MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES Village of Barrington Hills July 23, 1962

1

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held at 8 PM Monday, July 23, 1962, at the Countryside School, Brinker and County Line Roads, Barrington Hills, Illinois. Mr. Marold Byron Smith, President, was present and presided at the meeting. He directed the Clerk to call the roll. The following Trustees were present:

> R. J. Grigsby Thomas Z. Hayward Richard S. Pepper John I. Shaw Austin M. Zimmerman Delmar Olson - arrived while meeting in progress.

The following were also present:

David L. Truninger - Village Attorney Lt. Ralph Hummel - Police Lieutenant Leslie T. Welsh - Treasurer - arrived while meeting in progress.

The Trustees had received and read the minutes of the meeting of June 25 before the meeting was called to order. The President asked if there were any additions or corrections. There being none, and on motion duly made and seconded, the Trustees voted to approve the minutes of the meeting of June 25, 1962, as distributed. With the consent of the Trustees present, the regular order of business was suspended in order to hear Lieutenant Hummel's report. The Lieutenant asked for clarification as to correct procedure for the Police to follow in emergencies. He cited the recent cases of trees having fallen across village roads when the police were unable to reach anyone for authority to remove same. The Chairman of the Public Safety Committee said the police have evidently misunderstood the Board's position on such matters. This matter of public safety carries with it the responsibility for the police to act in cases of emergency to protect and safeguard the public, without the necessity of securing prior authorization. The Board felt the police are not to act without authorization in the matter of routine road repairs, but that in all cases of emergency, it is their responsibility to take necessary action immediately. Mr. Pepper was asked to furnish the police with the names of suggested companies to call for emergency work.

The Chairman gave the report of traffic violations in April, May, and March.

The regular order of business was then resumed, and the Chair called for Committee reports.

Mr. Hayward, Chairman of the Health Committee, questioned who is to handle complaints about violations of the Noxious Weeds Ordinance. After discussion, the Board directed the Clerk to send a form letter to violators, signed with the name of the Superintendent of Public Works.

Mr. Pepper, Chairman of the Roads and Bridges Committee, reported that the contract with Liberty Asphalt for Project BE 732 had been

changed by the State's insistence to two contractors, inasmuch as the project was bid in two parts, and the State insisted that the low bidder of each part was to reserve the contract for that part. Liberty Asphalt and Harry Goelitz are the low bidders. On motion duly made and seconded that the recommendations of the State Division of Highways on Project BE 732 be accepted, the President directed the Clerk to call the roll. The vote was as follows:

The Chair announced the motion carried with a vote of 5 ayes, no nays, 1 absent, and directed the Village Engineer to see that the contracts are properly executed.

Mr. Pepper advised that a re-examination of the projected increase in cost to a subdivider if he had to meet B4 instead of B3 specifications on his roads, enfirmed his original estimate: that B4 would add about \$60 an acre to the cost for a 16 foot road and about \$75 an acre to the cost for a 20 foot road. The proposed ordinance amending Base Course and Surface Course for streets within the village was then read to the Board. After discussion, the Trustees present voted unanimously to refer the proposed ordinance to the Law Committee, which reported it back with motion to pass. The motion was duly seconded and full discussion followed. The Chair then directed the Clerk to call the roll. The vote was as follows:

The Chair announced that Ordinance No. 62-5 had been adopted with a vote of 5 ayes, no nays, 1 absent.

After discussing the matter of road standards and specifications further, the Board asked the Attorney to re-write the entire ordinance, incorporating the amendments into one document, for presentation to the Board.

The Board then discussed the proposed plan to utilize the balance of motor fuel tax funds on deposit to repair Hart and Ridge Roads, but tabled the matter. The bills for road repair were presented and discussed, but tabled until the end of the meeting when action should be taken on approval of other bills.

Mr. Zimmerman, Chairman of the Law Committee, then presented a proposed Resolution authorizing the rental of a Safety Box to store some of the village records. On motion duly made and seconded that this Resolution be adopted, the Chair directed the Clerk to call the roll. the vote was as follows:

The Chair announced the Resolution had been adopted with a vote of six ayes, no nays, no absent. Mr. Zimmerman reported there had been no change in the status for

the cases in which the village is interested. The many problems facing the Board the Roake property, Judge La Buy's property, the Isett Mouse, the Forest Preserve interest in enlarging its holdings in Barrington Township were then discussed. The Chair advised that Judge La Buy's persolation tests tend to show that the ground is suitable for septic systems on lots of 40,000 square feet. The Judge is prepared to go ahead on one of two bases: 1. Annexation to the village of Barrington Hills if he thinks the Zoning Board of Appeals would then allow him to re-zone. The President and the Chairman of the Law Committee pointed out that this Board cannot pre-judge action the village Zoning Board of Appeals would take if the property were annexed. Some Board members felt his property west of Barrington Road should be in Barrington Hills so the village could control its development. Others felt we cannot control him whether he is in the village or not, because our ordinances are not limiting. It waspointed out that at this stage, the Judge would agree to the establishment of 8 two-acre homesites near the borders of Barrington Hills.

2. The second course the Judge is considering is going ahead with his petition to the County Zoning Board of Appeals for re-zoning to R-2 - 40,000 square feet homesites.

Trustee Olson said he feels annexing the Judge's property to the village would bring many more problems than advantages...the expenses of additional police protection, road maintenance, and the breaking down of our 5-acre zoning. He also said the constituents expect

this Board to maintain our 5 acre zoning. Trustee Olson, who lives near Judge La Buy's property, said he cannot see how the property can support septic systems on 40,000 square feet homesites when residents in the area are having difficulties on 5 acres; that he would like to know whether or not the percolation tests showed the water percolating sideways or downward, that if sideways, it would obviously drain into the stream and lake system of Barrington Hills and Barrington and would create serious health problems. The Chair expressed the belief that this Board must decide whether or not the best interests of the proper development of the village call for a vigorous defense of our 5-acre zoning or for organizing an orderly retreat; that Judge La Buy, because of his political connections, will undoubtedly get the goning he wants from the County, and it might be the better part of wisdom to comoperate with the Judge in order to secure the best arrangement possible for the village, and to maintain some control over the consequent development of his subdivision. After further discussion, it was moved and seconded that the entire matter be referred to the Plan Commission with instructions that they report back to the Board at a special meeting at the earliest possible date. The Chair directed the Clerk to call the roll. The vote was 6 ayes, no nays, no absent, and the Clerk was instructed to notify the Chairman of the Plan Commission of this action.

The Chair then advised that the Sales Analysis Institute has an option to purchase the Isett property on West County Line Road for use as a school for Business Executives. After discussion, the Board

voted to send this to the Plan Commission also, for study and recommendation.

The Chair further advised that he understands owners of land of parts of section 33, Barrington Township, Cook County, are petitioning $+, \ell \alpha$, to disconnect from Barrington Hills **mithatherplanatestrate**

Mr. Delmar Olson, Chairman of the Finance Committee, advised that the proposed Levy Ordinance will be presented at the August meeting. He also presented the following bills for payment:
