MINUTES OF MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

A regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held Monday, January 24, 1966 at 7:30 P.M., at the Countryside School in said village. Present:

The President appointed Trustee, A. M. Zimmerman to act as Clerk pro tem.

Due to the illness of the Village Clerk, Francis P. Arnold, the reading of the minutes of the December 27, 1965 meeting was postponed. The minutes of a special meeting of the Board held January 5, 1966 were approved as read.

The Village Treasurer, Norman Tucker, presented and commented on his Treasurer's Report which, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, was approved:

It was moved and seconded that the foregoing bills be approved for payment. The roll was called - 6 ayes, no nays. The President declared the motion for approval of payment carried.

There followed a discussion about clerical help which is required to keep Village and Police books and records up-to-date. Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the Deputy Clerk was authorized to place an ad for such clerical help in the local papers circulated in the Village.

A brief report concerning the condition and maintenance of roads and bridges throughout the Village was presented by Mr.Pepper.

Mr. McLaughlin reported that the Plan Commission recommended the approval and acceptance of Wooten's re-subdivision of Hawthorne Hills Subdivision. It was moved and seconded that the subdivision plat thereof be approved as recommended by the Plan Commission. During the ensuing discussion it was pointed out that no surety bond or cash had been offered as required by the Subdivision Ordinance, although the plat and the roads and construction plans therefor had been approved by the Village Engineer. The motion for approval and acceptance, with the consent of the seconder, was amended by the moving trustee to provide that such Subdivision Plat be accepted subject to a bond being posted in compliance with the Subdivision Ordinance. On being put to a vote the motion, as amended, was carried unanimously. Mr. Renshaw reported that he had attended a hearing in Algonquin on Tuesday, January 11, 1966, at which hearing evidence was presented in support of a petition to change the zoning of certain property lying immediately west of the boundaries of the Village of Barrington and north of County Line Road. Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the following resolution was adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills that the Proposed Amendment to

the Zoning Ordinance and the Zoning Map of McHenry County, Illinois, to rezone the following described real estate:

That part of the Southeast Quarter of Section 35, Township 43 North, Range 8 East of the Third Principal Meridian, described as follows: Beginning at a point on the Northerly line of Algonquin Road, as per plat recorded under document number 94439, said point being 380.0 feet Southeasterly of the West line of said Southeast Quarter (measured along the Northerly line of Algonquin Road); thence Northeasterly perpendicular to the Northerly line of said Algonquin Road, 501.16 feet; thence Southeasterly along a line parallel with the Northerly line of said Algonquin Road, 670.0 feet; thence South to a point on the Northerly line of said Algonquin Road, said point being 1400.00 feet Southeasterly of the West line of said Southeast Quarter (measured along the Northerly line of said Road) thence Northwesterly along the Northerly line of said Algonquin Road to the place of beginning, in McHenry County, Illinois;

from its present classification of "F" Farming to "B-1" Business District, be and hereby is protested by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills on the following grounds:

- 1. The proposed amendment is inconsistent with the comprehensive plan of the Village of Barrington Hills and the Zoning Ordinance of said village heretofore adopted and now in effect.
- 2. The proposed amendment is not related to and does not promote the public health, safety, morals, comfort and general welfare of the public.

- 3. The proposed amendment does not make due allowance for existing conditions, the conservation of property values, the direction of building development and the direction of the uses to which property in the area will be devoted.
- 4. The Village of Barrington Hills is a zoned municipality with their comprehensive plan duly recorded in the Recorder's Office of McHenry County, and the subject property is within one and one-half (1-1/2) miles of the limits of said Village.

A report was presented by the Chairman of the Public Safety Committee, Mr. Grigsby, and by Chief Hummel. Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the appointment of two additional persons as temporary police officers was approved. Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried Officer Hengl was promoted to the rank of Lieutenant and Officer Pecoraro was promoted to Sergeant.

Upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried,

James Argy was appointed as a police office and Allan K. Myer was

appointed a special police officer.

It was moved and seconded that a tape recorder be purchased for use by the Police Department. Such tape recorder is not to cost in excess of \$85.00. The roll was called - 6 ayes, no mays. The President declared the motion carried.

It was moved and seconded that the President and

Deputy Clerk of the Village be authorized to execute a new

radio contract with the Supervisors of Lake County, Illinois.

The roll was called - 6 ayes, no mays. The President declared the motion carried.

There being no further business, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the meeting was adjourned.
