#### VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

Minutes of September 25, 1978

The regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held at 8:00 p.m. in the Village Hall on September 25, 1978. The meeting was called to order by President Hansen at 8:04 p.m. Roll call.

Mrs. Hansen asked for approval of the minutes of August 28, 1978. Corrections were made by Mr. Craig and Mr. Hamill. Mr. Hamill motioned for approval of the minutes as corrected, and Mr. Kempe seconded. Minutes were approved as corrected.

### FINANCE - Norman Tucker

Mr. Tucker reviewed the Treasurer's Report, making one correction, and motioned for approval. Mr. MacArthur seconded. The Treasurer's Report was approved as corrected.

Mr. Tucker then reviewed the list of bills to be approved in the amount of \$20,311.10. An additional invoice for \$100.00 for tree removal was presented and added to the list. Mr. Tucker then motioned for approval of bills in the amount of \$20,411.10, and Mr. Butler seconded. Roll call.

Mr. Tucker reviewed the Audit Report for Fiscal 1978 along with a letter from the Illinois Comptroller's office noting some possible discrepancies and the failure of some officials to file current statements of economic interest. It was noted that three of the six officials were not appointed until after the end of the fiscal year 1978 and the others had filed and had receipts showing such filing. Mr. Craig was asked to respond and supply this information to the comptroller's office. Mr. Tucker motioned for approval of the audit report and Mr. Klein seconded. Audit Report for Fiscal 1978 approved.

Mr. Tucker then requested that Mr. Kempe close the bank account at the First National Bank of Barrington which is in the name of the village and contains one dollar. This is not a village account and the deposit was not made with village funds, therefore, it should be closed. Mr. Kempe agreed to do so.

PUBLIC SAFETY - Alexander MacArthur and Chief Schuld

Mr. MacArthur noted that the stop sign was down at Spring Creek and Ridge Roads. Mr. MacArthur also noted the dangerous condition at Braeburn and Plum Tree Roads since Algonquin River Road does not have a stop there. McHenry County should be urged to take remedial steps at this intersection.

Chief Schuld reviewed the monthly activity report. He noted that due to the frequency of vandalism and theft of mailboxes, the Post Office takes no action whatsoever towards solving these problems. The police department, however, has solved one case involving mailboxes and is still investigating another one.

Chief Schuld presented some figures for disability benefits to be added to the present medical coverage for employees. Mr. Tucker suggested that additional information be obtained for consideration at the next meeting, since any change would be effective November 1, 1978 (the anniversary date of our policy).

In response to an inquiry Mr. Tucker noted that the 5% salary increase for police officers, exclusive of the clerk and chief, was built into the budget and earmarked for November 1, 1977. Mr. MacArthur then motioned for approval of this salary increase as noted above and Mr. Butler seconded. Roll call.

## PLANNING - Jonathan C. Hamill

Plan Commission Report - Mr. Hamill informed the trustees that in addition to Spring Creek Hills, another 200 acre subdivision, Woodview, has been filed. The Plan Commission continues to have a heavy agenda.

Conroy Annexation - Mr. Hamill introduced Martin J. Conroy of 355 Ridge Road (a resident for 18 years). Mr. Conroy is considering annexation of a 19 acre parcel conditioned upon its division into four lots. The property is located near Sutton and Penny Roads. Mr. Hamill suggested Mr. Conroy appear to get the board's reaction before proceeding with a formal annexation petition. It was the consensus of the board that annexation of this parcel would be desirable and that subdivision of the property into four lots would not be unreasonable. This parcel would require a variation on two of the lots. Mr. Hamill suggested Mr. Conroy have his attorney contact Mr. Craig to arrange for the preparation of the proper papers.

### ZONING AND ENFORCEMENT - James A. Kempe

There was no meeting of the Zoning Board of Appeals during the month of September.

Mr. Kempe referred to the building department report for the month showing 13 permits issued. They consisted of 6 homes, 3 additions, 1 riding arena, 1 pool, 1 tennis court and 1 storage building.

Mr. Kempe reported a possible case of collection of sales taxes by a firm in the industrial park area who previously reported to the village that they charged no sales taxes.

The Paganica complaint matter will be coming up before the Zoning Board of Appeals.

