MINUTES OF THE SPECIAL MEETING OF PRESIDENT AND BORAD OF TRUSTEES VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

December 19, 1977

A special meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held at 8:15 P.M. at the Village Hall on December 19, 1977. President Hansen called the meeting to order. Roll call.

Barbara Hansen President John L. Butler Trustee Jonathan C. Hamill Trustee James Kempe Trustee Louis J. Klein, Jr. Trustee Alexander MacArthur Trustee Sydney G. Craig Village Attorney Lucille Keating Village Treasurer Evan R. Evans Village Building Officer William B. Renshaw Assistant - Roads L. Ann Blanchard Village Clerk

ABSENT: Norman Tucker Trustee

Minutes of the November meeting were presented to the Board for approval. A motion was made and seconded approving the minutes as corrected. Motion carried.

Mrs. Hansen noted that the large wreath on the building had been donated by the Garden Club of Barrington and that the Christmas tree in the hall was donated by Chap Petersen of Springwood Lane. She thanked both for their donations.

BUILDING: Evan R. Evans

Mr. Evans reported that no permits had been issued for the month of December, however, he had one home permit in progress. He commented that he had finished filing the old permits by number as well as by quarter section so that in the future residents requiring information will be able to find it easily. Mr. Renshaw is working on the contractors file. He will give a recap for 1977 at the January meeting.

FINANCE: Norman Tucker

In the absence of Mr. Tucker, Mr. Kempe presented the Treasurer's report to the Board. He noted receipts in the General Fund totalling \$ 55,155. Most of the tax moeny has been collected, with the exception of that from Lake County. Lake County second installment bills are just out, so that money should begin to come in. He noted that several credits listed under miscellaneous will be credited to the proper accounts. The Revenue Sharing resolution will show up in the next statement. Motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurer's Report. Motion carried.

Mr. Kempe then presented the unpaid bills to the Board. They totalled \$12,742.93. Mr. Klein noted that the Road and Bridge bills were quite high due to the higher costs of materials (\$14.00 per hour and (.50 per

ton for sand and salt.) and requested that residents take this into consideration before calling for sand during inclement weather. Mr. Kempe moved approval of the bills, seconded by Mr. Hamill. Roll call. 5 ayes, no nays, 1 absent. Bills were approved for payment.

Mrs. Blanchard reported that to date, the Village has not received a final count from the Special Census, noting that unofficially the count was 3,252 persons.

PUBLIC SAFETY: Alex MacArthur

It was noted that Chief Meyer, Mr. Butler and Mrs. Hansen met with Larry Thoren to disucss the IDOT grant. As a courtesy to Officer Thoren before opening discussion on several entwined subjects, Mrs. Hansen stated that as President, she wished to make the following statement for consideration:

"All Trustees were forewarded copies of Officer Thoren's application for a traffic safety grant of \$ 68,276.00 from the Illinois Department of Transportation. Representing the Village I have investigated to the best of my ability the committments the Village would be making in accepting the grant. They are as follows:

- 1. Commit for three years \$ 102,000.00. This would add two officers and one car to our force.
- 2. Commit to patrolling those high traffic areas approved by the State.
- 3. Abide by the conditions set forth in the grant including, but not limited to:

Village is subject to all Federal and State regulations governing grants:

- a. Hatch Act
- b. Civil Rights Act of 1964
- c. State Equal Employment Clause
- d. Controls expressed by the Division of Traffic Safety

After discussion with Chief Meyer, Officer Thoren, Mr. Butler and the State of Illinois officials I am firmly convinced that under the leadership of Officer Thoren this program should go forth, pending a financial decision by Mr. Tucker, who is out of the country, upon his return we should be prepared to act.

Under consideration at the same time is the Central Dispatch Communications System for Barrington Hills, Barrington and South Barrington. The Board voted in January 1977 to pursue an ILEC Grant to provide the hardware for such a system. A grant of \$ 1,255,900 was awarded. When the system becomes operational in 1979, our yearly commitment for ongoing expenditure will be roughly \$ 20,000, or 20% of the annual operating expense.

For the second time tonight I am firmly convinced after attending the meeting of December 15th with officials of Barrington and South Barrington, Chief Meyer and Jack Butler, that the merits of the system require our participation.

The third item which has to be considered together with the Traffic Safety Grant and the Central Disptch System, is the Salary and Fringe Benefits package presented to the Police Department in 1978. Cost of living increases, health insurance premiums, workmans compensation, etc. will

all push the total salary package upwards by 6 to 8 %, an increase of about \$ 15,000 for fiscal year 1978.

