She called attention to the Board that there is approximately \$ 96,000 available for the last two months of the fiscal year. Motion was made and seconded to approve the report. Motion carried.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the bills for payment. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays, no one absent. Motion carried.

A bill from Pepper Construction in the amount of \$ 30,983.24 was also presented. Mr. Denton recommended holding it over until March when we see what tax monies come in. In taking this action it was noted we are obligated for 7% interest from meeting until meeting, beginning February 24. Motion so made and seconded. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays, no one absent. Motion carried.

ROADS AND BRIDGES: No report.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. MacArthur reported 85 routine calls and investigations, 21 accidents, 115 citations and 3 burglaries (open to date) 2/24/75

He also noted that he has been working with Mr. Howlett and Mr. Skinner on H-B ¶4, requiring that gravel trucks be covered with a tarpaulin.

On February 18 the Police Department recieved a certificate of commendation from the National Police Officers Association, specifically naming Lt. Meyer and Officer Gooch for their work on the Mertens case.

ZONING AND PLANNING: Mrs. Hansen introduced a resolution of application to the Federal Government for elegibility in the participation in the Flood Plain Insurance Program. Seconded. Discussion. Mr. Grigsby asked about a "grandfather clause" and was told that this applies to all new buildings and subdivisions. It permits people to obtain flood insurance at lower subsidized rates. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays, no one absent. Resolution was adopted.

Mrs. Hansen noted that she has been monitoring seme projects, POOW specifically the Carpentersville and Plum Tree projects, on an informal spasis.

The Comprhensive Plan has been given to the Plan Commission for revies. Also, the Plan Commission has been meeting with residents and discussing the horse ordinance.

Mrs. Hansen also noted that she has been in contact with other Garden Clubs and they have agreed to donate to the landscaping project at the new Village Hall.

Mrs. Hansen reported that Mr. SanFillipo and Mr. Syn-Smith have filed for petitions of variation in regard to their building violations. Nothing has been heard from Mr. Shadle, Mr. Suson, Mr. Leisendahl, or Dr. Ishack. Letters have been sent by the clerk with a March 1 deadline for action in writing by the violators.

At this time Mr. Wall of Steeplechase Road spoke with regard to his "landfill". After hearing him, the Board recommended that he be given until June first to rectify the situation. It was noted that the Village of Barrington (from Rick ) had dumped 1000 yards of material on his property. (He stated 300)

ADMINISTRATION: Mr. Denton distributed keys to the new Village Hall to everyone. He asked that the building not be locked during the day, as there are workmen still going in and out. The Police Department will move in March 15, he noted that the builders risk policy covers partial occupancy. Mrs. Blanchard was asked to place 2/24/75

an ad for a part time janitor-jack of all trades. Qualifications were to be submitted in writing as well as some references.

Mr. Denton requested approval to procede with the purchase of \$5,000 worth of furnishings. It will be coming thru Montgomery Wards at a 40% discount. Motion was so made and seconded. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays, no one absent. Motion carried.

At this time Mr. MacArthur requested the expenditure of # 432.00 to cover the costs of reinstalling the radio antenna for the Police. Motion seconded. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays, no one abenst. Carried.

HEALTH: No Report.

BUILDING: Mr. McLaughlin reported permits issued for two new residences and two acessory buildings for the month of February.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Criag presented the Election Ordinance for approval. Motion was made and seconded to approve. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays, no one absent. Ordinance was approved.

A second Ordinance 75-4, calling for an increase in the annual tax rate for Police Protection was then presented. Motion was made and seconded to approve putting the matter on a ballot for vote at the April 15th election. Discussion. It was noted that this was an increase from .15 to .40, or a .25 cent per 100 increase. It will not go into effect until 1976, and should add 55 to 58 thousand to the Police Protection fund. Roll call. 6 ayes, no nays, no one absent. Ordinance 75-4 was adopted.

NEW BUSINESS: It was noted that the E. J. & E. had been prival permission to secure additional easements for pipeline for the natural gas. Mr. Denton said we should make sure of the quality of pipes and the joints when they come to our Village for permits.

Mr. Mc aughlin read a letter from the Good Shepherd Hospital. They are requesting a citizen from the Village to be part of a community action committee. Mr. Notke was asked if he would serve and he agreed.

Mr. Kempe asked for Village support on April 22 for the BADC Blood drive.

A motion was made and seconded that the meeting adjourn to executive session. Motion carried.
