Dear Mr. Heninger:

This report has, for the most part, been based on a series of flow observations made in the sewers after a reasonable amount of rainfall. Naturally, such a procedure involved several unavoidable delays in the progress of our studies. We endeavored to keep these delays to a minimum by resuming our studies as quickly as possible after each set of observations. Sometimes this was difficult and, despite our best efforts, the studies have taken longer than we anticipated ourselves at the beginning.

As of our last Interim Report of May 3, 1967, we had narrowed our investigation down to sections of the Liberty Street trunk sewer, the Jewel Park trunk sewer, the lateral sewers on Oak, Magnolia and Birch, and the Flint Creek crossings on Birch, Elm, Hough and the E. J. & E. Railroad. In accordance with our recommendation, the Village retained National Power Rodding Corporation to make a closed circuit television inspection and report on the condition of these sewers. Our Mr. James Casey was present during the entire inspection.

We have studied National's report of September, 1967, which we received on November 6, 1967. A copy is enclosed. Our observations are generally as follows:

1. The cast iron pipe sections of the Flint Creek crossings on Birch, Elm, Hough and the E. J. & E. railroad appear to be in good condition, and apparently contribute little infiltration.

2. The first section of the Hough Street sewer, both north and south of the cast iron pipe section under Flint Creek, is in very poor condition with roots and observable infiltration at many joints, but only one slightly cracked tile.
3. The Liberty Street trunk has roots at many joints throughout the length inspected. There are a few cracked tiles and bad service connections evidenced by root intrusion.
4. The Jewel Park trunk has many wide and offset joints, a few cracked pipe sections and only one section with heavy root intrusion.
5. The Oak, Magnolia and Birch Road Sewers are in poor condition with a combination of root intrusion, cracked pipe and wide and displaced joints. The Magnolia Road sewer between Linden and Roslyn Roads is in exceptionally poor condition. The television inspection confirmed our suspicion that this section is a major source of storm water infiltration.

The inspection did not, as we had hoped, pinpoint conclusively locations of direct surface water entrance through direction connection, badly broken pipe or other obvious structural shortcomings, which could be considered as the primary causes for an increase in flow at the treatment plant soon after a rainfall. The inspection did, however, indicate that continuing heavy flow at the plant after rainfalls is probably due to the accumulated flow of infiltration at a substantial number of open and root infested joints. This condition probably extends well beyond the limits of the actual inspection.

Our conclusions and recommendations are summarized as follows:

1. The Village should establish a program of inspecting, adjusting, repairing and sealing all manholes and frames and covers which are potential or actual points of surface water entrance. We pointed out specific manholes in this category in our May 3rd Interim Report which we believe have been corrected. We therefore recommend that the Public Works Department be provided with personnel and equipment to establish a systematic and continuing program of sanitary sewer manhole inspection and repair.
2. The Village should continue to make every effort to eliminate downspout connections to the sanitary sewer. Although, in the inspection, we did not observe such connections, we cannot help but feel that they exist in the system.
3. We recommend that the 8 inch sewer on Magnolia Road between Linden and Roslyn Roads be replaced as soon as possible in accordance with the sketch attached hereto. We estimate the cost of replacement at approximately \$4,800.00.
4. We recommend that the Village undertake a program of sealing internally the sewer joints within the system which appear to be potential points of infiltration. Such a program should be started by sealing the suspected joints indicated by National's television inspection. After this is done, additional flow observations should be made, as weather permits, to determine the effects of sealing and determine locations for further sealing.

We have come to the conclusion that the solution to the infiltration problem is a continued program of inspections, repairs, flow observations and joint sealing until a desired result has been obtained. This would require, in addition to local flow tests, continued observations and accurate readings of the flow rates at key locations along the main collector sewers and at the treatment plant. This program would, of course, require the Village to appropriate annually a reasonable amount to cover the costs of continuous joint sealing as well as other remedies that, from time to time, prove advisable.

In view of our recommendation in paragraph 4 above, we have taken the liberty of obtaining proposals, copies of which are enclosed, from Video Pipe Grouting, Inc., a Division of National Power Rodding Corporation, for pressure sealing the joints in the sewers already televised. The Alternate No. 1 Proposal, in the amount of \$16,475.00, is for grouting 396 joints which were exposed by the television inspection as potential points of infiltration. The Alternate No. 2 Proposal, in the amount of \$48,539.13, is for pressure testing and sealing all joints throughout the entire length of the sewer televised.

We have not had direct experience with this method of joint grouting, but it appears to have a great deal of merit. We are enclosing a letter from Video in which they have listed, for reference, clients they have served in the Chicago area.

Our recommendation under paragraph 4 above does not include the acceptance of the proposal in its present form. Both alternates, you will note, are in a lump sum amount. If the Village elects to consider this recommendation, we believe that other forms of proposals should be discussed with Video.

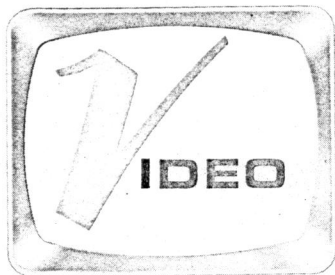
You will note that the television inspection located cracked pipes and bad service connections as evidenced by root intrusion. Except for the sewer in Magnolia Road between Linden and Roslyn Roads, the pipe cracking is not extensive in any one location, nor has the cracked pipe been appreciably displaced. The bad service connections are also not extensive. Although an accurate and permanent record of these locations should be preserved, we believe that no corrective measures need be taken at this time.

After you have had the opportunity to read and study this report, we will be happy to attend a meeting at your convenience to discuss its contents.

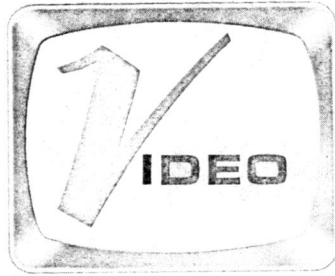

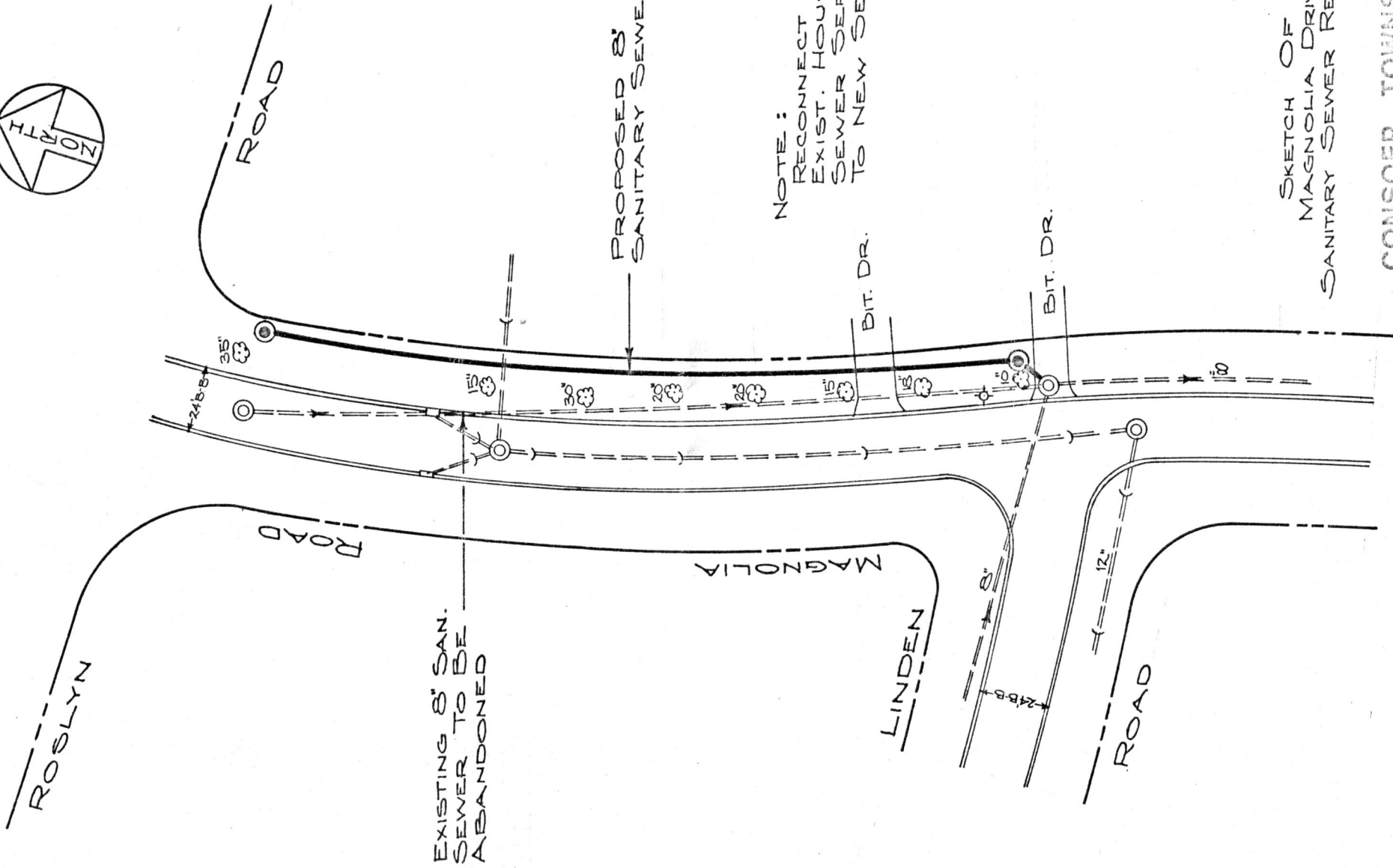



I have investigated an Escrow Account No. 286209 with the Chicago Title and Trust Company in the amount of \$158,250.00. Apparently this account was established by a William W. Brough, developer of Pickwick Place. I am attaching a copy of escrow ledger card Number 286209 for your perusal and file, which, in my opinion, never established a separate escrow account in the amount of \$12,132.50 provided for in Resolution 207-1. This entire transaction is new to me and, of course, I do not have all the background nor file material.

Records in my office do indicate that \$3,265.00 was released by the Village on December 14, 1965 for accepted improvements and \$575.00 was released on July 13, 1966 for accepted tree plantings, both payable to or released to Mr. William Brough, leaving a balance of \$8,292.50. I also find a copy of a letter dated February 28, 1967 whereby the Village demanded this balance be released to them for correcting the deficient improvements in Pickwick Place. However, my file ends here and I do not know if the Village received said amount. An examination of our audit does not show a credit of this amount. From this information I would assume there is a balance in escrow No. 286209 of \$5,115.00 as per ledger card. The remainder, or \$3,177.50 in a title indemnity account with Chicago Title and Trust Company.

The last piece of correspondence I have (a copy also attached) is dated September 20, 1967 and speaks of placing additional funds in escrow to a total amount of \$12,200.00. From here I will have to check the minutes of your meetings in order to determine if the Board approved of this so-called plan "B". I also find where the escrow agreement would be amended in order to give control of the disbursements to the Village. Apparently, this may be one of the fallacies of this so-called escrow fund covering the development of Pickwick Place. Thanks for furnishing me a copy of minutes of October 2, 1967 relative to Plan "B". I now know your wishes. Also, I will not enclose a copy of the letter dated September 20, 1967 referred to above as I note you already have it from the reference material you mailed me.

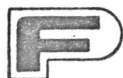


Dear Mr. Johanesen:

I have conferred with our engineering department and have some suggestions for correcting the flow recorder problems in your North Pumping Station.

Air in the impulse lines to the differential pressure cell seems to be the main problem. This can be minimized, if not eliminated, by moving the pressure taps in the main from the top of the pipe to the side. Moving the differential pressure cell from the main floor to the lower level will also help, but may not be necessary if the relocation of the pressure taps rectifies the situation.

Attached you will find a sketch showing the existing piping arrangement and our suggested one. If you have any questions, please call me.



STENOGRAPHIC REPORT of a Public Hearing held before the Plan Commission of Barrington, in the Village Chambers, on December 13, 1967, at 8:00 PM, on the petition of the R. Kennedy Development Company. Meeting having been published in the November 23, 1967 issue of the Courier-Review.

MR. HARTLAUB: This is a hearing of the Barrington Plan Commission held pursuant to the petition of R. Kennedy Development Company, to annex .723 acres, and upon annexation to zone R-5, One Family Dwelling District. This is a corner of the Village Church property, which is being added to the Kennedy area to relocate certain lots and a roadway due to the proximity of a peat bed area which will not support the roadway.

Mr. Kennedy is not present tonight, but did call and indicate that he had not been made aware of the hearing earlier enough and asked if it was necessary for him to be present. I told him we would proceed without his presence and if questions arose that required his answers we would continue the hearing. There is no one in the audience this evening. We will proceed with the information shown in the petition. We have a plat of survey and title plat of first division of Fox Point.

This concerns a small triangular piece which will be used to support the area requirements for Lots 623, 624, 680 and 681.

MR. WOLLAR: This is so small it has no bearing on the large area, which I am concerned about and will bring up at another time. I see no problems about this.

