A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held on November 23, 1970 at Community Consolidated Countryside School at 7:30 P.M. in the Village of Barrington Hills, Illinois.

Meeting was called to order by President Thomas Z. Hayward. Roll call.

TREASURER'S REPORT: In the absence of Mr. Welby, Mr. Tucker reported that the expenses are running within our budget. Motion was heard and seconded approving the Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.

The Park District is without funds. A motion was heard and seconded approving a levy for the upcoming year. Motion carried.

A motion was heard and seconded approving the bills for payment. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 1 absent. Motion carried.

Mr. Tucker presented the 1969 MFT audit report to the Board for approval. A motion was made and seconded for approval. Motion carried.

There have been two publications showing the 1970 census figures for the Village at 2,659. In 1968 a special census was taken showing the population for the Village at 2,800. Mrs. Blanchard has written Mr. Ross Eckler of the Census Bureau for information. The Village has not yet received the official 1970 report. It is of importance because the MFT funds are disbursed based upon population.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Fentress reported that there has been a request for a light at the 59-62 overpass. A letter is being sent to Mr. Marsh of Cook County to indicate the clean-up expenses paid out by the Village for Cook County roads. He ennounced that he has a Mr. Funk who will plow McHenry roads. A motion was heard and seconded to employ Mr. Funk at the agreed fee. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Motion carried.

A motion was heard and seconded recommending the closing of Wichman Road if the Forest Preserve District is in agreement with this. Motion carried.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Chief Hummel reported 88 routine calls and investigations, 19 accidents, 1 theft, 1burglary and 3 fatalities. The dogbite case reported in October occurred July 6. The O'Laughlin dog was injured, not killed, and later put to sleep by the vet.

He reported is sign violations: "Fresh Eggs" on Spring Creek and "Christmas Trees" on Route 62. Action was deferred and the compliants turned over to counsel for advice.

Chief Hummel commented on the abandoned vehicles on Forest Preserve lands that were there when the tracts were purchased. He stated that the Sherrif's Department of Cook County could remove them. Mr. Janura will be contacted on this matter.

Chief Hummel stated that the Village of Barrington Hills does not set the speed limits on State Highways -- our responsibility is to enforce them. He does not consider two or three tickets a week issued in a high accident area a speed trap, as implied in the <u>Barrington Courier Review</u> article on the Village speed limits.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mr. Bateman reported that there has been no progress to report on annexations to the Village. At this point the Plan Commission is in the process of outlining the duties of each members.

HEALTH: Mrs. Thompson reported that a check of the spring on West County Line road by the McHenry County Health Department showed that the spring is now polluted. It will be posted. Mrs. Nacey was asked if the runoff from that well could be diverted in a different direction. They will try to eliminate it.

BUILDING: No report.

ATTORNEY: President Hayward stated that he had had a verbal resignation from Mr. Truninger. He and Mr. Knouff had met and talked to Mr. Sidney Craig, an attorney for the city of Winnetka, and requested approval to negotiate with him to serve as our Village. attorney. Motion was made and seconded. Motion carried.

Mr. Tucker made the following motion:

"On behalf of the President and the Board of of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills we wish to express our gratitude to David Truninger, who worked dilligently over nearly a ten year period for a pittance, and we are greatly indebted to him for his loyalty. It is with great regret that his resignation is accepted."

Motion was duly seconded. Motion carried.

President Hayward announced several important items coming up --- a hearing to grant Magnum's a permit for a landing strip, Commerce Commission hearing on Hart Road crossing, and a hearing on the State level regarding Zoning --- all of which require legal consultation.

BACOG has set our assessment at \$ 3,872.00 as the balance due for the Village. It was noted that while other Villages had chalked off legal fees incurred in the Winston-Mussa hearings to BACOG, the Village of Barrington Hills did not. In the discussion that followed Mrs. Thompson asked just what our Village was getting for the money requested as well as that already sent. Mr. Bateman explained BACOG would help us to fight as one, outside attempts to break down the Zoning of the area. They are going to try to prepare an overall comprehensive plan for the area. President Hayward stated that the powers are advisory in nature. Mr. Tucker stated that the "fiscal affairs of BACOG are financially tangled. Our a appropriation is only \$ 10000.00 and we cannot go any further. BACOG should set up a budget first and submit it to the Villages. As it is now, we have no control of the spending. By accepting the by-laws we have signed a blank check. I have no quarrel with the objectives of BACOG, but with the financial management. We have a contractual obligation. I move we authorize payment not to excede \$ 3,872.00 and direct our representatives to request modern budget techniques be employed." Motion was seconded. Roll call. 4 ayes, 1 nay, 2 absent. Motion carried.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: President Hayward took exception with a letter published in the <u>Barrington Courier Review</u> addressed to him by the League of Women Voters President, Mrs. Ruth Moor. He stated it was in bad taste to have it published before he had received it and had a chance for our Board to take any action on it.

Before adjournment Mr. Q. Kranz asked the Board if the BACOG figures are certified or audited? reply was negative. He then questioned if this was legal taxation. The Village owes it to themselves as well as the public to know where the money is going.

Mrs. Moor replied to Mr. Hayward that letters had been sent to all the Village Presidents and that the one addressed to Mr. Hayward just happened to be the one sent to the newspaper for

publication. Mr. Hayward again stated that he should have had an opportunity to reply before it was made public.

It was noted that Old Heidelburg has done remodeling without benefit of a permit.

There being no further business a motion was made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried. Meeting was adjourned.
