Enclosed is a copy of the "horse ordinance" which I suggested to you might be considered for adoption by the Village Board. Last night at the regular monthly meeting of the Officers and Directors of the Riding Club of Barrington Hills, I read the proposed ordinance and asked for comments from the eight other members present. After a brief discussion, a motion was made and passed unanimously to inform you that the proposal carries their endorsement. I have also discussed it with several other village residents and have found no objections.

You may notice that I have added an unfinished sentence to provision number 2. I am sure the village Engineer can provide specifications for what he would consider sufficient protection for a septic line. This subject may, of course, also be covered elsewhere in the building code.

## DEFINITIONS:

EQUINE: A horse, pony, mule, or ass

STABLE, COMMERCIAL: Any building or land where any equine or equidae are kept for remuneration: hire, resale, boarding, for use in giving lessons for a fee or for any public use. Also, any building or land advertised or offered publicly for any of these uses.

STABLE, PRIVATE: Any building or land incidental to an existing use, where any equine or equidae are kept for the exclusive use of the occupants of the premises and-or his neighbors. This is meant to allow the private stable owner to keep horses on a not-for-profit basis for friends who are also village residents, but strictly excludes any of the above commercial uses. Sale of a family horse is not a commercial activity. The raising af a foal is an agricultural use, as is the sale of the foal. A foal will not be considered in the counting of equidae until January 1 of the year after it is foaled.

- 1. Number of equidae will be limited to one to each 40,000 square feet, either owned or leased. A variance will be allowed on a yearly basis, up to 50% more than the allowed number, provided:
  - a. excess manure is piled and hauled away at least once a month.
    b. no valid objection is raised by neighbors.
- 2. No pasture, paddock, barn nor any regular or heavy traffic area (equine or vehicular) shall be placed directly over a septic tank, line or field. A line may pass under a driveway provided soil cover is
