A motion was made and seconded approving the bills as presented. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays O absent. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Miss Olsen noted that she had invested \$ 10,000 of the MFT funds in Treasury bills, due in October. She read a letter from the bank explaining the Barrington Bank's new service of selling securities to investors which give a higher yeild than Treasury bills. Mr. Criag is to check the legal limitations of this use of our money. The question was raised if any of the Trustees owned bank stock, which none of them do. 6/24/74

won't have comparison figures until after the audit is completed.

A motion was made and seconded approving the Treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Mr. Denton was asked to check with Miss Olsen and Mr. Kempe as he procedes with the Village Hall for anticipated cash needs.

FINANCE: Mr. Kempe reported that he will have the Levy Ordinance next month. He noted the receipt of revenue sharing funds in the amount of \$3,470.00 amd made a motion that that amount be transferred to the Corporate account, account #604 of the Public Safety Accounts, for the reimbursement of salaries of Police Officers since Arpil 1, 1974. Motion seconded. Roll call. 6 ayes, 0 nays, 0 absent. Motion carried.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: Mr. Fentress reported a Northern Illinois Gas opening on Caeser Drive. Follow up for proper closing will be made.

Road repairs have been limited to patching due to a sympathy strike and the closing of gravel pits. Sealing will begin as soon as materials are available.

A listing of the newly erected signs was read to the Board.

Mr. Grigsby questimed the erection of a sign on Bow Lane as it's
not a Village Road. It was decided that it is useful for identification by the Police and Fire Departments and Mr. Fentress should
use his judgement as to which signs are necessary.

The Cuba road bridge is in full operation and Mr. Fentress expressed his thanks to Mr. Butler for a job well done. The bills have not been rendered. Mr. Butler and Mr. Kempe will negotiate the details of payment.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. MacArthur reported 168 routine calls and investigations, 28 accidents, 257 citations, a dognapping, 1 burglary, and one possession of an illegal sawed off shotgun.

A check for \$ 1,000 from the sale of a squad was turned over to the Treasurer to be applied to the new squad purchase.

Mr. MacArthur asked approval of the appointment of Angus J. Ray as an evening radio operator and part time clerk at a salary of \$ 500.00 a month. Motion seconded. Carried.

Mr. MacArthur noted that residents should take care to whom theyrent, to, noting the wild party (29 arrests) on Fout 25 extended and the search and arrests at a rented home on Helm Road, 6/25/74

A letter from Mr. Craig on the matter of stickers for leased vehicles was read to the Board, noting that Village taxing power is limited to vehicles which are owned by Village residents. It was suggested that residents leasing vehicles purchase stickers anyhow as it helps Police identification. Turther study is needed and they will continue the same policy until a change is made. Mr. Craig will reduce it to writing to aid the Police Department.

A letter has been recieved from the Cook ounty EPA in regard to the dumping at the intersection of 59 and 62 asking our Village to enforce the no dumping ordinance. We inturn have requested the State to enforce the no dumping along state right of way and put up a fence at this particular spot.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Residents of Hawley Lakes and the committee appointed last month have met to decide how to resolve the fishing problem. Senator Graham has been asked to help.

Mrs. Hansen noted that BACOG has appointed James Kempe to the 911 task study committee. She noted distribution of the feasibility study for a regionalized Police Department. We will be asked to appoint a person to that study group.

Mrs. Hansen said that Mr. Train would like to be replaced by September 1. He expects to have recomendations on the soil overlay before resigning. Mrs. Duker will meet with Mrs. Hansen to give suggestions on the flood plain ordinance to meet regulations for federal insurance.

A letter from the Zoning Board of Appeals was read recommending Fred Klein be granted a special use permit to build a lake. Ordinance 74-7 granting the special use was presented. Motion made and seconded to accept the recommendations and Ordinance. Roll call. 6 ayes, O nays, O absent. Ordinance was adopted.

President Mc aughlin reappointed Owen Fairweather to the Zoning Board of Appeals, and appointed Jonathan Hamill to fill John Shaw's term. He read Jack Train's resignation as chairman of the Plan Commission.

At this time Thomas Hayward, Jr. appeared before the Board on behalf of Leigh Wilson & Associates Limited and Alabar Corporation in their request to resubdivide the Planned Development known as Paganica. Mr. McLaughlin, Mrs. Hansen and Mr. Fentress 6/24/74

withdrew from participation because of their fi John Denton was made acting President for the discussion. A letter from the Plan Commission was read recommending the Board approve the resubdivision, outlining the requirements to be followed. The petition requests relief from certain articles of the new subdivision ordinance on the basis that much of it was done at the time the PUD was approved in 1967. Mr. Grigsby stated that as proposed it was a decided improvement. Mr. MacArthur felt that more time was needed to read through the lengthy documents presented by Mr. "ayward that evening. Mr. Denton suggested that the Plan Come mission had been thorough. Mr. Grigsby moved adoption of the Ordinance permitting the resubdivision. Kempe seconded. Ordinance was read. Mr. MacArthur moved to table the Urdinance. Mr. Grigsby said that wasn t possible according to Robert's Rules. Discussion. Mr. MacArthur said he was reluctant to approve at this time until he could read the documents. At this time "Ir. Grigsby withdrew his motion. Mr. Denton deferred the vote until next month or a special meeting. (Mr. Grigsby left the meeting at this time.)

BUILDING: There have been permits issued for three houses and two pools in June.

ADMINISTRATION: Mr. Denton reported that the contracts had been delivered. Mr. Dart has volunteered to do a landscaping plan free of charge. A rendering will soon be available.

There is a Baird and Warner sign on Village property. Mr. Carig will write them and ask that it be removed.

ATTORNEY: Mr. McLaughlin announced that the legal fees are to be increased to \$ 700 monthly; it means that we are paying a larger portion of the fees presented on the quarterly billing.

Mr. Craig was asked to write George Bachner and notify him that he is in violation of the Zoning Ordinance, permitting a house trailer to be occupied while on his property.

Mrs. Kuffel appeared to complain about a subdivision. She left and Mrs. Thompson explained her complaint. Mr. Criag is to talk to John Quay and remind him of our subdivision Ordinance.
