MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES VILLACE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

September 22, 1975

The regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held on September 22, 1975 at 7:30 P.M. in the Village Hall. Meeting was called to order by President Denton. Roll call.

John C. Denton President, Acting Trustee Alexander MacArthur Tonathan Hamill Trustee Louis B. Klein Trustee James A. Kempe Trustee John L. Butler Trustee Sydney G. Minutes of the August meeting were submitted to the Board for approval. A motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as corrected.

Motion carried.

TREASURER: Miss Olsen reported that there had been no tax receipts as yet. She outlined the monies in the various accounts, noting the transfer of Revenue Sharing funds into the general account. \$ 20,000 of the MFT money was reinvested in Treasury Bills.

A motion was made and seconded approving the Treasurer's report. Motion carried.

FINANCE: Mr. Kempe presented the unpaid bills to the Board for approval. (Copy attached.) A motion was made and seconded approving the bills for payment. Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays, labsent. Motion approved.

Mr. Denton requested that all bills be submitted to the Clerk ten days prior to the meeting so that a complete list of bills can be prepared by the Clerk and distributed to the Trustees for review prior to the meeting, eliminating the need to read each bill individually in the meeting.

M. Kempe explained that our Revenue Sharing report had been published and notice of the publication mailed to the Federal Covernment, however was apparently lost in the mails. A copy of the report was sent again, registered mail. It means that our funds will be late, but we will not be penalized.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Mr. MacArthur reported 108 routine calls and investigations 32 accidents. 158 citations issued 5 burglaries 2 threfts and 2 recovered stolen automobiles. (26 of the citations were issued to "transitory commercial vehicles.")

At this time, Ted Ringman, of Helm Road read a letter to the Board concerning police procedures regarding the burglaries that the Village has had recently. Chief Conroy volunteered that the "eyes of the public are essential to law enforcement". Mr. MacArthur suggested the Villagers use a buddy system, letting their neighbors know just when they are leaving and expect to return. Allan Meyer said that alarm systems are 99% effective.

ROADS AND BRIDCES: Mr. Butler said that the MFT bill was due later in the year. He asked that residents make an effort to clear their driveways of excess brush and trees. The school busses are having problems seeing the driveways and there are some bad corners that residents could clear up.

In reference to the closing of Hart Road, Mr. Denton noted that he had been quoted in error and wrote to Mr. Anderson noting that fact. He read the letter which requested that all drawings be forewarded to our Village and that the Villagers be given the opportunity to express themselves before our Village would take any position on the closing of Hart Road.

ZONING AND PLANNING: In the absence of Mrs. Hansen, Mr. Hamill reported that the BACOC plan has gone to the printers after which it will be available to the public. The plan will be turned over to the Plan Commission which will hold a public hearing.

It was noted that the Village of Barrington Hills had opposed three of the proposals before the Cook County Zoning Board on their hearings regarding zoning of unincorporated areas. The Board made changes on two of the three, being that zoning of areas on the South and East edges of our Village, making it five acre requirements. The third area objected to was the classification of Magnum's for business and we hope for a more moderate business use there.

The Plan Commission meeting on October 13 will deal with a nuisance ordinance, specifically dealing with the manure problems and control of flowage of horses. All residents are encouraged to attend.

Mr. Hamill then presented a resolution to the Board regarding the preservation of the LaBuy marsh ares. Motion made and seconded to approve. Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays 1 absent. Resolution carried.

Mr. Hamill reported that Mr. Syn-Smith has moved his barn so it no longer is in violation. Suit is being filed against Dr. Ishak to get compliance on his barn. Mr. Shadle and Mr. Leisendahl are filing for variations with their illegal barns.

ADMINISTRATION: Mr. Klein reported that the new copier would be installed on the 27th of September.

Lageschulte Electric has given an estimate of \$ 325.00 to install seven floodlights on three corners of the Village Hall. He is going to ask them to procede. He is investigating the arrangement of a kitchenette for the Hall.

Mr. Klein is checking with Prudential and Travelers about the health and medical coverage of the Village personnel. The present policy has increased costs by 30% for additional dependent coverage.

The base of the antenna seems to have settled and Pepper Construction has been contacted. If it has, it will be reset at not charge to the Village.

Mr. Klein has a quote of \$ 150.00 for weed removal and the removal of the

debris about the Village Hall. He hopes to have the work done before winter. It will be leveled and graded later.

Blacktopping of the parking lots is in the 1976 program. In the meantime crushed lime was spread.

The Plan Commission has asked for large flat file cabinet for plats. Mr. Klein sked for donations "of excess older plat cabinets".

Mr. MacArthur asked Mr. Klein for perimeter rods for the Village Hall parking area before the snow flies so that the plows will know where to plow the snow. He volunteered that the Police Department would handle if agreeable to to others. It was so agreed.

ATTORNEY: Mr. Craig read the FPC decision letter regarding the Natural Gas Pipeline to the Board of Trustees. They turned down our request to be heard in intervention. Mr. Golff noted that litigations may develope into a petition for variation.

BUILDING: Mr. Denton reported permits issued for 1 new home, 1 garage, 1 swimming pool, 1 room addition and 2 septic fields.

PRESIDENT: Acting President Denton stated that he has turned over the investigation of vacation and sick leave policy to Mr. Kempe who will study several plans and make a report at the October Board meeting.

There is a possibility that the question of the closing of Doilea Road in the future. It was noted that it is not a Village matter, but a Forest Preserve matter. Mr. MacArthur who was present several years ago when the matter was discussed said that the Police Department and the Fire Departments had no objections to the proposed closing as it is a hazardous road to drive.

Mrs. Wytak of ARF is attempting to join BAGOG so they can have access to grants providing animal welfare and care.

OLD BUSINESS: Mr. Hamill read a letter which gave a summary of the proposal and solutions for the emergency vehicle Mrs. Shedbaker has proposed for the Village. She will undertake the proposals as outlined by Mr. Hamill and report back to the Village when she has done so.

The Police Chief Selection committee met with Mr. Jack Aldrich, Captain in the Arlington Heights Police Department, after which President Denton met separately with him. They were in concurrance that he be offered employment as Chief of Police. Acting President Denton thanked Chief Conroy for his excellent help and followed by announcing his appointment of Mr. Aldrich as Chief of Police effective November 1 1975 under conditions outlined in a letter prepared and read by Mr. Denton. He advised that the letter would be sent to Mr. Aldrich after confirmation of the appointment by the Board.

A motion was made and seconded confirming the appointment of Captain Aldrich. Motion carried unanimously.

Allan Meyer was thanked for stepping in as Acting Chief and complemented on the fine job he has done for the Village.

There being no further business, a motion was made and seconded for adjournment. Motion carried.