At this point, Mrs. Hansen noted that we have information to the effect that septic installers have not been completely fair with us and the septic reviews by our Building Officer are difficult because she is not a licensed engineer. Bruce Pope is a licensed engineer and has agreed to make these septic inspections at \$20.00 per inspection. This would provide a double-check on the septic installations and upgrade our standards, and we could insist on actual test-hole supervision. Mr. Hamill motioned for the appointment of Bruce Pope as the Assistant Building Inspector, and Mr. Kempe seconded, at \$20.00 per septic inspection. Roll call.

ROADS AND BRIDGES - Louis J. Klein, Jr.

Penny & Healy Roads - Mr. Klein noted that Cook County Department of Highways has committed itself to restore the landscape material removed on Healy Road between the fence lines during the recent widening project. It was also suggested that the village take over the road as a village road. Mr. Klein indicated he would respond by thanking the county for restoring the landscaping, but decline the offer to take over the road.

Ridge Road - The heavy rains have taken their toll and we are working on this serious problem. We have already filled in the culverts, but now we will have to fill with larger rocks and sodding.

The work relating to traffic safety signs will be done next summer.

Commonwealth-Edison substation - The 33-foot road servicing one of their substations along Route 14 is believed to belong to us. Because of heavy vandalism they would like to build a fence about 20 feet high. The area involved is 150' x 200'. If it is in the village, they must obtain a permit.

Hills and Dales - It will be necessary to cut back some brush and trees. We have estimated the cost at \$1,100.00, which is covered in the budget.

HEALTH, INSURANCE AND LEGISLATION - John L. Butler, Jr.

Senate Bill 1419 - Mr. MacArthur informed Mr. Butler that the governor had already signed this bill.

Mr. Butler informed the trustees that he would be working on the police disability insurance.

ATTOKNEY - Sygney G. Craig

Hart Road - Mr. Craig suggested the name change for Hart Road be continued to the November meeting because the Board of Elections must be notified and the change could not become effective until thirty days after an election. The matter of closing or vacating the road north of the cul-de-sac arose and Mrs. Hansen suggested that it should be closed, but not vacated, in the event of some future need. Mr. Craig recommended we accept this suggestion (although it is perhaps not a technically legal procedure), and review the procedure at some future date. This closing would not require formal vacation action by the Village Board since the village would retain title. The trustees agreed to this course of action.

ADMINISTRATION - Barbara P. Hansen

BACOG - No report.

Poplar Creek Theatre - A motion for preliminary injunction was noticed for September 28, 1978.

October meeting - Due to the fact that she will be away, Mrs. Hansen suggested a change in the October meeting date from the 23rd to the 30th. Mr. Tucker motioned for said change, with Mr. Klein seconding. Motion approved.

<u>President protem</u> - Since a President protem has not been appointed, Mrs. Hansen felt the trustees should take such action at this time. She suggested Norman Tucker to fill the role. Mr. MacArthur motioned for Norman Tucker to serve as President protem until the end of the fiscal year. Mr. Klein seconded. Motion approved.

Alcoholic Beverage Ban - Barrington Township has asked us to endorse the ordinance before the Cook County Board of Commissioners which would ban the sale of alcoholic beverages in the unincorporated areas of Cook County to persons under the age of twenty-one. Mr. Kempe made a motion suggesting the President write a letter of endorsement, and Mr. MacArthur seconded. Motion approved. Mrs. Hansen will respond.

Fox River Grove Annexation - Mrs. Hansen noted that the Village of Fox River Grove is seeking to annex a one and one-half mile strip of the Chicago & Northwestern Railroad's right-of-way, east of that village, and that the Chicago & Northwestern is willing to do this only if Barrington Hills and Lake Barrington concurred in the action. Fox River Grove has written to us requesting such approval and, after some discussion, Mrs. Hansen was asked to reply and request that additional information be furnished before any formal action could be taken on this matter. Mrs. Hansen will reply.

#### NEW BUSINESS

Mr. MacArthur expressed concern about the subdivisions which involve large tracts of land. He suggested consideration of a moratorium to prevent the checkerboard pattern from emerging as the result of the subdividing of large pieces of real estate in the village. Mr. Hamill noted that we should implement our plan at this time and certainly a moratorium might be appropriate during the period required to develop the implementing tools (ordinances).

The meeting was adjourned by President Hansen at 10:20 p.m.
