Helfrick, Jr. Diedre Kieckhefer The regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was called to order at 8:00 p.m. on May 23, 1977 by President Barbara P. Hansen. Roll Call. Mrs. Keating was absent (she arrived at 8:20 p.m.).

Minutes of the meeting of April 25, 1977 were presented to the board for approval. Minutes were approved as corrected.

BUILDING DEPARTMENT - Evan Evans, Jr.

Mr. Evans reported that the following permits had been issued during the month of May: 5 new homes, 2 pools, 2 additions, 2 garages, 1 septic repair, 1 barn and 1 barn loft. He reported that Mr. Renshaw's update of the building files was nearly complete and suggested that residents be made aware of the fact (via the Newsletter) that they could check with the Building Department on work done to their property prior to their occupancy. NIPC has suggested that permits be issued by Quarter Section, rather than by townships; with the information filed with NIPC for use as a planning tool. Mr. Evans is trying to obtain a copy of the Site Development Ordinance of the Village of Riverwoods. He and Mr. Kempe will meet to discuss current problems and violations.

TREASURER'S REPORT - Lucille S. Keating

Treasurer's report was submitted for approval. Mr. Tucker moved for approval of the report, with Mr. MacArthur seconding. Report approved as submitted.

#### FINANCE - Norman Tucker

Mr. Tucker reported that Motor Fuel Tax funds were lower than usual and he is attempting to find out the reason. Mr. Tucker presented the following bills for approval:

Mr. MacArthur asked that payment to Kustom Signals of \$3870.00 for the purchase of radar units be deferred until they have been delivered and are operating. This reduced the total for Public Safety bills to \$13,766.03. Chief Aldrich then asked for approval of \$117.50 to Allan Meyer and \$232.45 to Rebert Swenson for expenses incurred in relation to the Mertens trial. Total bills to be approved for payment are \$4164.07 for Administration, \$4277.46 for Court and Overtime and \$14,115.98 for Public Safety bills. Mr. Butler motioned to approve, with Mr. MacArthur seconding. Roll call. 6 ayes, 0 nays. Motion approved.

Mr. Tucker asked Mr. Kempe to propose the auditor for the upcoming audit inasmuch as he has dealt with them in the past. Mr. Kempe recommended the Village engage the services of McGladrey, Hansen & Dunn. Mr. Klein seconded. Recommendation approved. Mr. Tucker will contact them.

Mr. Tucker informed the trustees that the First National Bank of Barrington has been requested to close an existing account in the name of Barrington Hills Police Employees Fund and to transfer the balance of \$37.76 to the Corporate Account, due to the fact that this old account has been dormant since 1974.

Mr. Tucker distributed copies of a preliminary budget and gave a verbal rundown of the receipts anticipated for the coming year as well as anticipated expenses. All trustees were asked to review their portions of the budget and make recommendations and/or suggestions within two weeks. Mr. MacArthur indicated that he felt he had a clear commitment to add a 9th man to the Police Force (based on the tax referendum as passed by the voters in 1975). A discussion followed on possible insurance benefits for the men for which provision had been made in the preliminary budget. Mrs. Hansen will meet with the officers on Wednesday, May 25th at 11 a.m. to get their ideas on a medical insurance plan.

In the interest of time, as well as to provide all trustees with an opportunity to thoroughly review the proposed budget, Mr. Hamill urged that a special board meeting be held prior to the regular June meeting. It was then agreed to hold such a meeting at 8 p.m. on Monday, June 6, 1977.

It was noted that a Public Hearing was in progress to discuss the use of Revenue Sharing Funds for 1977-78. Mr. Tucker stated that a notice had been published in accordance with the law requiring a summary budget and anticipated use of Revenue Sharing Funds. Meeting was open for discussion. As in the past, the funds will be used for police salaries. There was no comment forthcoming from the audience, therefore, the money will be used as stated.

#### ZONING - Jonathan C. Hamill

Mr. Hamill reported that the Zoning Board of Appeals has met two times to consider the petition for a map amendment from R-1 to B-3 by Messrs. Healy, Blood and Booze. The ZBA unanimously recommended denial of the petition, and sent copies of a letter to all Board Members with said recommendation on May 9, 1977. Mr. Hamill moved that the board accept the recommendation of the ZBA and deny the petition, with Mr. MacArthur seconding. Motion carried. Mr. Booze was in the audience, but made no comment. Language was a second or commendation of the ZBA and deny the petition, with made no comment.

