A motion was heard and seconded approving the bills for payment. Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays 1 absent. Motion carried. ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Fentress reported the work in progressing on Hart Road. Lakeland Construction is doing the digging and building up, and Liberty Asphalt is doing the sealing. It should be completed by the November deadine.

Mr. Fentress met with Lake County and Cuba Township engineers about the bridge on Merri-Oaks and Cuba Road. It was decided that traffic is to be channelled down the middle, single lane, signs are being erected, guard rails installed and weight limits have been posted. The bridge will remain open, and next year a contract will be let in the spring to do the necessary repairs. Wight is doing the engineering. The Village will have to pay half and Lake County will pay the other half of the costs.

Mr. Fentress noted the flooding at the corner of Spring


Creek and Braeburn Roads. He stated that there is no practical of the Villageand private land ownens to the sowith. way to solve this temporary "chronic problem."

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Bateman requested our Board approve the subdivision off Kelsey Road as it is within our $1 / 2$ mile limits. A motion was made and seconded. There were no objections. Motion carried. The plat will be signed by the Plan Commission Chairman, Jack Train.

Mr. Bateman said that the Subdivision Ordinance will be ready for the Board by the next meeting. It will be necessary to set up a Public hearing before the Board can adopt the new Ordinance.

Mr. Mc ${ }^{\perp}$ aughlin read a letter from Mr. Knouff stating that two petitions for variations had been granted by the Zoning Board of Appeals on September 12, 1972. One to the Turners for division of their 9.5 acres and one to $N$. Cronin for setback variations. The Zoning Board also recommended that the Village Board approve the petitions for special use by the Telephone Company and Commonwealth Edison be granted.

A motion was heard and seconded approving an Ordinance, 72-12, for special use permit to Commonwealth Edison. Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays, 1 absent. Ordinance adopted.

A motion was heard and seconded approving an Ordinance, 72-13, for a special use permit to Illinois Bell Telephone Company. Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays, l absent. Ordinance adopted.

Clerk was directed to send copies of the ordinances to Illinois Bell, Commonwealth Edison and Mr. Crumrines office.

Mr. Owen Fairweather was appointed by President McLaughlin to fill the vacancy on the Zoning Board of Appeals left by Mr. Corbett.

The dumping at the intersection of Routes 62-59-63 is in direct violation of the Zoning Ordinance. Chief Hummel was directed to issue an order to stop the dumping. Mr. Craig is to look into it and take action to require the owner to clean up the mess.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Chief Hummel repprted 151 routine calls and investigations, 23 accidents, 42 citations, 8 major cases ( 1 attempted suicide, 1 missing person, 1 go cart theft solved, 2 thefts and 4 burglaries.)

Chief Hummel announced that vehicle stickers would go on sale October 1 at the Police Department. Deadine is January 1, 1973.

HEALTH: No report other than the fact Mrs. Thompson had received numerous calls regarding the dumping at 59-62-63.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craig reported that the statutes set up a procedure to be used to solve the problem of the incomplete house on Surrey Lane. 15 day notice to ownert--if not done as specified, Village files suit---get court order to hafe work done and then file a lien against the property. After three years, the Village can foreclose. It was suggested that the Village engineer deem it a hazzard and notify the owner and ask him to take steps, to fill the hole, or build. Mr. Crumrine is to send his report to Mr . Craig.

NEW BUSINESS: Mrs. Blanchard submitted the information sheets to the Board. They will be distributed along with a questionaire with the stickers. No additions were made.

Mr. McLaughlin asked that an answering device be placed on Mrs. Blanchard's telephone. Chief Hummel and Mrs. Blanchard will look into it.

Mr. Schroeder of Spring Creek Road spoke to the Board about the flooding there. He felt it a real hazzard. Children cannot get to the bus, possible problem for emergency vehicles and a general mess. It was suggested that the property owners meet with engineers from Wight to disucss the problem.

Mr. Richard Feldman of Surry Lane noted that the permit to build the unfinished house under discussion previoulsy is no longer valid. He noted that under Chapter 24, ll-31-1 of the Statutes a suit to "abate a nuisance" could be filed by the Village. Vern Hummel volunteered to supply the equipment to take down the structure.

Mrs. Woodridge, Secretary of Lake County Mass Transit District spoke to the Village about the future of transportation and cammuter plans.

PRESIDENT: Mr. McLaughlin reveiwed the fiscal survey noting that we have not solved the fiscal problems, only postponed them. He asked the Trustees to look it over and bring suggestions to the next meeting. The preliminary reports from all chairmen will be summarized at the October meeting.
