MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

A special meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held at 7:30 P.M. at Community Consolidated Countryside School in the Village of Barrington Hills. Meeting was called to order by President McLaughlin. Roll call.

Minutes of the November 27th meeting were presented to the Board for approval. A motion was heard and seconded approving the minutes. Motion carried.

TREASURER: Mr. Welby noted the purchase of Treasury bills with the money that has come in as a result of realestate taxes, road and bridge taxes and the sale of the Village owned real estate. About 400 vehicle stickers have been sold to date with an approximate income of \$5,400. He asked that the news media help in publicizing the deaddine date so that residents obtain their stickers before the 31st of December. Those stopped without stickers after that will be issued violation tickets. Mr. Welby announced the receipt of \$5,643.00 in revenue sharing funds and explained the formula used by the government. Overall, it was a light month and the Village is within budget. Motion was made

and seconded approving the Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.

FINANCE: In Mr. Tucker's absence, Mr. Welby presented the monthly bills to the Board for approval.

A motion was made and seconded approving the bills for payment.
Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Motion carried.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Fentress noted a credit of \$ 2,015.96 in MFT work. Due to the weather it was impossible to complete the 1972 contract. A motion was heard and seconded to request a credit of \$ 2,015.96 from the state. Motion carried.

Mr. Fentress reported that Chapel Road is not draining properly, creating a traffic hazzard. He requested that the troad be closed to all but local traffic. It is impossible to correct the problem in the winter. He was directed to have blockades erected.

The emingineering is proceeding of the ^Cuba Road Bridge. It is expected that the bids will be ready later this winter.

Northern Illinois Gas Company has made several openings on Donlea and Spring Creek Roads. They will be checked for proper closings.

Mr. Fentress noted that a preliminary draft has already been done on updating the Village Road Ordinance. The old one is inadequate.

Icing was a problem on the Village roads. Mr. Rensahw reported that he had talked to Mr. Sinnett who said that he had one truck to work with, and that the work would be done as soon as possible. Helm Road was very bad and Mrs. Cooke called to discuss the problem with Mr. McLaughlin. It was noted that one evening Danny Lawlor spent two hours pushing autos up the hill in front of his drive.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. Grigsby reported 61 routine calls and investigations, 26 accidents, 36 citations, 1 theft.

Mr. E. Keyes complained that contractors have been ruining the roads. The problem will be worked out.

As of 12/18/72 397 vehicle stickers has been sold. Mr. Grigsby estimated 1,8,00 to 2,000 vehicles in the Village. After January first those not displaying the stickers will be subject to citations and fines.

A letter from Sheriff Elrod was read responding to the thanks our Village expressed for aid in the Corbett case.

Mr. Grigsby read a letter of commendation from Mrs. Haney for the efforts Robert Mohn made in getting her son out of their home when it was on fire.

A synopsis of the Oak Security, Inc. report on security for the Village of Barrington Hills will soon be available the residents. It gives guidelines for future needs of the Village. A copy was sent to Mr. Craig tolook over.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Jack Train, Chairman of the Plan Commission appeared to report for Larry Bateman regarding the agricultural zoning change. Horse farms are permitted. Dense feeder operations are permitted with the modifications discussed. The Centex hearing has been postponed until January 19 at 2:00 P.M. in the Barrington Village Hall. At that time the petitioners case will be heard. Objectors will be heard at a date to be set later. BACOG will be doing the legal work, with Mr. Braithwaite acting as counsel. Clerk was directed to notify Mr. Zimmerman that his services will not be required. Mr. Braithwaite will prepare a resolution for our Village to adopt.

Ordinance 72-15 for the annexation of 20 acres of land to the Village was presented. After discussion a roll call vote was held. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Ordinance was adopted.

A second Ordinance, 72-16, regarding the suggested Zoning changes was read to the Board. (Article LL Sec. 3.2, 8.4, 8.8, 8.11, 9.4, and 10.3.) Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Ordinance was adopted. Clerk will have it published.

HEALTH: Mrs. Thompson reported that there will be a meeting on blood bank proposals for the area.

BUILDING: Mr. Mc aughlin read the report for December. There have been applications for 1 septic system, 1 barn and 3 houses.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craig reported that a resolution protesting the high assessment of farms presented a problem. He checked and found that all but McHenry County farmers could protest the assessment and ask for relief. No-one knew exactly where a resolution could be lodged undess with the legislature.

Mr. Sinnett has cleaned up the mess at Route s 63-59 and the billing was sent to the Development Corporation. Their attorney has indicated that they will be happy to pay it. The suit will be withdrawn December 19th. Chief Hummel is to ask the state for a snow fence to prevent future dumping.

Notice to clean up the building of Surrey Lane expires next week. It appears the leinholder is cooperating.

Commonwealth Edison went ahead on their request to the Illinois
Commerce Commission before permitsion had been granted to erect
the towers. As a result our Village has requested a rehearing on
Approximately
the grounds that from 1 to 4 miles of our boundary is along the
edge where the towers are to be erected and that due to their size,
the will be visible to the residents of the Village, and their appearance creates a detriment to the Village of Barrington Hills from an
asthetic sense and that Commonwealth Edison cease immediately and
they be required to place the cables underground. Mr. Craig received notice that the petition had been received but nothing more.
The manager from Fox River Grove called Mr. Craig and said that
they hope to file an injunction for the violation of the building
and zoning ordinances of the Village of Fox River Grove.

Mrs. Richards asked from the audience if our Village had been notified of the ICC hearing on this matter to which Mr. Craig replied yes.

There being no further business, a motion was made and seconded for adjournment. Motion carried.
