# MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

A regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held October 23, 1972 at 7:30 P.M. at Countryside School in the Village of Barrington Hills, Illinois.

Meeting was called to order by Acting President, John J. Mc aughlin. Roll call.

Minutes of the September meeting were submitted for approval.

Motion was heard and seconded approving the minutes as corrected.

Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Mr. Welby noted that property taxe receipts are down due to the fact that none have been received from Kane County and only \$ 12.00 from McHenry County. Our income is down on the sales tax and the income tax. Permits are ahead of budget. The expenditures are basically on budget. He noted receipts of \$ 2,371.25 from the sale of vehicle stickers.

We have not received any information on revenue sharing.

Clerk was directed to write. According to the formula used, our share should amount to around \$8,000.00.

Mr. Welby noted that we are at the maximum taxing amount on Police tax. However, under a referendum the \$.15 could be increased to \$.40.

A motion was heard and seconded approving payment of the bills.

Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays, 1 absent. (Mr. Bateman arrived late)

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Fentress noted that the work on Hart Road in nearly done. A hole has developed which is to be 10/23/72

filled. Wight Engineering will notify the Illinois Commerce Commission when the work is satisfactorily completed.

The contract has been let for the gaurd rails on the Cuba Merri-Oaks bridge. Signs have been ordered.

Spring Creek Road has very slow drainage. Engineers have said that it would be possible to run drainage tiles about 1000 feet to the creek for \$ 17.00 a foot. The owners along the road have suggested a joint project across private property to relieve the problem. Estimates for that ran \$ 3,975.00. At present, traffic can cross the area slowly.

Chapel Road also is under water. Ballast is needed. Since it is a MFT road, engineers will study the problem and make a recommendation. Liberty Asphalt quoted \$ 1,500.00 to raise the road one foot tapering to 6 inches for 300 feet.

Mr. Fentress read a letter from Wight quoting a price of 28,000.00 to replace the bridge on Cuba-Merri-Oaks Road. (Lake County would share half the expenses)

An estimate of \$ 80.00 to cut back the weeds at the east end of Helm road was given by Mr. Bromelkamp. In as much as it constitutes a traffic hazzard, Mr. Fentress is to notify him to cut the weeds back.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. Grigsby reported 74 routine calls and investigations, 23 accidents, 33 citations issued, 1 armed robbery and 4 thefts.

The replacement costs of the Police autos is \$ 2,000.00 over the estimates of last April. Chief Hummel will check the state auto pool for a better price.

Mr. Grigsby announced that the Corbett case has apparently been solved. He stated that we are indebted to the Village of 10/23/72

Barrington Hills Police Department for doing a splendid job. President McLaughlin thanked Chief Hummel and the department for the find job done on the case. He asked that a letter of appreciation be sent to all the law enforcement agencies who worked on the case.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Bateman announced that the Subdivision Ordinance had not been approved as the reprints aren't finished. It will be ready for the November meeting.

HEALTH: Mrs. Thompson is waiting for a final report on the Environmental Study being done through BACOG.

BUILDING: No Report.

ADMINISTRATION: No report.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craig read a letter from Mr. Loebakka of the Building Department with his recommendations regarding the T. Johnson unfinished home on Surrey Lane. It asks the owner to take down all standing walls, to fill or close in the basement, to cover the septic tank and to remove or enclose all the materials on the building site. If the owner did not comply in 20 days, condemnation proceedings would be instituted. (There is a 19,000.00 construction lien held by Frank Cesare on the property.) A motion was heard and seconded approving the course of action as stated in the letter from Mr. Loebakka. Roll call. Sayes, no nays, as one absent. Motion carried.

Mr. Craig stated that the dumping at the intersection of Route 59-62-63 constitutes a zoning violation. Mr. Renshaw is to meet with the owner at 2;30 Wednesday October 25 to discuss the problem. If the owner does not meet Mr. Rensahw's requirements to clean up the corner, Mr. Craig was to go ahead and file a court order against him. Motion was made and seconded to this

affect. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS: None.

NEW BUSINESS: Review of the departmental reports was postponed until the November meeting.

Mrs. Kieckhefer noted that the new work on Hart Road has left a dangerous unguarded curve. It was suggested that guard rails will be needed to prevent someone from dropping off. In as much as this has been a MFT project, Mr. Fentress will discuss it with the State.

There being no further business, a motion was made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.