### PLANNING - Jonathan C. Hamill

Mr. Hamill read a report from the Secretary of the Plan Commission which outlined the action taken at the May 9, 1977 Plan Commission meeting. He noted that they approved the Country Oaks subdivision final plat, and that the Spring Creek Hills subdivision preliminary plat was being continued.

Mr. Hamill noted that Mr. Craig had received the signed final plat for Country Oaks on Wednesday of last week (May 18). Mrs. Blanchard received her copy of the plat today (May 23). Mr. Bleck (Village Engineer) appeared at the meeting and stated that the final three requirements as outlined in Mr. Lenzini's letter of May 13 had been complied with and a letter so stating would be directed to the Village Clerk. Mr. Hamill moved for acceptance of the final plat by the Village Board, and Mr. Kempe seconded. Motion carried. Final plat was accepted.

At this time, Mr. Fred Brei presented a letter of credit from the First National Bank and Trust Company of Barrington in the amount of \$147,000 as well as an escrow agreement for improvements. Mr. Brei stated they hoped to have all the work on the roads, except paving, done by November 23, 1977; at which time he will ask for a review by the Village of the work already done. Mr. Craig stated that the letter of credit was unsatisfactory Mr. Brei was asked to resubmit it to Mrs. Hansen and Mr. Craig and, if satisfactory, the escrow agreement would be signed. Acceptance of this procedure was moved by Mr. Hamill and seconded by Mr. Kempe. Motion carried.

Mr. Thomas DuVal was at the meeting to present the preliminary plat for Merry Oaks Manor. However, since they had not resolved the problem of drainage as requested by the Plan Commission, they were directed to resolve that problem and also obtain a sign-off from Lake County on the suitability of the land for septics, prior to acceptance by the Village Board of the preliminary plat.

Mr. Hamill, as Chairman of the Planning Search Committee, reported that the interviewing of area planners was in progress and he said he hopes to have a detailed report for the June meeting.

Mr. Hamill then presented a resolution authorizing a public hearing by the Plan Commission for the purpose of considering an amendment to the Subdivision Ordinance for "costs of review". The developer would pay the total review costs incurred by the engineer and the lawyer reviewing the proposed subdivision for the Village when such costs exceed the filing fee. Mr. MacArthur moved for adoption of the resolution and Mr. Tucker seconded. Motion carried. Resolution is as follows:

RESOLUTION FOR PUBLIC HEARING ON AMENDMENT TO OFFICIAL VILLAGE PLAN OF BARRINGTON HILLS

WHEREAS, experience under the Barrington Hills Subdivision Ordinance adopted August 27, 1973 and under the filing fee amendment adopted September 27, 1976 as Ordinance No. 76-13 has demonstrated that the filing fees established thereunder are wholly inadequate and substantially unrelated to the costs to the Village of reviewing subdivision proposals in certain particular cases where submission for the owner are substantially defective; and

WHEREAS, the Village Subdivision Ordinance should be amended to provide increases in said filing fee; and

WHEREAS, it has been suggested that the current basic filing fee of \$250.00 for the first two lots in any subdivision with an additional fee of \$100.00 per lot for each subdivision lot in excess of two be supplemented by a provision requiring the developer to pay excess costs of review in instances where such excess costs are incurred.

WHEREAS, the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills, Cook, Lake, McHenry and Kane Counties, Illinois desire to schedule a public hearing on fee schedule amendment to the Ordinance, as heretofore amended, before the Plan Commission pursuant to statute in such case made and provided;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and the Board of Trustees that the Barrington Hills Plan Commission be and it hereby is requested to hold a public hearing before it, pursuant to Section 11-12-7 of the Illinois Municipal Code, on July 11, 1977 at the Barrington Hills Village Hall, 112 Algonquin Road, Barrington Hills, at 8:00 o'clock P.M., on amending the fee schedule in the existing Barrington Hills Subdivision Ordinance adopted August 27, 1973 by Ordinance No. 73-8A, as heretofore amended by Ordinance 76-13 and to promptly report its recommendations to the President and Board of Trustees.

or drilling operations, installation of water supply systems and waste disposal systems.

- B. "Flood" or "Flooding" means: a general and temporary condition of partial or complete inundation of normally dry land areas from the overflow of inland waters, or the unusual and rapid accumulation or runoff of surface waters from any source.
- C. "Base flood" means: the flood having a one percent chance of being equalled or exceeded in any given year. The base flood is also known as the one hundred (100) year flood.
- D. "Base flood elevation" means: the elevation

photorevised 1972, or other relevant data, that a particular area is not actually subject to the base flood.

After the passage of 90 days following the second publication by the Federal Insurance Administration of notice of determination of base flood elevations, flood hazard areas shall mean all areas having an elevation less than the base flood elevation at that point unless otherwise determined by the Secretary or a court pursuant to 42 U.S.C. 4104.

