## MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES of THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

#### February 26, 1968

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held Monday, February 26, 1968 at 7:30 P.M. at Countryside School in the Village of Barrington Hills.

Before proceeding with the regular order of business,
Mr. Haldiman of Northern Illinois Gas appeared to inform
the Board about eight applications for permits to install
gas mains within the Village. After hearing Mr. Haldiman,
the papers were referred to Mr. Fentress for his signatures
and he was to send them back to Mr. Haldiman.

President Hayward then resumed the regular order of business.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Mr. Smith informed the Board that he would take half of the Treasury bills due in March and convert them to cash and deposit them in the corporate account. The other half would be reinvested in new six month Treasury bills.

Mr. Tucker made a motion to reinvest the \$10,000.00

from the Treasury bills in new Treasury bills. Motion was seconded. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays and 2 absent. Motion carried.

Mr. Smith noted that the amount of traffic fines collected to date are below the budget. Chief Hummel stated that it was due to the changeover in personnel and training of new officers.

Motion was made and seconded to accept the Treasurer's report for approval. Motion carried.

FINANCE: Mr. Tucker presented the following bills for approval by the Board.

A motion was made to approve the bills for payment.
Roll Call. 4 ayes, no nays and 2 absent.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: In the absence of Mr. Fentress,
Mr. Renshaw gave the report. He noted that Mr. Taffel had
submitted an application for a building permit.

Mr. Renshaw reported attending a mayors meeting at which the future plans and expansion of the Villages in the area was discussed.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Chief Hummel reported 68 routine calls, 13 accidents and one burglary at the Presbyterian Church.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Zimmerman presented a resolution to support the Forest Preserve acquisition of the land which the Metropolitan Sanitary District now desires for a sewage disposal plant. It was moved and seconded that the Board adopt the resolution, copies of which are to be sent to all members of Metropolitan Sanitary District Board, to Mr. Oglevie of the Cook County Board, to Mr. Janura of the Forest Preserve and all Chicago newspapers as well as the Barrington Courrier Review. Motion carried. A copy of the resolution is attached to the minutes.

Mr. Zimmerman reported that he had talked to Mr. Duch-ossois' attorney who will take up the matter of annexation to the Village with his client. No action will be taken by the Board until hearing from the attorney.

HELATH: No report.

LAW: Mr. Zimmerman outlined the costs of having the Village Ordinances codified. The Municipal Code Corporation will do all but the levy and appropriation ordinances, giving us 100 copies. The cost will run between \$4,000.00 and \$5,000.00.

It was moved and seconded to authorize Mr. Zimmerman to contract with the Municipal Code Corporation for this service and carry it to it's conclusion. Roll Call. 4 ayes, no nays and 2 absent.

Mr. Zimmerman reported that after a hearing in Woodstock,
Mr. Dotson has been allowed to disconnect his land from Barrington Hills. They have to wait one full year before developing
the land. It was noted that the 83 acres has been zoned for
the lowest type of classification, multiple dwelling.

PLAN COMMISSION: No report.

ATTORNEY'S REPORT: Mr. Truninger reported that the stipulation of facts has been signed by the attorney for Mr. Kuranz.

The Civil Aeronautics Board will be setting a public hearing for an air strip at Magnum's. After that Mr. Magnum has to have another public hearing to get a special uses permit.

Road Home Construction Company wants to lease the Transolene property for an aluminium anadozing plant. It would not qualify under the Zoning Ordinance performance standards.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Mr. Hayward noted that effective July 1, 1968, gun owners must apply for an identification card from the Public Safety Department for a \$ 5.00 fee.

He read a letter from Elk Grove Village containing an editorial on air safety.

A second letter announced an open house for the Lake County Building, March 1, 1968.

At this time Grace McGowen who owns 32 acres of land at BraeBurn and Spring Creek Roads asked the Board what she can do to prevent Commonwealth Edison from cutting the large oak trees on their property. She said that they have given an easement giving them the right to trim trees interferring with the power lines. However, at this time they are attempting to go in and cut trees where there aren't even any power.lines.

Mr. Zimmerman told her that she should call the police and have them arrested if they return.

NEW BUSINESS: Mr. Tucker presented a resolution for the Village of Barrington Hills to support the area's plans to build a YMCA in the Barrington area. After some discussion, a motion was duly made and seconded to adopt the resolution. Motion carried.

Metting was then adjourned.
