MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

The regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held at the Countryside School, County Line and Brinker Roads, Monday, March 28, 1966, at 7:30 P. M.

The minutes of the regular meeting of the President and Board of Trustees held February 28, 1966 were approved.

Mr. Welsh presented the Treasurer's report and there being no further comments, upon motion duly made, seconded and unanimously carried, the report was approved.

Mr. Grigsby reported that during the period since the last regular meeting of the Board, there had been four motor vehicle accidents within the Village and six cases of breaking and entering. The matter of a civil

suit for damages to the squad car was turned over to Mr. Truninger for handling.

Mr. Grigsby pointed out that apprehension of a burglar in the act of robbing a house on Oak Knoll Road had come to nothing. Despite fine work and three days of effort in Waukegan on the part of some of our police officers, the robber was let out on a \$250 cash bond. He of course jumped the bond.

Chief Hummel reported that part-time clerical help for the Police Board was proving to be quite satisfactory. He also stated that the Village boundary signs were being moved to proper locations.

Mr. Pepper reported that contracts for the use Neticed

of motor vehicle funds for road work will be let April 15.

He indicated that in the meantime repair of road damage

due to spring break up and thaw could not be made for six

to eight weeks.

Mr. Renshaw reported that progress had been made on clearing the brush, burning, and cleaning up the roadside on Helm Road.

Mr. Truninger reported that after conferences with Mrs. Everett's attorneys, the burning of the buildings

on the Lindhimer property had been authorized and that this had been accomplished under the supervision and direction of the Fire District. This included taking down the chimney.

The roll was called. There were five ayes, no nays, and one absent. The bills were approved for payment.

Mr. McLaughlin presented a petition for disconnection filed by the Lutheran Church and moved that it be referred to the Planning Commission for report and recommendation. The motion was seconded and upon being put to a vote was unanimously carried.

Mr. Zimmerman moved that an amendment to the Zoning Ordinance providing for Planning Developments be referred to the Zoning Board of Appeals for public hearing, report, and recommendation. The motion was seconded and upon being put to a vote was unanimously carried.

Mr. Zimmerman presented a draft ordinance amending the Zoning Ordinance to control and regulate signs in the Business and Light Industrial District. He moved that the proposed amendment be referred to the Zoning Board of Appeals for public hearing, report, and recommendation.

Mr. Truninger reported that he had negotiated with Mr. Wight with respect to preparing an accurate description and map of the Village and an alphabetical index of all roads within the Village. The firm cost is \$800 for the map and \$310 for the roads. He was instructed to see what the Fire District and the Countryside Association would be willing to do with respect to sharing the cost thereof. Later in the meeting it was moved and seconded that the following resolution be adopted:

RESOLVED: That the proper officers of the Village be and they are hereby authorized to expend not to exceed \$1200 for the preparation of an accurate description and boundary map of the Village and an alphabetical index of all roads within the Village limits.

The roll was called. There were five ayes, no mays and one absent. The resolution was adopted.

There were some 43 residents of the Village present at the meeting for the purpose of discussing the proposed location of an accelerator in the Barrington Hills Countryside area. This would probably include some 9000 acres lying between the Kane-Cook County Line, Palatine Road, Barrington Road and the Tollway. President Haywood pointed out that at its December meeting the Board of Trustees had adopted a resolution opposing the acquisition of the proposed site.

There was considerable discussion. Following the close thereof, Mr. Welsh moved that the President be authorized and directed to appoint a committee to work with other organizations and groups to oppose the acquisition of any site in the Barrington Countryside area. The motion was seconded and upon being put to a vote was unanimously carried. The President thereupon

appointed the following persons and indicated that some person from each of the named groups would also be appointed.

Dear Tom:

Since it appears now that I will be unable to attend the Board Meeting on March 28, I thought perhaps I should send you a note regarding the February 28, 1966 financial statements of the Village, which were previously sent to the Board of Trustees.

Somehow or other we got hold of a bad draft for the statement of assets and the due dates on the U.S. Treasury bills contained some errors. I would appreciate it if you would change your copy of the statement of assets to show the following due dates.

For the U.S. Treasury bills of the General Fund, the due dates should be March 31, 1966, July 7, 1966, and July 21, 1966. For the U.S. Treasury bills of the Motor Fuel Fund, they are due on April 7, 1966. The amounts shown on the statement representing our investment in the bills are correct but for some reason we didn't catch the erroneous due dates.

With respect to the U.S. Treasury bills due March 31, 1966, it is my present intention to let those bills mature. You will see from the statements that we anticipate receiving about \$4,000 in receipts in the next two months while our expenditures will be at the \$29,000 level. Reaching this level of disbursements is contingent on Dick Pepper's decision with respect to roads and bridges since he has approximately \$15,000 left in his budget as of the end of February. For purposes of the forecast, I am assuming that he will spend that amount so naturally this makes up a substantial portion of the total of \$29,000 of anticipated expenditures. The only other area where our

expenditures are forecast at a level which we might not achieve is in connection with our legal fees and court costs. We are still budgeting a total of \$3,000 for the year. However, we have only spent \$800 to date, so to the extent that we are under budget on legal fees, our cash balance will be higher than the amount shown on the statements. If the road and bridge expenditures and the legal fees come out according to budget, then I believe our cash and security balance at year end will be very close to the \$52,373 shown on the statements. Should this be the case, naturally we will have to use the \$10,000, which we will receive from the U.S. Treasury bills, to cover some of these disbursements.

I don't believe there is anything else unusual in the statements that needs to be pointed out to the Board. I am sorry that I am going to miss the meeting.
