#### MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES Village of Barrington Hills April 20, 1967

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was called to order by the Clerk at 7:30 PM Thursday, April 20th, instead of April 24th because it was predetermined that a quorum would not be available for the latter date. Notice of change of meeting date had been published in the Barrington Courier Review. In the absence of the President, the Clerk called the meeting to order. A call of the roll showed the following Trustees present:

Raymond J. Grigsby John I. Shaw John McLaughlin, Jr. Austin M. Zimmerman

The Clerk announced the first order of business was the election of a President Pro-Tem. On motion duly made and seconded, Mr. Zimmerman was elected President Pro-Tem by unanimous vote of those Trustees present.

Mr. Zimmerman, with the approval of the Board, suspended the regular order of business to ask the guests present if they wished to address the Board. Mr. Gilbert Mueller referred to a letter he had written the Trustees regarding the write-in votes cast for him as Trustee in the recent election. The letter was read to the Board. Mr. Zimmerman thanked Mr. Mueller for his fine letter.

Mr. Richard Schwartzburg of Helm Road then complained about the impossible condition of the road and about the dumping by Carpenters-ville residents on the shoulders of the road. He and other residents of Helm Road who were also at the meeting spoke of the dangerous condition of the road and said they feel it is badly neglected. Mr. Grisgby said other village roads are in just as bad condition. He also mentioned having been informed by Helm Road residents when the annexation of Middlebury to Barrington Hills was under discussion, that they did not want good paving for the road because they would then be faced with a tremendous amount of traffic from Meadowdale. Mr.

Renshaw said that motor fuel funds cannot be used to repair roads until after May 15th when all frost is out of the ground. Mr. Galloway said that Middlebury had secured a free estimate from the State as to how much it would cost to put in a road with a proper base and good black top. After further discussion, Mr. McLaughlin was appointed to secure an engineering study and go over the problem with Mr. Galloway.

Regarding the mail box vandalism, Mr. Grigsby said that this is a widespread problem occurring not only in Barrington Hills, and that our police are always trying to apprehend these vandals. Chief Hummel reported they have one young man who was caught robbing a mail box, and that the matter is in the process of being brought to court. The Chief said there must be an actual witness to the deed and the citizen must be prepared to file a complaint and to appear in court if necessary.

The regular order of business was resumed. The minutes of March 27th were approved as read.

The Treasurer gave his report, copy of which is attached to and made a part of these minutes. At the Treasurer's request, the Board, by roll call vote, approved a transfer of \$400.00 to the Insurance account and of \$600.00 to Public Safety Office Supplies, both from the amount appropriated for Salaries of Public Safety Officers. The Treasurer also was granted authority to re-invest the Treasury bills coming due April 6th.

Mr. McLaughlin, in the absence of the Finance Chairman, submitted the following bills for approval for payment:

Motion was made and seconded that all of the above bills be approved for payment, and after discussion, the motion was carried by roll call vote - 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent.

Mr. McLaughlin, Chairman of the Health Committee had no report.

Mr. Shaw, Chairman of the Zoning and Planning Committee, presented a petition from the Elmhurst National Bank as Trustee for Trust No. 1293, to re-zone 40 acres of certain described properties in parts of Section 26, McHenry County. After discussion, the Board referred the petition to the Zoning Board of Appeals for Public Hearing and recommendation.

Mr. McLaughlin read a letter sent to the President and members of the Board of Education of School District No 4 protesting the proposed establishment of a Farm School on certain Forest Preserve properties.

Mr. Truninger reported that the Ernst case has been revived. Mr. Ernst has filed an amended complaint. The Zeleski and Kuranz cases are still status quo.

The Chair asked Mr. Renshaw to meet Mrs. Henry Cooke at the Everett property on Helm Road to discuss possible further clean up of the property.

Having received complaints again about Dr. Donovan's creating a dump at the corner of County Line and Donlea Roads, the Board asked the Attorney to write him a letter of protest. Mr. Renshaw was asked to ascertain why Dr. Donovan had not taken out a building permit for the four new bedrooms and bath he is reported to have made in his home.

The Clerk presented the sealed Certificate of the Results of the election for three Trustees held April 18th. The Chair announced the following results:

A total of 243 blank ballots had been delivered by the Clerk to the Judges. Of these, 146 ballots were cast, of which 7 were defective. The number of unused ballots returned to the Clerk were 97. The sealed envelopes of the tally lists were presented and opened and examined by the Board to see that the lists co-incided with the Certificate of Results. The Chair announced that they did and proclaimed Mr. D. Wendell Fentress, Mr. Raymond J. Grigsby, and Mr. Norman Tucker had been elected for four year terms as Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills. Thereupon, the Clerk administered the Official Oaths of Office to each new Trustee.
