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Carig reported that no bids have been received in response to the publication for the Village owned property.

motion was made to have the Ordinance republished with bids opened at the meeting of July 24th. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Mr. Bateman was directed to arrange for a large sign on the property showing it's zoning classification, single family residence.

The case of the disconnection of 80 acres of land owned by W. A. Frank was heard the last Friday in April. Mr. T. Dyke gave testimony for the Village. The case was put under advisement.

Mr. Craig announced that as a result of the ethics legislation, reports must be filed by July 1, 1972 by the Village President, Trustees, Clerk, members of the Zoning Board of Appeals and members of the Plan Commission. He distributed a summary for all to read before filing.

NEW BUSINESS: Mr. McLaughlin read a letter from President
Hayward issuing his resignation, effective May 22, 1972. A motion
was made and seconded reluctantly accepting his resignation.
Motion carried.

Mr. McLaughlin noted that the Board will make appropriate recognition of his activities at a future date, oting that he worked for the Village since 1957. Mr. Grigsby added that Tom had served without salary, but that he and his wife Billie were selfless in donation of their time and home for the Village; he concurred that although not always in agreement with everyone, he had given a tremendous service to the Village of Barrington Hills. Mr. Tucker said that it had been a privilege working with Tom these many years. He asked counsel to draft a resolution for the minutes.

Mr. Tucker then nominated Mr. McLaughlin to act as President for the remainder of the term. Mrs. Thompson seconded.

Mr. McLaughlin stated that the Board had many decisions to make in the next year. He stated that he would appoint the Board as a committee as a whole to investigate, recommend, and act on a course of action by November 27, 1972. He desires to bring more residents into the running of the Village. Board members were asked to restructure their committees by the next meeting. Under these conditions, he would accept the nomination. With that statement, he tendered his resignation as Trustee, effective upon his election as Acting President. A motion was heard and seconded. Motion carried.

A motion was made and seconded to elect Mr. McLaughlin as Acting President. Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Mr. McLaughlin was then sworn into office by Mrs. Blanchard, Clerk.

A-motion was made and seconded that a bond in the amount of \$ 5,000 be required of John J. McLaughlin as Acting President, the terms therof being approved and that the Ohio Causalty Insurance

Company be approved as security on the Bond. Motion carried.

A motion was then heard nominating John C. Denton to fill Mr. McLaughlin's vacancy until his successor shall have been elected on the 3rd Tuesday of April, 1973. Motion seconded. Motion carried.

A motion was made and seconded approving Mr. Raymond J. Gřisby as co-signer for the President in his absence, of Village checks.

Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays, l absent. Motion carried.

A motion was then heard and seconded for adjournment. Motion carried.
