A regular meeting of the President and the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held on large 28, 200 July 26, 1971 at Countryside School in the Village of Barrington Hills at 7:30 P.M.

The minutes of June 28 were submitted for approval. Corrections were made. A motion was heard and seconded approving the minutes. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Mr. Welby stated that \$ 40,000.00 has come in in tax recipts to date. Also sales and state income taxes are now coming in regularly. MFT funds invested in Treasury bills was rolled over for 60 days as of July 22. A motion was made and seconded approving the Treasurer's report. Motion carried.

FINANCE: Mr. Tucker submitted the following bills to the Board for approval.

A motion was heard and seconded approving the bills for payment. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 3 absent. Motion carried.

Mr. Tucker presented the Arrpopriation Ordinance for approval. Motion made and seconded. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 3 absent. Motion carried.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Renshaw reported that the seal-coating should be finished by next week. All the roads north of County Line have been finished.

Mr. Craig submitted Wight's estimated costs of bringing
Hart Road up to the standards set by Illinois Commerce Commission.
\$ 7,600.00. Mr. Craig stated that we might get an extension
beyond the April 7, 1972 date set "if" we can show tangible
progress on the straightening of Hart Road as proposed earlier
through BACOG. However, Mr. Hayward noted that because of interference from North Barrington and Mr. Caldwell BACOG has not
come up with a definite proposal. Conflicting routes have been
published in the Courier, all in our Village, without consulting
our Village. President Hayward will check with Senator Graham

and BACOG to see what can be done about the crossing.

Mrs. Blanchard reported that the turn off at Helm Road has been confusing to drivers now that a new driveway has been put in just east of Helm Road. She is to request that Mr. Fentress contact the State Highway Department about the possibility of having a light installed.

Mr. Renshaw reported that at this point, any work done on Chapel Road dpeneds on Mr. MacArthur's report.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Chief Hummel reported 74 routine calls and investigations, 10 motor vehicle accidents, 1 fatal, 2 attempted burglaries and 1 burglary.

Chief Hummel was asked to get the brochure from the government concerning construction and renovation grants.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Craig notified Cook County Zoning Board of the illegal operation of a gravel pit on Beverly Road. They have acknowledged the letter.

Mr. Dateman announced the new officers of the Planning Commission. Chairman, Lawrence Bateman, Vice Chairman, Jack Train, Secretary, Martin Cassell. A motion was made and seconded approving their appointments. Motion carried.

The comprehensive plan as summitted by Barton-Aschman to BACOG was presented. Board took no action as it needs further study before recommendation. Suggestions were requested by August 9th.

Mr. Mertens will have to submit a plat of resubdivision to the Board and then it will go on the the Zoning Board of Appeals for action.

At the Plan Commission meeting Mr. J. Lageschulte was told that his Plan Developement did not comply with the Village Code. It was suggested that he purchase more land or come up with a

different plan. Mrs. Thompson noted that when she saw the plan in <u>Barrington Realty</u> she was told that two of the lots had been sold contingent to a zoning change.

Mr. Buck, from Mr. Janura's office, stated that the Forest Preserve has begun action to condemn the site around Magnum's. He also stated that he knew of no plans for picnic areas in the Barrington area Forest Preserves. Spring Lake area has been proposed as an area of nature study. (1955 suits - 20 year restraining order restricting the Spring Lake area to a nature preserve.)

Because of a question raised by the auditor, Mr. Craig investigated the Kurranz case. He had a 1 year variation to operate a landing strip which has not been renewed. He is now technically in violation to the zoning ordinance. At this time no one is objecting to his airstrip. It was the recommendation of counsel that the matter continue to lay dormant.

Mr. Bateman distributed copies of the proposed "Old Shop Farm Subdivision" of Mr. Talmey's. It will be put on the agenda for referral to the Plan Commission for a recommendation by the August meeting.

HEALTH: Mrs. Thompson reported continued public use of the spring along County Line. Mr. Craig stated that the Village by erecting a sign and reporting in the newspapers, has made an effort to notify the public. We have no legal responsibility. It was suggested that Mrs. Thompson direct a letter to the Cook County Highway Department concerning the matter.

At this time a proposed dog ordinance was distributed to the Trustees. Everyone is to look it over and have suggestions by the August meeting.

BUILDING: Mr. Hayward announced the pesignation of Mr. Spencer Rieke as Building Commissioner. He is negotiating with Mr. Roy Crumrine of Barrington. A motion was made and seconded authorizing President Hayward to negotiate, perhaps on a trial basis, with Mr. Crumrine to handle our building applications. Motion carried.

LEGAL: Mr. Craig presented an Ordinance for the acquisition of 3.2 acres of land known as Old Heidelburg. A formal letter to the Pioneer Trust & Savings Bank will be presented July 27th making an offer for the property. They will have 10 days to reply. If no answer is received, condemnation proceedings will begin. Mr. Tucker moved adoption of the Ordinance. It was seconded. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 3 absent. Motion carried.

Mr. Alex MacArthur appeared to state that he was awaiting a reply for Mr. Dvorak regarding his proposals to fix up Chapel Road.

Mrs. Kieckhefer querried how many licenses for dogs are necessary and would a Village license supercede the County tags? This will be determined by the wording of the Ordinance.

There being no further business, meeting was adjourned for and executive session.

Following the executive session, the meeting was reopened at which time the following motion was made. Adoption of a resolution to direct the Zoning Board of Appeals to hold public hearing for the purpose of rezoning the 9 plus acres owned by the Village from R-1 to R-3 (3 acre) zoning. Mr. Craig is to send a copy to Mr. Knouff. Motion seconded. Motion carried.

There being no further business, a motion was made and seconded to adjourn.
