Minutes of March 22nd were presented to the Board for approval. Corrections were made by Mr. Fentress, paragraph 6 on page 3. Mr. Craig submitted a revision of paragraph 1 on page 5. A motion was heard and seconded to approve the minutes as corrected. Motion carried.

TREASURER: Mr. Welby reported that the Village receipts from taxes were down \$ 15,000 from budget. It is hoped that there will be more coming in before the close of the fiscal year. The missing warrants from sales taxes and income taxes have been reissued and all but one have been received from the State. Everything is within budget with the exception of a few accounts in Public Safety and in Roads and Bridges. However, it will not put them over the appropriation. 4/26/71

A motion was made and seconded approving the bills. Roll call.

4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Motion carried.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Fentress stated that the 1971 MFT work cannot begin until after May 15th. Patching will begin earlier.

Regarding the repairs to the bridge on Cuba Road, Mr.

Fentress was directed to get a letter from the Lake County Engineer giving his recommendations concerning the repairs necessary to the bridge and just how soon it must be done to be made safe.

In order to protect the Village from a possible lawsuit, Mr.

Fentress recommended posting "One Way" signs on both sides of the bridge. Board was in agreement and Mr. Fentress was directed to do so.

Mr. Bateman attended a meeting of the Council of Mayors of Cook County on April 22nd. He reported that the Chicago Area Transportation Study group outlined their summer works.

Mrs. Blanchard relayed a request from Mrs. Schwartzburg of Helm Road for permission to close the road while the children cleaned up the trash. Also a request that the Village arrange for a truck to pick up the trash after it had been accumulated by the children. Chief Hummel stated that he would be very happy to close the road whenever the clean-up crew wanted to work. Mr. Fentress said he would contact the scavenger to pick up the debris and commended Mrs. Schwartzburg for her request.

Mr. Hayward reported that the Illinois Commerce Commission had decided that the Village of Barrington Hills was responsible for the south side of the Hart Road crossing and that the Village 4/26/71

has to raise the road to grade. He stated that it was an expensive proposition and that in as much as there is a possibility of a new crossing in the near future the Village should take exception with the decision. As a precondition to appealing the decision, it is necessary to make a motion for a rehearing within 30 days of April 17th. A resolution to authorize Mr. Craig, alone or in conjunction with the Village of Barrington, to file a petition of rehearing, was made and seconded. Motion carried.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. Grigsby reported 130 routine calls and investigations, 22 accidents, 2 burglaries, 2 thefts, 1 robbery and 1 attempted burglary for the month of April.

The University of Illinois Division of Police Training sent the following grades to the Chief for the narcotics course taken by Lt. Pecoraro and Officer Meyer. (Pecoraro 84 - Meyer 96)

Mr. Grigsby read two letters of commendation, one from Mr. H. Moore stating his appreciation of the Police efforts in response to a 2:45 A.M. call and a letter from Mr. Gumprecht concerning his speed on Route 62 and that the Officer in charge had done a fine job.

Chief Hummel checked out excavation along the Lakehead Pipeline near Route 63 (just outside the Village bounds) and found they have purchased five acres of land. All work ceased after contacting the Lakehead attorney concerning their agreement with our Village; however, our Village has no jurisdiction outside the Village.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Bateman reported that the Chicago Area Transportation Study has been mailed out and requested that the Trustees look it over carefully for suggestions and approval. 4/26/71

In the matter of South Barrington's pending petition before the court, Judge MaGillicudy found their petition to annex adjoining properties valid. In all probability, Winston Centex will appeal this order.

The hearing for the rezoning of Magnum's land has not been scheduled. In the meantime, on April 15th the Forest Preserve filed suit to condemn the area Magnum's is attempting to have rezoned, and include it in the Forest Preserve Area.

HEALTH: Mrs. Blanchard reported for Mrs. Thompson that Mrs. Thompson had been the victim of a dog bite.

BUILDING: No report.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craig presented the election canvass to the Board. 861 votes were cast and the incumbents all were elected by a majority. A motion was made and seconded approving the canvass. Motion carried.

Mr. Craig then presented a resolution approving the closing of Wichman Road with a barricade to be erected by the E. J. & E. Railroad east of the railroad and a "road closed" sign to be put up at the Sutton Road intersection of Wichman Road. Motion was made and seconded to approve the resolution. In the discussion that followed, Mr. Grigsby raised several questions concerning responsibility to patrol and clean up possible dumped trash. It was stated that it was the responsibility of the Forest Preserve to handle these problems. Motion carried.

A resolution was made and seconded to release Mr. Wooten from his performance bond subject to and engineering report stating that the road meets Village specifications. Motion carried. 4/26/71

Mr. Tucker asked Mr. Craig to see if the government has money for the purchase of open spaces land.

Mr. Hayward announced a seminar May 6 by the ^Civil Defense
Agency on "Preparedness" and and explanation of the Federal Relief
Bill.

He read a letter from the Scientific Communications, Inc. requesting an exclusive grant for cable T. V. in the Village. No action was taken as it was felt that it would have to be a vote of the community.

At this time the meeting was opened up to the public. Mrs. Kotz spoke up suggesting that for future elections there be some sort of voters lists. She suggested the possibility of a Village registration. It is hoped that the counties can have uniform registration policies as well.

Mrs. Kieckhefer suggested that there be a school for election judges prior to the next election to aid the judges. She too stressed the need for registration lists.

Proposed Revision to Minutes of Board of Trustees for March 22, 1971 1st Paragraph on Page 5

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craig reported that Mr. Bateman had attended the hearing of the Cook County Zoning Board of Appeals on March 1, 1971 on the application to rezone a tract South of the Village limits and West of Beverly Road from R 2 to M 3 for an asphalt plant and had objected on behalf of the Village. Mr. Bateman also suggested to the Zoning Board that the mining of gravel in the area surrounding the tract in question was in violation of the County Zoning Ordinance. On the petitioner's claim that the gravel mining was a legal non-conforming use, the Village was given leave to file evidence to show that the use did not pre-date the zoning ordinance. Mr. Craig stated that Mr. Bateman had then obtained a series of aerial photographs which had been filed with the zoning board supporting the position of the Village. It was the consensus of the Village Board that the illegal gravel mining use should not be reported at this time to the County enforcement officer, but that the situation should be reviewed after resolution of the rezoning petition.