MR. HARTLAUB: It is noted for the record that the two copies of the petition presented to the Commission bear no dates or signatures. The hearing is held and proceeds on the assumption that the Village Clerk has a properly executed copy on file.

MR. WOOD: I move that we recommend the petition be granted, seconded by Wollar.

MR. HARTLAUB: All those in favor signify by Ayes. Roll call showed an unanimous vote to grant the petition.



## Ordinance Number 1003

### (VILLAGE CODE AMENDMENT)

#### ORDINANCE NO. 1003

#### AN ORDINANCE AMENDING PORTIONS OF CHAPTER 24 OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF BARRINGTON OF 1957

WHEREAS the Corporate Authorities of the Village of Barrington have received advice from the consulting engineers of the Village of Barrington that existing charges relative to water and sewers and existing connection charges are inadequate to provide revenue for facilities required by this municipality; and

WHEREAS the Corporate Authorities have considered, evaluated and thoroughly discussed the detailed reports of the said consulting engineers;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees of the Village of Barrington, Cook and Lake Counties, Illinois, that:

SECTION 1. Section 24.105 of Article I of Chapter 24 of the Municipal Code of Barrington of 1957, as amended, is hereby further amended to provide as follows:

"24.105 Connections. No connection with a water main or sewage main shall be made without a permit being issued and 24 hours notice having been given to the Superintendent of Public Works. All such connections shall be made under the supervision of said superintendent, and no connection shall be covered until the work has been inspected by him.

"Every lot or combination of lots used or to be used for one purpose and each other tract or parcel of land hereafter connected to any sewer or water main in this municipality, so as to receive service from or through such main, shall be so connected only after there has been paid to this municipality the sum of \$200.00 for each such water connection and the further sum of \$150.00 for each such sewer connection, where any such connection is to serve a single-family residence. If such connection to any sewer or water main shall be to serve a dwelling building designed for or containing more than one family, the above prescribed rates for a single-family dwelling shall be applicable for each dwelling unit in said building containing more than one family, so that the connection fee shall be the result of multiplying the number of dwelling units by the above connection charges for water or sewer (as the case may be) applicable to a single-family dwelling.

"No tract of land zoned under any of the business or manufacturing classifications of the municipality shall be connected with any sewer or water main

so as to receive service therefrom unless there shall first be paid to the municipality the following charges:

(a) For each such sewer connection, \$100.00 for each acre of said tract or fraction thereof, plus \$50.00 for each inch in diameter or fraction thereof of the sewer pipe serving the property measured at the point of connection with the Village sewer main;

(b) For each such water connection, \$100.00 per acre of said tract or fraction thereof, plus \$200.00 for each inch in diameter or fraction thereof of the water pipe serving the property at the point of connection with the Village water main.

"The above prescribed connection fees shall be paid for connection of any property within or without the municipality. As said water and sewer connection charges are in consideration of the availability and existence of a total combined water and sewer system, such charges shall be in addition to any charges which the owner of property may have to pay or may have paid for the installation of sewers or water mains to serve his property or by way of any charge which the owner may have to make to the Village to compensate any other person for water and sewer mains installed in contemplation of serving said owner's property, commonly referred to as a 'recapture charge.'

"The connection fees provided for herein shall not affect or repeal any specific written valid arrangement of the payment of such connection fees for the connection of specific properties."

SECTION 2. Section 24.301 of Article III of Chapter 24 of the Municipal Code of Barrington of 1957, is hereby amended to provide as follows:

"24.301 Meters; Rates. All premises using water from the Village water supply must be supplied with an adequate water meter approved by the Superintendent of Public Works and furnished by the property owner. In the case of any building hereafter constructed containing more than one dwelling unit, a water meter must be supplied for each such dwelling unit.

"Not later than March 31, 1968 there shall be installed at all premises connected to the Village sewer system utilizing private wells as a source of water supply, whether as a sole source of supply or as an auxiliary source, at the expense of the owner or user, either of the following, at the option of the owner or user:

(a) A water meter approved by the Superintendent of Pub-

lic Works to measure water which will be discharged into the Village sewer system; or

(b) A sewage flow meter approved by the Superintendent of Public Works to measure the flow of sewage into the Village sewage system.

Such water or sewage flow meter shall be required in all future connections to the Village sewer system of premises served by a private well. All such meters shall be maintained in good working order by the owner or occupant of the premises.

SECTION 3. Section 24.304 of Article III of Chapter 24 of the Municipal Code of Barrington of 1957, as amended, is hereby further amended to provide as follows:

"24.304 Water Rates. The charge to be paid by every person using water from the Village water system shall be computed on the basis of the total water furnished in each quarterly period by the Village to the premises served and shall be as follows, per quarter: For the first 5,000 gallons or fraction thereof . . . \$4.50. For each additional 1,000 gallons over 5,000 gallons but not in excess of 20,000 gallons, an additional 40c per 1,000 gallons. For each additional 1,000 gallons over 20,000 gallons, 35c per 1,000 gallons.

"In the case of any building containing more than one dwelling unit where there are not separate water meters for each dwelling unit, the total amount of water used for any two or more dwelling units served by one meter shall be divided by the number of dwelling units in said building and the rate above provided shall be applied as if each said dwelling unit had a separate meter and were using an equal amount of water; for example, if a building containing four dwelling units uses 80,000 gallons of water in a quarter, the bill for said building shall be computed on the basis of four 20,000 gallon units of usage and the water bill shall be \$10.50 times the four units, or a total bill of \$42.00. The provisions of this paragraph are not in derogation of the requirements of Section 24.301 of this Article III that separate water meters hereafter be installed for each dwelling unit in buildings containing more than one dwelling unit."

SECTION 4. Section 24.305 of Article III of Chapter 24 of the Municipal Code of Barrington is amended to provide as follows:

"24.305 Sewer Rates. Each person using the Village sewer system shall pay quarterly, a charge, based upon the amount

of Village supplied water used, which shall be equal to and in addition to the water rates provided in Section 24.304 of the Municipal Code of Barrington, as amended.

"The owner or occupant of premises connected to the Village sewer system using one or more private wells as a source of water shall pay the same sewer rate, based upon the gallons of water and sewage discharged, that would be charged if only Village water were being supplied to the premises. Until one of the meters required by Section 24.301 of this Article III has been provided, or until March 31, 1968, whichever is earlier, the quarterly charge for such premises shall be \$3.75.

"If any property is connected to the Village sewer system but does not, within any quarter, use any Village water or discharge any water or sewage into the sewage system, there shall be a minimum quarterly charge of \$4.50."

SECTION 5. Sections 24.306 and 24.307 of Article III of Chapter 24 of the Municipal Code of Barrington of 1957, as amended, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. Section 24.308 of Article III of Chapter 24 of the Municipal Code of Barrington of 1957 is hereby amended to provide as follows:

"24.308 Bills. Bills for water and sewer service shall be dated and sent on or about the first day of the month succeeding the period for which the service is billed and such bills shall be payable not later than fifteen (15) days thereafter. After said fifteen (15) day period, a penalty of ten per centum (10%) of the amount of the bill, shall be collected, as part of said bill. For convenience in billing, the Village may be divided into districts, with a different quarterly billing period for each district."

SECTION 7. As a temporary measure the next few months of transition from the old to new rates, water and sewer charges billed after the effective date of this ordinance which include water provided and sewer service provided both before and after the effective date of this ordinance shall be equitably apportioned.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect on and after the first day of the month which next follows the date ten (10) days after publication of this ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED by the President and Board of Trustees  
of the Village of Barrington, Cook and Lake Counties, Illinois  
that:

Section 1. Section 4.908 of the Municipal Code of  
Barrington of 1957 be and the same is hereby amended to provide  
as follows:

"4.908 Purchases and Other Expenditures. The  
manager shall be purchasing agent for the village  
and shall make all purchases and other expenditures  
authorized by the appropriation ordinance then in  
effect; provided that all purchases and other ex-  
penditures over \$500.00 first shall be authorized  
by the corporate authorities, unless otherwise  
provided by said corporate authorities.

The Village Manager is authorized to engage  
the services of the Village Engineers, Village  
Attorney or other consultants for any matter that  
will create an obligation for such services not  
exceeding \$500.00, without prior approval of the  
Corporate Authorities.

Provided that no purchase of any article or  
commodity to cost more than five hundred dollars  
shall be made, except in case of emergency, or  
except with specific approval of the board of  
trustees, unless bids have been asked from two or  
more sellers of such article or commodity, or by  
advertising in a newspaper in the village.

Specifications for such bids shall be available  
to all prospective bidders, and at least ten days  
shall elapse between the time of requesting or ad-  
vertising for bids and the time specified for sub-  
mitting bids to the village."

