A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held on August 24, 1970 at Community Consolidated Countryside School at 7:30 P.M. in the Village of Barrington Hills.

Minutes of the meeting of July 27 were submitted for approval. On page 3, pp. 1, should read "an additional appropriation of \$\ddot\ 1,328.47\$ from Motor Fuel Tax Funds to make up the difference..."

Page 5, should read, "Mr. Hayward requested Mr. Tucker prepare a summary of legal bills paid to Mr. Zimmerman and others for the legal work done in conjunction with the Winston-Centex rezoning hearings."

A motion was heard and seconded approving the minutes as corrected.

Motion carried.

TREASURER: Mr. Welby had sent copies of the report to all
Board members prior to the meeting. A motion was heard and seconded
approving the report. Motion carried.

A motion was heard and seconded to approve the bills for payment.
Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Motion carried.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Fentress reported that the roads had been striped with the exception of the curves on Hart Road which will be done when the final work is finished on that corner.

In discussing the railroad corssing, it was stated that the problem was one between the Lake County Highway Department and the State Highway Department. Our Village limits begin along the south right of way of the railroad.

Chapel Road will be done according to Motor Fuel Tax specifications by Algonquin Township from Hager's Bend east for half a mile out of their 1970 budget. We will put surfacing the remainder into our

1971 Motor Fuel Fund maintence program.

Mr. Fentress discussed the 1970 preparations with Mr. Wight. He was told that other Villages usually do it themselves and he has always done it for our Village without charge.

Crushed stone has been added along the north side of West County Line where the Telephone Company lait it's cable. More is needed...it would appear to be a Telephone Company problem. Trees have been cut out along County Line, and more are scheduled before October 1st.

Mr. Fentress went over the proceedure of granting permits to utilities—that permission is granted by the Village of Barrington Hills with the stipulation that the utility obtain permission from adjacent land where each owners hold title to the center line of the road.

It was noted that there is a bad ditch on Steeplechase left by Commonwealth Edison. Mr. Renshaw is to check it out and so advise Commonwealth Edison.

On Otis Road, the Cook County crews came in and cut trees and bushes indiscriminately leaving all their mess behind. Mr. Tomas Strobel lodges a complaint with the Police as well as Cook County. They have promised to come out and clean it up.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. Grigsby reported 144 routine calls and investigations, 1 attempted burglary, 1 fatality on the highway and the recovery of a stolen auto.

Under the "Action Now" grant, the Police Department will trade in their old auto for a new 1971 auto, with an alternator installed and purchese two additional alternators for the other two squads. All this is within our budget.

Mr. Grigsby requested a letter from Mr. Truninger stating that 8/24/70 the Village is authorized under state statutes to have Travellers Insurance Company act as an agent for the Village group insurance program,

A motion was made and seconded to adopt a resolution appointing Traveler's Insurance Company to act as carrier for hospitailzation and life insurance for the Village Employees: Police, Police Clerk, Road Commissioner, and Village Clerk. Motion carried.

HEALTH: Mrs. Thompson reported phone calls regarding the cutting of bushes on private property along roads, a broken drain tile on Oak Knoll, a large hole on Otis Road which is supposed to be a pond being dug without a permit and 4 dog bites. Mr. Renshaw was directed to check into all except the dog bites.

In the discussion that followed it was noted that some sort of and ordinance requiring identification of dogs as well as rabies shots is very much needed.

PUBLIC RELATIONS: Mrs. Thompson noted only one 18 year old had registered to vote in our Village from Gook County and suggested the news media put in some sort of notice. Mrs. Blanchard will do so.

Mrs. Thompson noted that Material Services has applied for a permit to operate an asphalt plant in the old quarry that is now a part of East Dundee. Action was delayed for a month. The Village of Barrington Hills has no authority in the matter however undesireable it may be.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Bateman reported that due to lack of a querom the monthly meeting was cancelled. The BACOG will meet August 25th at which time the map of the area will be distributed.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Truninger read a letter from Thomas Z. Hayward, Jr. recommending Mr. Lawrence Grelle for the job as prosecuting attorney for the Village.

A motion was heard and seconded approving Mr. Grelle as prosecutor. Motion carried. The financial arrangements will be the same as those with Mr. Hayward.

Mr. Truninger reported that the judge will not make a ruling on the Windrush Lane case. The judge had requested an agreement from all parties which the Village of Barrington Hills turned down. The case will now probably be dismissed.

Mr. Truninger noted that a Health Officer is needed. He and Mrs. Thompson will discuss the matter.

Hoffamn Estates turned down the request to build a shopping center on Bradwell road and rezoned it residential.

The Mrs. Blanchard requested approval of Mrs. Meade as a Deputy Clerk. " motion was made and seconded approving the request. Motion carried.

Mr. Grigsby presented a resolution stating that "It was the consensus of the Board of Trustees that Mr. Thomas Hayward, Jr. be thanked for doing such a fine job as Village Prosecutor. Motion was seconded. Motion carried.

There being no further business, there was a motion for adjournment. Motion carried.