## Section 4. PERMIT REQUIRED

No person, firm or corporation shall commence any construction, substantial improvement, subdivision of land or other development in a Flood Hazard Area without first obtaining a building or development permit from the building officer. The building officer shall not issue such permit for any construction, substantial improvement, or other development that does not comply with the provisions of this ordinance or that has been denied a permit required by Federal or State law including Section 404 of the Federal Water Pollution Control Act, 1972, 33 U.S.C. 1334.

Mr. Craig noted that updated copies of the HUD Flood Hazard Map should be obtained and copies furnished to all trustees. He requested Mrs. Blanchard to take care of this matter. Mr. Evans noted, at this time, that "entrapment areas" should also be redefined.

Mr. Craig commented on the progress of the codification process and noted that the costs of updating the code as the village ordinances are passed should be included in the new 1977-78 budget. Sterling Codifiers will contract for this yearly service.

A resolution was read urging Commonwealth Edison Company not to annex its right-of-way to East Dundee, as follows:

RESOLUTION URGING COMMONWEALTH EDISON COMPANY AGAINST ANNEXING ITS RIGHT OF WAY TO EAST DUNDEE

WHEREAS, it has come to the attention of the Village of Barrington Hills that the owner of a tract of land exceeding forty acres in size, now situated in the unincorporated Cook County area South of the Southwest corner of Barrington Hills, is seeking to annex the tract to the Village of East Dundee; and

WHEREAS, the apparent purpose of the annexation would be to avoid the R-l Single Family Residence District (5 acre) zoning classification of unincorporated Cook County and to operate a gravel pit under East Dundee zoning; and

WHEREAS, the annexation is dependent upon the voluntary annexation of the 190 foot right-of-way owned by Commonwealth Edison Company and lying between the tract in question and the current municipal limits of East Dundee; and WHEREAS, the tract in question is approximately 1/8 mile from the Barrington Hills boundary; and

WHEREAS, the proposed gravel pit use in the proposed location is clearly undesirable for Barrington Hills and is incompatible with (a) the present Cook County zoning, (b) the Cook County Future Land Use Map, (c) the 5 acre residential classifications recommended by the Barrington Hills Official Plan and the Land Use Policies Plan Map of Barrington Area Council of Governments, and (d) existing residential and forest preserve uses on the Cook County side of the County Line; and

WHEREAS, the Commonwealth Edison right-of-way has a close relationship with Barrington Hills as it runs for a long distance northerly within the borders of the Village of Barrington and Barrington Hills has by special use permitted erection of a distribution facility on the right-of-way between Penny Road and the tract in question.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills that the Village of Barrington Hills respectfully urges Commonwealth Edison to decline any request for annexation to East Dundee and to continue in its encouragement of appropriate development within the area generally.

Passed by the Board of Trustees and approved this 23rd day of May, 1977.

Mr. MacArthur moved for adoption of the resolution and Mr. Hamill seconded. Motion carried. Mrs. Hansen will send a letter.

ADMINISTRATION - Barbara P. Hansen

Tenney & Bentley (acting as BACOG's attorney) was allowed to intervene on behalf of South Barrington in opposing the apartment rezoning requested by Hoffman Estates. The rezoning was denied by the Appellate Court, a significant victory for the Barrington area.

BACOG is taking on the review of the A95 material for all of its member villages, thus relieving the villages of further responsibility.

Mrs. Hansen announced that the annual BADC dinner will be held on June 9th at the Barrington Hills Country Club and urged attendance by Village officials.

NEW BUSINESS - Barbara P. Hansen

Mrs. Hansen asked if there were any representatives from the Keene Lake Association present to report their findings to the Village Board. There were none in attendance.

Mr. MacArthur reported meeting with Mr. Dierke (Executive Director of the Illinois Aggregate Association) regarding the conduct of gravel-truck drivers. He is hoping to hear by letter soon.

Mr. Robert Brandt then took photographs of the newly elected board members.

Motion was then made, and seconded, to adjourn to Executive Session.

After the Executive Session the meeting was reconvened, and Mr. Butler read Chief Aldrich's letter of resignation effective June 1, 1977. Motion was made and seconded to accept the resignation. Motion carried.

Mr. MacArthur then made a motion, with Mr. Butler seconding, to appoint Lt. Allan K. Meyer as Acting Chief of Police effective June 1, 1977. Motion carried.

Motion was made and seconded to adjourn the meeting. Meeting was adjourned at 12:37 a.m.




