Minutes of January 22, 1979

The regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held at 8:00 p.m. at the Village Hall on January 22, 1979. In the absence of President Hansen, Mr. Tucker, President protem, called the meeting to order at 8:05 p.m. Roll call.

Mr. Tucker asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the meeting of December 18, 1979. Mr. Hamill motioned for approval. Mr. Klein seconded. Motion approved.

FINANCE - Norman Tucker

Mr. Tucker asked Mrs. Keating to present the Treasurer's Report. There being no questions, Mr. Kempe motioned for approval of the Treasurer's Report. Mr. Hamill seconded. Motion approved.

Mrs. Keating then presented the list of bills to be approved for payment in the amount of \$44,334.40. Mr. Klein motioned for approval of the bills, with Mr. Kempe seconding. (Mr. MacArthur arrived at this point in the meeting.) Roll call.

Motion approved.

Mr. Tucker distributed drafts of the budget forms to the trustees asking them to review them in the hope that some preliminary work could be done at the February meeting. Mr. Tucker noted that the budget draft should be ready for the March meeting and the final budget should be ready for approval at the April meeting.

PUBLIC SAFETY - Alexander MacArthur and Chief Schuld

Mr. MacArthur stated he does not consider himself a part of the Public Safety Department, however, he recommended that some policy be established with regard to the towing of cars during snowstorms. Mr. MacArthur noted that he had received a number of phone calls complaining about the towing of stalled cars. Chief Schuld stated that such calls were not received by the Police Department. He also noted that any car presenting a road hazard would be towed. Mr. MacArthur suggested we have a written policy on this matter.

Chief Schuld reviewed the Public Safety report and then referred to the Traffic Accident statistics comparing 1978 incidents with 1977. It was noted that the total number of accidents decreased by 8.3%, total number of persons injured decreased by 4.3% and the total number of persons killed decreased by 71.4%. Much of the credit is due to the effectiveness of the Traffic Safety Unit.

Chief Schuld reported that the last scheduled meeting on the communications grant was cancelled and as yet has not been reset. He also noted that the CETA Program seems to be "dead". Chief Schuld and Sergeant Thoren will be attending the Northwestern University Traffic Institute seminar on zero base budgeting in February.

PLANNING - Jonathan C. Hamill

Plan Commission Report - Mr. Hamill reported that the Rolling Hills Sketch Plan was approved by the Plan Commission, and the Woodview Trails Subdivision is still under review.

Public Hearing - Jan. 15, 1979 - This public hearing was adjourned due to a lack of quorum and has been rescheduled for January 29, 1979 at 8:00 p.m.

Robert B. Teska Associates contract - Mr. Hamill noted that we have a new contract awaiting approval which covers ongoing planning services and eliminates the Comprehensive Plan. The new contract provides for an increase in billing from \$45. to \$55. per hour for Mr. Teska'a services and from \$18. to \$25. for Mr. Hoover's services. Mr. Teska is asked to attend all Plan Commission meetings and some of the subdivision costs are recoverable under our ordinances. In response to an inquiry by Mr. MacArthur, Mr. Hamill noted that he would have information on the computation of travel time available for the next meeting. Mr. Hamill motioned for approval of the contract. Mr. Klein seconded. Roll call.

Hampton, Lenzini & Renwick contract - Mr. Hamill then informed the board members that the 1979 contract calls for an increase in the multiplier from 2.49 to 2.55. All other charges are made in accordance with state regulations. Mr. MacArthur requested than information be obtained as to the travel time charged by both Mr. Lenzini and Mr. Teska. Mr. Hamill stated he will have all details in time for the next meeting. Mr. Butler then motioned for approval of the Hampton, Lenzini and Renwick contract for 1979. Mr. Hamill seconded. Roll call.

Motion approved.

Mr. Craig suggested that a motion be made ratifying the adjournment of the Public Hearing of the Plan Commission and Zoning Board of Appeals to January 29 instead of the originally scheduled January 15 date. Mr. Hamill motioned for ratification of the January 29, 1979 date and Mr. Kempe seconded. Motion approved.