Putting all this together we have to consider a 3 year projection as follows:

1978-79		Traffic Grant Wage increases
1979-80	\$ 20,000	Traffic Grant Wage increases (inc. FICA) Central Dispatch
1980-81	\$ 20,000	Traffic Safety Grant Wage increases Central Dispatch

Keeping in mind that Financial Trustee Tucker is absent tonight, which will postpone action until January, we can either consider the issues tonight or postpone discussion until January and take action at that time."

Mrs. Hansen then introduced Officer Thoren who was open to questions from the Trustees.

Mr. Kempe asked when the grant would begin, to which Officer Thoren replied that setting up the procedure takes about 2 to 3 months. First item to do would be replacing Officer Thoren. Work on the grant should have been started December first, however, the Village can apply for an extension if the program is begun by the first of February, 1978. Mr. Hamill questioned if the program extended beyond the three year period, to which Officer Thoren replied that, there is an obligation on the part of the Village to continue the program unless it is clearly unsuccessful. Chief Meyer interjected that looking at our accident rates, the need will be greater as building increases in the area. High accident areas are the intersections of 25 and 62, 62 and 68, 59, 62 and 68 and 68 west to Three other areas of heavy traffic are West County Kane County Line. Line, Hart and Helm Roads. Areas to be patrolled must be approved by the State. It was noted that the expenditures for the grant could be covered with a supplemental appropriation ordinance. No action was taken, it was deferred until the January meeting, or a special meeting if called.

Chief Meyer reported 32 motor vehicle accidents, 20 with injuries, 1 fatality on Penny Road, 5 burglaries, 2 thefts and 235 routine calls and investigations, 260f which were answers to burglar alams set off by accident. Mr. MacArthur stated he was not in favor of fining those whose alarms go off repeatedly.

PLANNING: Jon Hamill

Mr. Hamill reported that at the Decmeber 12 public hearing, the Plan Commission unanimously recommended the Village Board adopt the changes in the Subdivision Ordinance that had previously been referred to them by resolution.

Merry Oaks Manor: Petitioners for Merry Oaks Manor did not appear, action on their final plat was deferred until the January meeting.

Rock Ridge South: At their December 12th meeting, the Plan Commission recommended the Village Board approve the Preliminary Plat of Subdivision for Rock Ridge South. There was discussion regarding the easement for the bridal path and the easement along the stream. After discussion, it was decided to have the wording on the legend worked out between Mr. Kopp and Mr. Craig. A motion was made and seconded approving the Preliminary Plat, amended to include "shall not relieve the property oweners of obligations to maintain the creek" on the plat. Motion carried.

ZONING: James Kempe

Mr. Kempe reported that the Zoning Board of Appeals had met in pulbic hearing as directed by the Village Board to consider the amendments to the Zoning Ordinance as per the resolution, on December 19th. The Zoning Board unanimously approved recommendation to the Village Board that the amendments be adipted. Action was deferred on the code as a whole (the typos are being corrected) until the January meeting.

ROADS: Louis Klein

Mr. Klein reported that the 1977 maintenance on MFT work had been completed. Mr. Lenzini and Mr. Renshaw have checked it and it is in order. The State has notified the Village that Route 68 will be widened by an additional 10 feet in the future, from Route 14 to Route 59. He then noted that the calls and complaints have all been answered. Cook County will not authorize a sign at the intersection of Otis Road and Hawthorne Lane on the basis that it isn't travelled heavily enough.

LEGISLATION, HEALTH, INSURANCE:: John L. Butler

Mr. Butler noted that the Workmen's Comp case regarding Officer Dembek had been improperly handled and that he would check further with the Workmen's Comp. to clarify the claim.

He noted that the new State of Illinois legislation has been passed requiring the employer to put in 1% of the employee's wages towards unemployment insurance to a maximum of the first \$ 6,000 annual salary. The law is effective April 1, 1978. Determination of method of payment must be made prior to January 31, 1978. Action to be taken at the January meeting.

ADMINISTRATION: Barbara Hansen

Mrs. Hansen reported that she had chaired a BACOG meeting with Lake Barrington, in which they were invited to join BACOG. Progress of the Department of Local Affairs Grant and the intragrovernmental agreements will be reported at a later date.

Work is complete on the remodelling of the Village Hall. A maintenance man has been hired to keep things clean as well as do some of the outside work.

