A special meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held on December 16, 1974 at 7:30 P.M. at Countryside School in the Village of Barrington Hills, Ill.

Meeting was called to order by the Clerk. A motion was made and seconded appointing John Denton as President Pro-Tem for the meeting. Roll call. Town McLaughtin President

Minutes of the November 21st sepcial meeting were presented to the Board for approval. Motion was made and seconded approving the minutes.

Minutes of the November 25th meeting were presented to the Board. After being corrected, a motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes. Motion carried.

TREASURER'S REPORT: Miss Olsen presented the Treasurer's report to the ^Board for approval, noting that the MFT Treasury bills will be due in January and not reinvested, in order to have money for the MFT maintenance from the repairs of our roads. A motion was made and seconded to approve the report. Motion carried.

A motion was made and seconded approving the bills as read. Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Motion carried.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: No report.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Deferred until Mr. MacArthur's arrival. proposed ZONING AND PLANNING: Mrs. Hansen reported that BACOG's new fee wallie for each village, with the balance based on the total budget of each community. A motion was made that we support the proposal. (it reduces our fee by fabout \$7,000 b) Seconded. Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Motion carried. 12/16/74 BACOG has asked that our Village support the 208 proposal approving NIPC as the planning agnecy for water treatment in this area of Illinois. Mrs. Hansen commented on the fine articles being original by Mrs. Thompson and urged the Board to read them. She will be asking for Board action on the matter at the January meeting.

At this time, Mr. MacArthur arrived. Chair asked for the $P_{\rm u}$ blic Safety report.

Mr. MacArthur reported 122 routine calls and investigations, 16 motor vehicle accidents, 94 citiations and 3 burglaries. He search then reported that on Thrusday, December 12th at 7:25 P.M. after a warrant was issued culminating a seven month investigation, the Police entered the Gorden Mertens' residence looking for 4 articles listed on the warrant. They apprehended four subjects for burglary of \$ 150.00 or more and found **3** of the 4 listed items, all of which had been reported stolen. Gorden, Marcella, Gorden Junior and Robert Mertens were arrested for grand theft. They were bonded out shortley thereafter. The residence was under seizure until Friday evening. On Saturday, "ecember 14th a second warrant was issued as was a third on December 16th. Items from 9 known burglaries were found and a probable six more. Mr. MacArthur singled out Allan Meyer and Tom Gooch for their superb job.

Mr. John Kuranz an immediate neighbor to the Mertens asked what was going to be done to make the area safe, noting that his son had been shot at by one of the Mertens sons previously. He was asurred that everyone would do as much as possible.

Mr. MacArthur then excused himself from the meeting.

Mrs. Hansen continued her report. In a discussion of the bylaws for BACOG the Board moved and seconded to have Mrs. Hansen report that it is the desire of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills to retain the status quo and reject the amendment on veto powers. Motion carried.

Mrs. Hansen reported that the Village of Barrington has applied for a grant to see why there is flooding in the Flint Creek watershed. It will be done by the Corps. of Engineers. Also, Barton-Aschman has been retained by BACOG to complete the master comprehensive plan. They will consult with communities that share corporate boundaries, and onincorp. land areas 12/16/74 Mrs. Hansen reported that the Zoning Board of Appeals had recommended that the petition of Anthony Powns and R. C. Treat for a special use permit be granted. A motion was made and seconded for a resolution of approval to be confiremed by an Ordinance at the January meeting. Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Ordinance was approved.

The Zoning Board of Appeals denied a petition by James Pease because the average width requireto divide his acreage on the fact that the average width requirements were not met.

It was suggested that this kind of a problem be directed to the Plan Commission for study. Mr. Griag noted that it was possible to correct this problem. The Plan Commission would consider an amendment, not based on one case, but on principle, and direct the ZBA to have a hearing.

The Zoning Board of Appeals granted a variation to Mr. Bard to divide his property into two parcels.

It was suggested that Mr. Kempe, Mr. Renshaw, Mrs. Hansen and Mrs. Blanchard meet to decide the course of action the Village should follow when violations to the Ordinances were found. It was also suggested that the Countryside Association in it's letters, stress that it is necessary to obtain a building permit when building in the Village.

Mrs. Hansen reported that she is working with Mrs. Lyons on the horse problem. An acceptable Ordinance will be outlined. The dal Plan Commission will study it.

ADMINISTRATION: Mr. Denton reported that he is hoping for a NURSERIES February 15th date of completion on the Village Hall. Klehm will provide the plantings and landscaping at no cost and will work with the Garden Club. Mr. Denton will write and accept the offer to do the work as outlined. The Countryside Association also expressed a willingness to help where help is needed. It was suggested that a permanent plaque listing all the contributors be put in the building.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craig reported that the Village has been allowed to intervene as a party in the Centex case. BACOG was rejected.

Mr. Craig outlined: a resolution to transfer \$ 862.33 from General Funds to the MFT Fund to cover the deficit in the MFT audit. Mr. Kempe moved it be adopted. Second. Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Clerk was directed to write the check to transfer the funds. 12/16/74

PRESIDENT'S REPORT: Mr. Denten read a letter requesting the Village proclaim January 15th as a day to honor the memory of Doctor Martin Luther King. He signed the proclaimation and will send it to Mr. Brooks.

send it to Mr. Brooks. Mr. McLavencin Mr. Denton noted that if there is to be a Police Referendum, action must be taken before February 15. Mr. Grigsby will send the legal requirements to the Board before the January meeting.

Mr. M. Laborton read a letter from the Barrington Liabrary District requesting \$ 10,000.00 of our revenue sharing funds for the new liabrary building. The Trustees were directed to give it some consideration and action will be taken at the January meeting.

Mr. Denton handed Mr. Craig the tapes from the hearing of Mr. Heard for safekeeping. He also asked Mr. Craig to check and see if as a Trustee, Mr. Butler could continue to be a Special Officer, can a Trustee be an Officer, can we pay him, and should he abstain from voting on Police matters?

NEW BUSINESS: It was noted that all gifts to the Village (the Village Hall, the Police Department or whatever) should be accepted by the Village Board as a matter of record to avoid any "special interests" impact.

There being no further business, a motion was made and seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.