ZONING AND ENFORCEMENT - James A. Kempe

ZBA - The regular meeting of the Zoning Board scheduled for January 16 was rescheduled for January 30, 1979 due to the lack of quorum.

Building Department - Only two permits were issued between December 16, 1978 and January 15, 1979; one for a riding arena and one for remodeling. The annual report of the Building Department shows a 12.6% increase in permits issued, however, the number of permits for new homes remains the same as 1977 at 57 new home permits.

In view of the fact that the Zoning Board has not met, Mr. Kempe asked that the Public Hearing on the Conroy Annexation be rescheduled for 8:30 p.m. on February 26, 1979. Mr. Hamill seconded. Motion approved.

ROADS AND BRIDGES - Louis J. Klein, Jr.

Mr. Klein noted that the recent snows will present a huge expense to the village, and we have requested our contractors to give us detailed records on all snow removal work.

Mr. Klein reported that we are in the process of employing a person to take over the duties formerly performed by Bill Renshaw. We have a prospect who might possibly start March 1st on a part-time basis. After May 1st said employee would go on full time and handle roads, signs, building maintenance and grounds maintenance. It is hoped that we will be able to purchase a pickup truck with plow for village emergency use when we have a full time person available.

Mr. MacArthur motioned that the trustees pass a resolution commending Bill Renshaw for his dedication to the village. Mr. Klein seconded. Motion approved. Mr. Tucker suggested a memorial citation be presented to Mrs. Renshaw.

Mr. Klein motioned for approval to pay \$373.05 to Liberty Asphalt from the General Fund for 1978 maintenance work and \$16,215.00 to Liberty Asphalt from MFT funds which is 95% of the total amount due at this time. The remainder to be paid after state approval. Mr. Butler seconded. Roll call.

Motion approved.

Mr. Klein noted that new property owners should be made aware of the fact that when new subdivisions are approved, the village does not accept the roads until such time as 40 percent of the homes are built. Mr. Klein asked for consideration as to how we can inform permit applicants that their roads are not serviced until they are dedicated. Mr. MacArthur suggested we encourage developers to keep the roads private and so inform prospective buyers.

LEGISLATION, INSURANCE AND HEALTH - John L. Butler, Jr.

In response to a question raised last month, Mr. Butler reported that in a court suit we would hire an attorney to defend us and we would be reimbursed through our insurance coverage.

ATTORNEY - Sydney G. Craig

Spring Creek Hills Letter of Credit - Board approval is necessary for the letter of credit in the amount of \$1,095,200. with the LaSalle National Bank of Chicago as the issuer of said letter, according to Mr. Craig. Mr. MacArthur raised the question as to how the amount was calculated by our Village Engineer. Mr. Tucker postponed any action until the next meeting at which time information should be forthcoming from the Village Engineer as to the method of calculating the estimate.

NEW BUSINESS - Norman Tucker

Mr. Tucker noted that in line with the recommendations made by the Northwestern University Traffic Study, a personnel committee be formed to establish policy and guidelines for salaries, sick days, vacation time, holidays, medical and other benefits for all employees of the village. Mrs. Hansen has requested a committee consisting of Mr. Kempe (Chairman), Mr. MacArthur (Member) and Mr. Tucker (Member). Mr. MacArthur declined to serve on the committee. Mr. Kempe and Mr. Tucker agreed to operate as a two-man committee and proceed with drafting the policy and guidelines.

Mr. Tucker recessed the public meeting at 10:27 p.m. to go into executive session to discuss pending litigation. Mr. MacArthur left the meeting at this time and stated that he would not attend the executive session.

The regular meeting resumed at 10:30 p.m. Mr. Hamill made a motion to authorize a notice to appeal the Healy, Blood and Booze case. Mr. Butler seconded. Motion approved.

Mr. Tucker adjourned the meeting at 10:37 p.m.

Our estimate of cost for the landscaping to be performed under ordinance requirements, as shown on the plans and set forth in this letter, is \$80,120.00.