Mrs. Hansen reported meeting with representatives from HUD, the Corps of Engineers, a State Engineer, Mr. Lenzini, Mr. Klein, Mr. Evans and Mrs. Blanchard regarding possible remapping of the flood plains in our Village at the expense of HUD. After discussing the matter it was determined that

Barrington Hills doesn't qualify for the grant and we will have to handle flood plain areas as in the past.

NEW BUISNESS: Hart Road - Western Avenue

Mrs. Hansen stated the so-called Western Avenue-Hart Road Intergovernmental Agreement is a fine example of mutual cooperation between two villages, the school district and the County of Lake and homeowners to bring to fruition a compact beneficial to all concerned. The paperwork has been horrendous and fortunately BACOG has received a grant of money from 701 funds DLGA (Division of Local Governmental Affairs) to help defray Village legal expenses arising from the agreements. The following people were involved in technically and legally solving the document details: Edward Streed, Lake County Superintendant of Highways, Tom Hayward, Jr. representing the Northern Trust Company, William Braithwaite, representing the Village of Barrington and Sydney Craig, representing the Village of Barrington Hills.

Briefly the agreement is this:

- 1. Disannex the Northern Trust Company property east of 100' from the center of Hart Road.
- 2. Annex the Northern Trust Company property to Barrington and change the zoning to B-4, Office and Research.
- 3. Close to thru traffic existing Hart Road south of the railroad crossing.
- 4. Cul-su-sac existing Hart Road at Lake County expense.
- 5. Northern Trust Company to provide 100' Scenic Easement and Conservation Right, remaining in Barrington Hills in perpetuity.
- 6. Police patrol of new Hart Road by Barrington Police Department including those portions lying in Barrington Hills.
- 7. Maintenance of entire length of new Hart Road, including railroad corssing in Barrington Hills, by Lake County.

At this time Mrs. Hansen opened the meeting up to questions from the Trustees. Mr. Hamill asked about changes in the documents, to which Mr. Braithwaite replied that the changes were noted by underlining on one set of documents and the second set was clean.

Mr. MacArthur asked for and was given the names of those in the Trust and then questioned Mr. Hamill as to a possible conflict. Mr. Hamill replied that he was not related to any of the beneficiaries by blood and that he personally had no present or contingint interest in the trust property. Mr. MacArthur's next concern was the trade off between the school district and Barrington to provide for additional space for sewage disposal, stating that that had not been brought out initially when the Trustees were approached. Mr. Braithwaite said that the following could be added to the agreement: "Relative to the projected current expansion of the Barrington Wastewater Treatment plant, Barrington will not extend sanitary sewers into the Village of Barrington Hills." It was noted that the agreement could always be amended and therefore not necessary to add the statement at this time. Mr. MacArthur was also concerned about the absence from the meeting of the Hart Road residents. Mr. Hamill pointed out that a special meeting concerning the road had been held in the fall of 1975 and

those attending stated a strong desire that the road be closed to through traffic as soon as possible. He also noted that the lack of attendance at this meeting undoubtedly indicated approval, since the matter had been well publicized. Finally, Mrs. Hansen commented that she had spoken personally to a number of Hart Road residents in recent days and had found again that their primary objective continues to be the closing of Hart Road.

To get the matter on the ltable Mron Hamill moved tapprovat of the concept preparatory to sconsidering the degal documents themselves on Mror Kempe seconded the motion. Motion carried. (Mr. MacArthur voted nay.)

The first document to be considered was the resolution approving an intergovernmental agreement relative to the Disconnection of certain territory from the Village of Barrington Hills and the annexation of same to the Village of Barrington. The document to be amended as follows:

4th pp. after annexation to Barrington, "the legal description of which shall be amended to conform to paragraph 1 hereof," and addition of item # 13: "Relative to the projected current expansion of the Barrington Wastewater Treatment Plant, Barrington will not extend Sanitary Services into Barrington Hills." Mr. Kempe moved adoption of the agreement, seconded by Mr. Klein. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 1 abstention, 1 absent. The agreement was adopted. The President and the Clerk were authorized to sign the agreement.

At this time, Mr. MacArthur left the meeting.

The second document to consider was the resolution accepting the Grant of Conservation Right and Scenic Easement. Mr. Hamill moved, seconded by Mr. Kempe, acceptiance of the document. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Resoultion was adopted.

Lastly, the Disconnection Ordinance 77-20 was presented to the Board for approval. Mr. Kempe moved, seconded by Mr. Butler, the **Disconnection** of certain parcels from the Village of Barrington Hills. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent. Ordinance 77-20 was adopted.

There being no further business, Mr. Kempe moved to adjourn. Seconded by Mr. Butler. Meeting was adjoruned at 11/30 P.M.
