MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF BOARD
Village of Barrington Hills
Nevember 26, 1962

The regular meeting of the Beard of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was hela at 8 PM Monday, November 26, 1962, at the Countryside Scheol, Brinker and County Line Reads, Barrington Hills, Illinois. Mr. Harola Byron Smith, Presiaent, prosided at the meeting and directed the Clerk to call the roll. The follow ing Trustees were present:

Mr. Lorentz B. Knouff, Chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals, and Mr. John McLaughlin, Jr., Chairman of the Plan Commission, were also present. Chief smith and Lieutenant Humel arrived before the clese of the meeting.

The minutes of October 22, 1962, were read. The Glerk was directea to insert the name "Jerry Joswick" after the word "deputize" In the thirl line on page 2. Thereupon, the minutes of the meeting -f October 22, and as adjourned to October 30th, 1962, were approved, $2 s$ corrected.

The Treasureris report, in his absence, was presented by Mr. 01son. The Trustees studied the repert and approved it. The audit for the Year ending April 30, 1962, was presented and discussed. The Health Comittee had no report.

Mr. Olson, in the absence of Mr. John Shaw, Chairman of the Zoning and Planning Committee, then presented a petition filea by

Basod Land Corporation to vacate their subdivision known as Barrington Lakes, First Addition. Mr. Zinmerman read a letter from p.a.

Bascof the vacation of plat, ana the certification sf tie gane by 2.0.a.

John OrLaughlin, Secretary of Bascol Land Corporation. The Corporation seeks vacation because they have not sold any of the property, and because of the exorbitant inerease in property taxes after the land was changed from a farm classification and subdivided. on motion being made and seconded that this entire matter be referred to the Plan Commision, the Chair called for discussion. Mr. Olson asked the Attorney to determine what the village's rights and obligations are in this matter. Mr. Hayward said the Plan Commission must stuay the petition to vacate very carcfully because the property is on the village boundary and adjoins the La Buy property. The Clerk remined the Board that it had received several letters protesting this vacation of plat. Thereupon, the Trustees present voted unanimously to refer the matter to the Plan Commission, and the Clerk turned over the petition and letter to Mr. McLaughlin, Chairmen of the Plan Commission.

In the absence of Mr. Shew, Mr. McLaughlin presented the Plan Commission's recommendation that a petition for disconnection of parts of Section 33, Township 42 North, Range 9 East, be allowed, and the proposed ordinance for disconnection was read to the Trustees, who voted to refer the matter to the Law Committee for report. The Law Committee reported that it recommends adoption of the proposed ordinance. On motion made and seconded that the ordinance be adopted,
and after discussion, the Chair directed the Clerk to call the roll. The vote was $a^{s}$ follows:

The President announced that Ordinance No. 62-12 had been adopted with a vote of 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent, and the clerk was directed to send a certified copy of same to the President of south Barringe ton for that village to take the appropriate action.

Mr. Pepper, Vinhge Engineer and Chairman of the Roads and Highu weye Comittee, advised that he had received request for the village to accept Mid-Oaks Lane in Mid-Oaks Subdivision, and Caesar Drive, Three Lakes Road, and Dana Lane in Dorvillee Hills Subdivision. Mr. Pepper has examined these roads and finds that they meet village specifications, but he dia not recommend acceptance at this time. The financial burden to the village of maintaining these raads and repairing the damage done to them in the future when homes are built, would be heavy. Mr. Pepper also advised that Hart Hills Drive in Hart Hills Subaivision, has been brought up to village speaizications, and the owners of the subdivision are requesting that the vilage accept it. However, Mr. Pepper would not recomend acceptance inasmuch as the only access to Hart Hills Drive is over a private road. After discussion, the Trustees voted to defer consideration of acceptance of these roads.

The Engineer reported that Mr. L. C. Crouch had posted $\$ 2500$ with the Clerk as bond that he would repair any damage he might do
to Meadow Road in Lake Fint Estates when he would take in heavy equipment to put in fill on his property; that the Engineer has examined Meadow Drive and found that Mr. Crouch has put the read back into good shape, and that he would reoomend the $\$ 2500$ pested as bond be returned to Mr. Crouch. On motion made and seconded that the Engineer's recommendation be adopted, and after ascussion, the Chair arectea the Clerk to call the roll. The vote was as follows:

The Chair announced the motion was carried with a vote of four ayes, no nays, two absent, and directed the Clerk to return the $\$ 2500$ to Mr. Crouch.

Mr. Pepper advisea that he is applying for motor fuel tax funds to be used in extensive repairs for Ridge and Hart Roads. After aism said (7.Pas) cussion, the Trustees afid they feel that Hart Road, as a heavily travelled road connecting two highways, thould be declared a atate road, and directed the Engineer to draw up plans for using motor fuel tax funds on Ridge Road and Meadow Hill Road. The Chair said he would again bring the possibility of having Hart Road delcared a state road to the attention of the State Superintendent of Public Works. The Ingineer advised that te is still working on new specifications for village roads.

Mr. Delmar Olson, Chairman of the Finance Committee, presented the following bills for approval for payment:

The President reported payment of the bills had been approved with a vote of 4 ayes, ne naya, 2 absent.

The Law Committee had nothing further to report.
The Attorney said there were no new developments on any of the cases in which the village is interested.

The President announced that at the Middlebury eleetion held November 24th, 1962, to consider merging with Barrington Hilis, there were 84 votes oast, 83 in favor of merging and 1 against.

He then appointed Mrs. Alma Luerssen, Mrs. Hilda Petterson, Mr6 Grace Hestettier, Mrs. Derethy Kiekhefer, and Mrs. Letitia Engels as Juages of the election to be held December $15 t h$ to vote on whether or not Barrington Hills wishes to annex Midaleburg. On motion made and seconded, the Trustees present unanimously confirmed these appointments.

Because the fourthd Monday of Desember fails on Christmas Eve this year, the Trustees voted to have the December Board meeting on Monday, December 17 th, and directed the Clerk to see that this inform-
ation was published in the Barrington Courier Review.
The President asked the Attorney to tell the Trustees about the Heffman Estates annexations. Mr. Tmuninger revieved the Hoffaan Estates annexations, explaining that they have nev annexed up to Palatine Read, including Howie in the Hills, a subdivision within our jurisaictional limits which two years age had filea a plat of subdivision with cortain agreements and limitations as to lot size of those properties near Barrington Hills. Now, however, the subdividers claim that the zoning of Hoffman Eatates takes precedence. There is litigation pending in which South Barrington is one party to the suit, challenging tho legality of Hoffan Estatest annexing property north of the Northwest Tollway. On metion made and seconded that the Trustees authorize the Village Attorney to file a petition for leave to file que warranto proceedings, and after Aiscuasion of the motion, the Chair directea the Clerk to call the roll. The vote was as follows:
