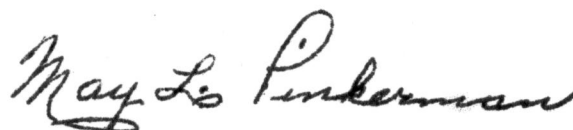
MEETING CALLED TO ORDER by President John H. D. Blanke.

PRESENT AT ROLL CALL WERE Trustees David R. Capulli, Paul J. Shultz, J. Frank Wyatt, Frederick J. Voss, James F. Hollister, Earl M. Schwemm. Also present: May L. Pinkerman, Secretary; R. D. Heninger, Village Manager; B. J. Zelsdorf, Finance Director; J. William Braithwaite, Legal Consultant.

Village Manager Heninger asked that 2 bills be added to the Board of Local Improvements list of bills: Consoer, Townsend & Assoc. \$3733.26 and King, Robin, Gale & Pillinger \$1058.99, making a grand total of \$23,987.60; payments to be made by vouchers. MOTION Trustee Wyatt to approve 4 bills in amount of \$23,987.60, with respect to special assessment #75; bills from Vincent DiVito to be subject to receipt of waivers of lien to be approved by the Legal Consultant as to legality; 2nd Trustee Voss.

President Blanke reminded there was to be a supplemental assessment and it was explained by Attorney Braithwaite that only one supplemental is allowed and it had been thought best to wait in case there were any other adjustments to be made; also that where property in that area is to change hands an amount could be placed in escrow for a few months. President asked Legal Consultant for a letter stating that necessary vouchers may be signed by President and Clerk when prepared. Above Motion withdrawn and reworded: MOTION Trustee Wyatt that the Board of Local Improvements approve and direct issuance of four vouchers for bills as presented on the amended list of bills in the amount of \$23,987.60, with respect to special assessment #75 and that bill from Vincent DiVito be subject to receipt of waivers of lien to be approved by the Legal Consultant as to form and legality; 2nd Trustee Voss. Roll call- Ayes: Capulli, Shultz, Wyatt, Voss, Hollister, Schwemm.

MEETING CALLED TO ORDER by President John H. D. Blanke at 10:00 A.M.  
Present at roll call: Trustees David R. Capulli, Paul J. Shultz, J. Frank Wyatt, Frederick J. Voss, James F. Hollister, Earl M. Schwemm. Also present: Ruth D. Kincaid, Deputy Clerk; R. D. Heninger, Village Manager.

President Blanke stated this meeting was adjourned from 1-27-69 for the purpose of taking action on the proposed sign of the Chicken Unlimited which was in question because of the difference in footage required by the sign ordinance.

CHICKEN UNLIMITED: Discussion had on the report from the Village Manager, dated 1-30-69, which gave the square footage of business signs on Northwest Highway from Main Street north and west. MOTION Trustee Wyatt that the Board concur in the recommendations of the Zoning Board of Appeals, dated 1-27-69; 2nd Trustee Voss. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, Shultz, Wyatt, Voss, Hollister, Schwemm. Trustee Schwemm made several comments on the flashing on signs, additional small signs attached to existing large signs, pennants, etc. along the Northwest Highway. Also some discussion on the many small signs displayed at gas stations and the overhanging signs in the downtown area. Trustee Wyatt suggested that the present sign ordinance be enforced for the time being rather than amending it. MOTION Trustee Voss that the Building Inspector be directed to issue a permit to the Chicken Unlimited for a sign with the flashing device eliminated; 2nd Trustee Hollister. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, Shultz, Wyatt, Voss, Hollister, Schwemm.

YOUNT FORD LIGHTING MATTER: Village Manager stated that the Schaeffer Electric Co. had been contacted for a meeting on 1-30-69; representative did not appear. Also the Director of Public Works was ill; no opportunity to check candlepower used on lights and signs at the Chicago Aerial Industries. MOTION Trustee Wyatt that we authorize and direct our Legal Counsel to prepare legal papers necessary to ~~file an injunction~~ against the Ford Leasing Co. so that they are made to conform with the Declaration of Restrictions between the Ford Leasing Co. and the Village of Barrington; 2nd Trustee Voss. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, Shultz, Wyatt, Voss, Hollister, Schwemm.

VOUCHER #4 - SPECIAL ASSESSMENT #75: President Blanke stated that at the last meeting the Board had approved to issue four vouchers for bills, in the amount of \$23,987.60, with respect to Special Assessment #75. In checking, he stated that he found Voucher 4 in error because only one county was made a part of it; both Cook and Lake Counties should have appeared on it. It was suggested that the Legal Counsel should be contacted and the error be corrected if this should be the case.

WHITNEY PETITION FOR ANNEXATION: Village Manager had no report to make on this matter after giving a few comments.

APPRAISAL - RICHARD WANN PROPERTY: Village Manager mailed a memo, dated 1-29-69, to the members of the Board regarding the Richard Wann property appraisal made by Coats and Burchard Company. MOTION Trustee Wyatt that the Village Manager be directed to negotiate the purchase of this land according to his memo of 1-29-69; 2nd Trustee Voss. Roll call-Ayes: Capulli, Shultz, Wyatt, Voss, Hollister, Schwemm.

