MEETING OF BOARD OF TRUSTEES Village of Barrington Hills August 31, 1967

The regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills of August 28th having been adjourned for lack of a quorum, was called to order at 7:30 PM Wednesday, August 30th, by Mr. Thomas Z. Hayward, President. The following Trustees were present:

The following were also present:

Minutes of the meeting of July 24th having been read by the Trustees prior to the meeting, the motion that the minutes be approved as read was made, seconded, and approved.

The Treasurer presented his report, copy of which is attached to and made a part of these minutes. He requested authority to invest \$20,000.00 of the General Fund in Government bonds. It was moved and seconded that the Treasurer's request be granted. After discussion, the motion was carried with a roll call vote of 5 ayes, no nays, l absent. The Treasurer's report was approved.

The Chair called for Committee Reports:

FINANCE - Mr. Tucker, Chairman, reported that a blanket bond for municipal officials is not allowed in Illinois. Therefore, he had had all persons authorized to sign checks bonded. The Board approved the bonds. Mr. Tucker presented the proposed Levy Ordinance. It was referred to the Law Committee for report. Mr. Zimmerman, Chairman of the Law Committee, reported that according to our attorney, the new legislation restricting municipalities to .25 tax rate does not apply if the municipality as of June 29th, 1967, was operating under a higher rate. Barrington Hills' rate was higher on that date. The Chairman of the Law Committee therefore

moved that the proposed Levy Ordinance be adopted. The motion was seconded and, after discussion, was adopted by a roll call vote of 5 ayes, no nays, 1 absent. The Clerk was directed to see that Ordinance No. 67-6, the Levy Ordinance, was filed with the four County Clerks.

ROADS AND BRIDGES - Mr. Fentress, Chairman, presented the following:

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Cuba Twp. Highway Com. - mowing; replacing Stop Sign at
Ridge and Oak Knoll Roads

Liberty Asphalt - road repairs - general fund

Liberty Asphalt - MFT contract 1967 road repair

William Renshaw - 228 miles @ 8¢ per mile

Chris Rieke - balance due on repair culvert - Dales Rd. 127.50
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Motion was made that all of the above bills be approved for payment. The motion was seconded, and after discussion, was adopted by a roll call vote of 5 ayes, no nays, 1 absent. The Board asked that the two checks for Liberty Asphalt be held until Mr. Fentress and Mr. Renshaw ascertain if the work is satisfactory.

Mr. Fentress notified the Board that the Northern Illinois Gas Company has requested permission to install its facilities on certain described areas along County Line Road, Bateman Road, and Bateman Circle. Mr. Holdiman of Northern Illinois Gas Company described the properties and their planned installations. Mr. Shaw mentioned that his company had carried their lines on his private road without obtaining permission, that the back fill had been so poorly done that he damaged his car when he was stuck in it, and he asked Mr. Holdiman to look into the matter. Mr. Fentress also advised that

Illinois Bell has requested permission to install its facilities along Hart Hills Drive, Hart Road, and Bartlett Road. The President suggested that the Plan Commission and the Law committee investigate the practicality of requiring all utilities hereafter to be underground installations.

Mr. Fentress reported that Mr. Duchossois wants to study the zoning ordinance to determine what are permitted uses before he annexes to the village. Mr. Donovan has finally cleaned up his property on West County Line Road. The Lake County Sanitary Board has given Mr. J. B. Rodgers 30 days to repair his septic system. The 30 days terminates August 31st, after which time the Sanitary Board will take the necessary steps if the condition still exists.

PUBLIC SAFETY - In the absence of the Chairman, Chief Hummel proposed that an amendment to the Traffic Ordinance be drawn up to enable No Parking restrictions to be enforced on the drivers of leased cars. He reported that there is a tree sticking out on Helm Road which is 2 hazard to driving. Mr. Fentress was asked to see that the tree is removed. Chief Hummel recommended the appointments of Mr. Donald Martin and Mr. Billy Bert Sessous as full time patrolmen at a salary of \$450.00 a month and of Lloyd Rasmussen and Kenneth Greffin as Special Police. The Board confirmed these appointments subject to Mr. Grigsby's approval. The Chief said his department has made 106 routine calls and investigations during the month; there had been one case of vandalism, 26 motor accidents, and a run-a-way boy who had returned home.

With the approval of the Board, the Chair suspended the regular order of business to hear from some of the residents who were present.

Mr. Ben Martin, Caesar Drive, presented a petition signed by the residents of Caesar Drive and Dana Lane asking that speed limits on

these roads be restricted to 25 miles per hour. The Chief read from the traffic laws of the state which prohibit establishing speed limits below 35 mph in areas outside urban districts. He then read the leagal interpretation of "urban districts", and pointed out that the roads in question are not in urban districts. Mr. Martin said his company attorneys had assured him the speed limit could be restricted. After discussion, the Board said it is sympathetic to the petition and if it legally possible to reduce the speed limit, the Village will gladly do so. The Board suggested Mr. Martin's attorney contact the village attorney, Mr. Truninger.

Mr. Cerny asked about building his proposed lake. After thorough discussion, during which the Board expressed the fear that a lake which would take a year to build is a gravel pit rather than a clake. The Board advised Mr. Cerny and Mr. DeBolt that in applying for a permit to dig the lake, they will have to present pertinent engineering data.

Mr. Riess submitted his bid for road work, which was turned over to Mr. Fentress for study and report.

ZONING AND PLANNING - Mr. Shaw, Chairman, reported the recommendation just received from the Zoning Board of Appeals of the village that the petition by the Elmhurst National Bank and Mr. Dotson, to re-zone to 2-acre homesites certain described properties in McHenry County, be denied. Mr. Franz, Mr. Dotson's attorney, had just received the report and had not had time to study it. Therefore, the Board decided to defer action until the next meeting.

Alabar's petition for annexation was then presented. After discussion, at Mr. McLaughlin's suggestion, the Board asked the Clerk to forward it to the Chairman of the Zoning Board of Appeals.

HEALTH - Mr. McLaughlin, Chairman, had no report. Mr. Fentress

said he had received complaints of diseased and dead elms on Rt. 63. The Chair advised Mr. Fentress this matter was in his department and suggested he contact Mr. Mortimer to find out whom to contact regarding removal of these trees on county highway property.

LAW COMMITTEE - Mr. Zimmerman, Chairman, reported that in his opinion House Bills 476 and 477 passed by the Illinois Legislature concerning the necessity of advertising municipal board meetings, were not really restrictive because they carry no sanctions.

The President read a letter from the President of South Barring-ton suggesting Barrington Hills adopt a Resolution approving the proposed acquisition by the Cook County Forest Preserve District of the property formerly known as the Rossmoor property. The Board adopted the suggested Resolution, subject to Mr. McLaughlin's not finding any reason it would be detrimental to our village.

The Chair asked the Board to confirm his appointments of Mr. John McLaughlin, Jr. and Mr. Edward Wallis to three year terms on the Plan Commission. The appointments were unanimously confirmed.

The President announced that Mr. Douglas Millin, architect, had agreed to act as Building Commissioner for the village. Mr. Renshaw will continue as Building Inspector, having recovered from his recent surgery.

The President read a letter from Governor Koerner's office regarding a proposed study of the problems of small villages.

There being no other or further business, meeting adjourned.