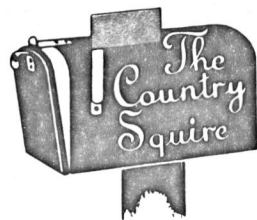
After conversing with Mr. Braithwaite it was decided to obtain two independent appraisals on this property in order to determine a fair market value on the property to present a counter-offer.

On Saturday, December 16, 1967, Messrs. Tom Regan and Fred Bock visited the manager's office relative to the future plan of the village and what is eventually going to happen to subject described area. These gentlemen informed me that they have previously spoken to Mayor Blanke and Trustee Capulli but to date no definite information nor future plan has been disclosed to them. I further understand that there is about a four block section in this area that is subject to flooding and holding stagnant water which gives the Mosquito Abatement District a number of problems in the summer months.

I also have a letter from Mr. Albert Mattio, 827 S. Hough Street, complaining about his septic tank and odors which are prevalent in his area and I am attaching a copy of his letter for your information.

We have been in touch with Mr. W. R. Mitchell of the Northwest Mosquito Abatement District who has located a ten-inch tile that begins in the Harvard, Division, Princeton and Summit Street area and drains southwesterly to Keene Lake. Mr. Mitchell is of the opinion this tile has been broken in several spots and that is one of the reasons for causing pockets and ponding of water in the area. The Sidwell Studios at West Chicago have aerial maps that can be used as an overlay to help locate these tiles and if they are proven of benefit to us we might obtain same for this area.

We discussed the possibility that, if in the development of Southgate, certain provisions could be made for sewer and water connections, this then may provide for the answers to these services. If, in the future, the citizens in this area indicate that they wish to annex to the village, I believe a thorough engineering study of the area would have to be made. I do sympa-

thize with these people as they are surrounded on three sides by the village and apparently suffer some undesirable problems.

They indicated their willingness to meet with the elected officials at their convenience to exchange ideas and what, if anything, can be done in the future to maintain this area as a desirable area to live in.

I would appreciate your thoughts and suggestions you may have individually or collectively on this matter and what direction we might go in the future insofar as this area is concerned.

## Suburbs Denied Authority to Hire Them

What is the most lawful job you can think of? Being a policeman? Guess again. Many Illinois policemen are themselves in questionable legal standing, according to a recent Illinois Appellate court decision.

Under the ruling, it is illegal for Illinois municipalities of more than 5,000 population to hire auxiliary policemen, said Dean Sodaro, legal aid to Sheriff Joseph I. Woods.

### May Affect All

The decision, handed down by Judge Arthur Murphy, casts a shadow over thousands of policemen who work part time for such cities, towns, and villages thruout the state. Interpretation of the ruling might even be expanded to apply to all Illinois municipalities, regardless of size.

A survey of 100 Chicago area municipalities has revealed that 1,020 police officers work on a part time basis, or almost half the total force of 2,259. It is estimated that thousands more are employed in hundreds of downstate cities and villages.

Legal authorities believe Illinois municipalities could be forced to discharge their auxiliary officers, drastically cutting their manpower, if the legal point is pressed. Then, only a successful appeal to a higher court or new legislation could restore the part time policemen.

### Village Fires Cops

The question arose when the village of Justice discharged its police chief, Mirko Gasparas, and six patrolmen when the town reached a population of 5,000 and came under the Illinois board of fire and police commissioners act.

Gasparas and the six part time policemen sought a court order requiring the village and the fire and police board to grant each of them civil service status.

But Judge Charles Dougherty of Circuit court, while granting Gasparas' demand, held that the patrolmen were part time officers and not subject to the same protection as full time policemen under Illinois law.

### Decision Is Upheld

Judge Murphy, in upholding Judge Dougherty's position, also ruled that "altho there are statutory references to part time policemen, the references are generally of an exclusionary nature.

"Nowhere is there any specific authority or designation for the appointment of a part time policeman. The statutes indicate the legislators were aware of the practices of municipalities using part time policemen, but it is obvious that at no time was there any intention of authorizing or legalizing such a status."

Sheriff Woods predicted the decision will have far reaching effects on police manpower in Cook county suburbs. He said he expected his office to be called upon more often by suburban communities because of the apparent ban on part time police officers. He made the remarks in seeking an additional 201 policemen for his department in an appearance before the Circuit court's committee on help.

### Do Much Work

Auxiliary patrolmen in small cities and villages have been performing a variety of functions. They handle the policing of parking meters, directing

traffic, and working on special events. But they also fill in for regular officers on patrol in squad cars, carrying guns and making arrests.
