MEETING OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES of THE VILLAGE OF BARRINGTON HILLS

December 18, 1967

A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington Hills was held Monday, December 18, 1967 at 7:30 P.M. at Countryside School in the Village of Barrington Hills.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the November 27th minutes.

Mr. McLaughlin asked that the second sentence on page three, first paragraph,
be stricken. Roll call, 4 ayes, no nays, two absent. Motion then carried and
the minutes were approved.

A second motion was then made and seconded to approve the rewritten minutes of September 25th. Motion carried.

The Treasurer's report, which had been mailed to all of the Trustees was submitted to the Board for approval. Motion was made and seconded to approve the Treasurer's report. Motion carried.

A motion was made and seconded to approve the bills for payment. Roll call. 4 ayes, no nays, 2 absent.

Roads and Bridges: Mr. Fentress reported that he had approved the Illinois
Bell Telephone requests to lay underground phone cables.

Mr. Fentress and Mr. Renshaw checked all the Village roads in order to get their spring plans into shape. Regarding Hart Road, Mr. Hayward said it is a Village Road but qualifies to be taken over by Lake County. He will talk to Mr. Joe Welch again about the matter.

The Northern Illinois Gas Company petition for laying and maintaining gas lines for about a two mile stretch within the Village was presented by Mr. Fentress for approval. Motion was made and seconded to approve the petition. Motion carried.

Mr. Frank Amon called about the condition of Tamarack Lane. Mr. Renshaw was directed to let him know that the road would get attention in the spring.

Mr. Fentress reported that the contractor who did the work for the Riding Center was to submit his bill to Mr. Millin so that he could determine the permit fee. Counsel was asked to write a letter to the Riding Center about the Village ordinances concerning moving, constructing, or remodeling a building without a permit.

Public Safety: Mr. Grigsby reported 67 routine calls and 13 auto accidents. He also reported that a new police secretary had been hired. Mrs. Weidner will be paid a salary of \$ 350.00 a month. He is also going to check the false arrest policies available in order to get better coverage.

Mr. Grigsby reported about his meeting with Mr. Ebel regarding the new lease for the police building. The lease presented was as follows, five years at \$ 100.00 a month rent, an option to purchase, an option to remodel or make improvements. Mr. Ebel can terminate the lease on a 90 day notice if he has a bona fide offer to purchase. At that time we can exercise our option to meet the offer until such time that we can raise the money. It was noted that there was no escape clause for the Village and it was recommended that the lease be returned to counsel for further revisions.

Chief Hummel had no report.

Zoning and Planning: Mr. Shaw read a letter describing Magnum's request for an airstrip. After December 27, an order approving the request will be issued by the Civil Aeronautics Board. Mr. Truninger was asked to check Cook County zoning on this matter.

A motion was made and seconded to adopt a resolution to oppose the issuance of an order permitting the airstrip at Magnum's. Motion carried. Mr. Truninger was directed to draw up a resolution, copies of which are to be sent to Mr. Janurra of the Forest Preserve and to Mr. L. Knouff.

Mr. McLaughlin asked that the question of the Sally Row property be referred to the Plan Commission. Mr. Lynn Christianson's plans for a subdivision on Hawthorne Lane were also referred to the Plan Commission.

Mr. M. A. Thompson's petition has been referred to the Zoning Board of Appeals for action.

Mr. Ropollo, a contractor, would like clarification of the Zoning ordinance, Section 8-11-A restricting homes to 2,300 square feet on one acre lots. He is considering development of the Summit Subdivision, just east of Barrington Bourne. The letter was referred to Mr. Truninger for action.

At this time, Mr. Fentress brought up the Duchossois situation. Mr. Duchossois is ready to join the Village as soon as the Board resolves the issue of the use to which he plans to put his property. Counsel was asked to check into the question.

Health: No report.

Law: No report.

Plan Commission: Mr. McLaughlin, Mr. Tucker and Mr. Truninger are meeting to gather more information on the bonding power of the Village and also the taxing power of the Village.

Mr. Delmar Olsen has been appointed to fill the unexpired term of Mr. James Reynolds, who moved away.

There being no further business, President Hayward wished everyone a Merry Christmas and adjourned the meeting.
