MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES Village of Barrington Hills February 27, 1967

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was called to order by the President, Mr. Thomas Z. Hayward, at 7:30 Monday evening, February 27th, 1967, at the Countryside School, Brinker and County Line Roads, Barrington Hills, Illinois. The following were present:

The minutes of the regular adjourned meeting of January 30th having been read by the Trustees prior to the meeting, were approved as read.

The Treasurer presented his report, copy of which is attached to and made a part of these minutes. After discussion, the Trustees approved the report.

Mr. Pepper, Chairman of the Roads and Bridges Committee, presented the following bills:

Cuba Township Highway Commissioner - snow control, Jan. \$649.25 Riess Excavating & Trucking - snow control, Jan. and Feb.1,120.01 William B. Renshaw - 497 miles @ 8¢ per mile 39.76

It was moved and seconded that payment of all of the above bills be approved. After discussion, the motion was adopted by a vote of 4 ayes, no nays, 3 absent.

The Trustees expressed a vote of appreciation for the excellent snow and ice control on village roads during the recent storms and blizzards.

Mr. Pepper reported that he had recieved applications from Northern Illinois Gas Company for permits to install gas main partially through private easements on Brinker Road and on Rt. 59. The Board said there was no reason to object to the permits being granted.

Mr. Pepper suggested that Mr. Pepper arrange to renew the striping on village roads before his retirement from the Board.

Mr. Renshaw said he attended a meeting of the Northwest Municipal Council which was interesting, but considered very little pertaining to our problems. Mr. Renshaw also reported he had recieved a letter from Mr. Christiansen of Merri-Oaks Road stating that he believes Mr. Rodgers' septic system drains onto his property. Mr. Renshaw contacted Mr. Rodgers who will take care of it when weather permits.

Mr. Grigsby, Chairman of the Public Safety Committee, reported on traffic violations and break-ins. He also advised that immediate action must be taken on leasing police cars. The agreement with Bob Burrows Chevrolet expires May 1st. They are asking \$350.00 per month per car, as compared to the present \$200.00 per month we are paying. Eddie Ruch Pontiac of Wheaton will lease two police cars to our specifications for \$200.00 a month per car. Ruch will agree

to pay for oil changes done locally to avoid travelling to Wheaton for such changes. Mr. Zimmerman has read the proposed agreement. In order to guarantee May 1st delivery of the cars, immediate action is necessary. Motion was made and seconded that the proposed agreement with Eddie Ruch Pontiac to lease two police cars for \$200.00 each per month be adopted. After discussion, the motion was adopted by a roll call vote of 4 ayes, no nays, 3 absent. The proper officials executed the agreement and Chief Hummel took it to deliver to Eddie Ruch Pontiac.

Chief Hummel reported on the meeting he attended to consider the problem of juvenile drinking. He said it was urged that a Citizens' Committee be formed to attack the problem. At the meeting, Chief Hummel said he felt parents should be consulted to see if they want a civilian group digging into their affairs. President Hayward said Barrington Hills would rely on whether or not Chief Hummel feels we have a juvenile drinking problem. After discussion, it was the Board's consensus that Chief Hummel should attend the meetings as an observer. The Village is concerned but feels it should not adopt an Ordinance or Resolution at this time.

There was no report by the Health Committee.

Mr. Grigsby gave the report for the Zoning and Planning Committee. He had attended a meeting regarding the proposed Farm School in the Forest Preserve. He had consulted with Chief Hummel as to what problems such a project might create for our police department. He had reported to Mr. McLaughlin, Chairman of the Plan Commission, who is calling a meeting of his Commission and will make a report to the Board at the March meeting.

Mr. Zimmerman, Chairman of the Law Committee, presented the proposed Election Ordinance, and moved its adoption. The motion

was seconded, and after discussion, was passed with a roll call vote of 4 ayes, no nays, 3 absent.

Regarding the request by Mr. Green of Joslyn, Kell, & Conerty for disconnection of a client's property, Mr. Zimmerman said he will talk to Mr. Green and have a report for the next meeting.

Mr. Truninger said the Kuranz case had been removed from trial call because Mr. Kuranz was out of the country. Mr. Truninger thinks the case will probably come on trial call again in March. There is nothing new on the Aleski case. In the matter of Ernst suing the village because he was arrested for a traffic violation in Kane County and tried in Cook County, the Judge threw out the case and gave them 30 days to re-file.

The President read a letter to the Board from the Barrington Middle School Teacher-Parent Organization inviting him and the Trustees to a program February 21 on Juvenile Delinquency. Chief Hummel had attended that meeting and will represent the village at the next meeting February 28th.

The President presented a copy of Barrington Resolution # 246 which favors completion of a Barrington Highway by-pass project but puts Barrington on record as not endorsing the Hart Road/Old Barrington Road proposed extension from County Line to Route 22. The Resolution had been sent to Mr. Hayward for our information.

Mr. Hayward then read a letter to the Board from the Lake County Zoning Board of Appeals advising that Edw. Hoggins has decided to withdraw his petition for re-zoning certain properties at Hart Road and Northwest Highway. Barrington Hills had adopted a Resolution protesting the proposed re-zoning.

The President brought to the Board's attention an excellent booklet issued by the Lake County Plan Commission about Open Space in Lake County. The Clerk was asked to see that the booklet was

sent to Mr. McLaughlin.

The Chair then noted that the Board would not have a quorum April 24th, the usual meeting date, and suggested it be put on the aggenda at the March meeting that the Board would meet Thursday, April 20th. The Clerk was asked to notify the newspapers.

It was announced that at the Village election April 18th to elect three Trustees, Mr. Grigsby is standing for re-election, and Mr. Norman Tucker and Mr. D. Wendell Fentress are seeking to fill the vacancies because Mr. Welsh and Mr. Pepper have decided not to run again. Mr. Grigsby, Mr. Tucker and Mr. Fentress are running unopposed for Trustees of the Village. However, the Chair urged everyone to vote.

There being no other or further business, the meeting was adjourned.