Mr. Arthur Rice, Cuba Road, Barrington commended the Board as to the action they took regarding the lighting at the Yount Ford Co. He thought it to be an intelligent approach to the matter.

As requested, we hereby offer to structure a financing program for the Village's Motor Vehicle Parking System and to use our best efforts to secure the private placement with an investor(s) of approximately \$200,000 Village of Barrington, Illinois (the "Village") Motor Vehicle Parking System Revenue Bonds, Series 1969 (the "Bonds") to finance site acquisition and improvement costs. The Bonds are to be offered at a price of par (100% of their principal value) plus accrued interest to the date of delivery of the bonds, substantially in accordance with the following terms and conditions:

1. The Bonds shall be dated April 1, 1969, shall be in the denomination of \$5,000 each and shall bear interest payable October 1, 1969 and semi-annually thereafter on each April 1 and October 1, both principal and interest to be payable at such bank or trust company as we may designate. The Bonds shall bear interest at a rate of 6% per annum and shall mature on April 1 each year as follows:

2. The Bonds maturing in the years 1970 through 1979, inclusive, shall not be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities. Bonds maturing in the years 1980 through 19\_\_\_\_, inclusive, shall be subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities on or after April 1, 1979 or on any interest payment date thereafter at the principal amount thereof plus accrued interest to the date of redemption.
3. The Bonds shall be authorized and secured by an ordinance drafted by Messrs. Chapman and Cutler, Chicago, Illinois, Bond Counsel, in form and content satisfactory to us and which shall provide that payment of the principal and interest on the Bonds shall constitute a first lien upon the net revenues of the Parking System.

The ordinance shall contain the usual provisions as to flow of funds and other covenants common to bond issues of this type and security.

4. The Bonds shall be accompanied at the time of their delivery by:

The Bonds shall be delivered at such bank or trust company or in our Chicago, Illinois offices as we designate on or before May 1, 1969, or such other place or later date as may be necessary and is approved by us in writing.

5. Incident to this transaction, we agree to pay the cost of the preparation and printing of the Official Statement and our out-of-pocket expenses. All other costs incidental to this financing, including the printing of the Bonds, legal expenses, and delivery expenses shall be paid by the Village.
6. Upon our successfully arranging with an investor(s) for the placement of the Bonds, we shall so notify the Village and the delivery of the Bonds shall be scheduled. In consideration for our services in structuring the financing program and successfully placing the Bonds, the Village agrees to pay us a fee of 2.5% of the principal amount of the Bonds at the closing. If for any reason the Bonds are not issued, the Village will not be liable to us for any fees for our services rendered or in reimbursement for our out-of-pocket expenses.

Your approval and acceptance of this offer as evidenced by your execution of the acceptance clause below shall cause this to constitute an agreement and contract for the placement of the Bonds herein described, subject to and in accordance with the terms and conditions herein outlined and established. This agreement shall be in effect for a period of six months from its date of acceptance and shall be automatically extended

from month to month thereafter for such period of time as is necessary to complete this financing, unless terminated after the end of such six-month period by either party upon 30 days' written notice to the other.

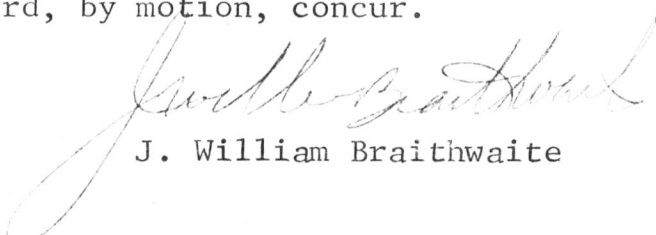

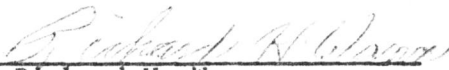

2. General household trash and refuse, including ashes, empty cartons, crates, boxes, wrapping materials, newspapers and magazines when securely and neatly bound in convenient size bundles, cloth materials, empty cans, discarded toys, discarded clothing and similar materials.
3. Discarded furniture including beds, springs, mattresses, overstuffed furniture and other furniture, appliances, bicycles, sleds, swing sets, tools and comparable items.
4. Yard refuse materials, including grass clippings, weeds, Christmas trees, bushes, brush clippings and branch clippings (when securely bound in bundles not exceeding four feet in length).

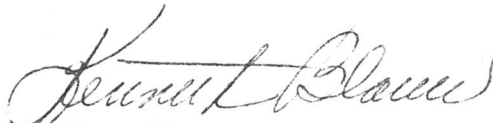

SUBJECT: East Hillside Avenue

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The maintenance and repair of Hillside Avenue is shared by the State of Illinois and the County of Cook. The State responsibility begins at Northwest Highway and ends at Prairie Avenue; from there on it is Cook County's responsibility.

The problem on East Hillside is not new to my office and I have been in contact with the State for over a year. I am now informed the State will give priority to the following:

1. Rough Road signs will be installed until the road can be repaired.
2. Class A type barricades will be installed.
3. Guardrails will be installed.
4. Curve, arrow and other signs required will be installed.
5. Overhead lighting will be provided.

It has been requested that proper storm drainage on the north side of Hillside Avenue be provided by the Village. I have asked our Director of Public Works to investigate this problem and provide my office with his recommendations.
