

"Going Places" at Barrington **Area Historical Society**

These forerunners of automobiles and trucks were absolutely essential to American life in the 1800s. Carriages came in an amazing assortment of sizes, shapes, and finishes, from the buckboard phaeton to the sidebar buggy to the booby hut.

Visitors to Barrington Area Historical Society will experience diverse artifactsincluding a full-sized carriage, children's carriages, and assorted harnesses and tack -that speak volumes about our insatiable desire for travel, speed and new technology. The exhibition also covers a broad range of questions: How were carriages made and repaired? Where were they sold, and who could afford them? The answers are surprising, and frequent parallels to today's car culture make "Going Places" a fascinating journey.

"Going Places" explores the culture, evolution and eventual demise of horse-

Carriages—not cars—once ruled the road. drawn transportation, form the early 19th century, through the industrial revolution, and into the 1900s and the dawn of the automobile age.

The exhibition at the Barrington Area Historical Society will run through Aug.

"Going Places" was curated by William F. Illinois Appellate Court Refuses to Enforce Restrictive Agreement by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

Recently an Illinois Appellate Court found that an employment agreement which restricted the ability of the employee to solicit customers of the employer postemployment, was not enforceable due to a lack of adequate consideration even though it was signed at the time the employee was hired. In that case, the company required newly hired employees to sign a non-solicitation agreement in exchange for employment. The agreement prohibited employees from soliciting, diverting, accepting or servicing customers for a two-year period following termination. An employee that signed the agreement decided to voluntarily resign seven months later and join a competing company. Her former employer filed suit against her for violating the restrictive covenant. The Court held that such a short period of time of continued employment is not sufficient consideration under Illinois law to support the restrictive covenant. The Court also held that even though the employee resigned but was not terminated, it was irrelevant in determining enforcement. Due to the departure from accepted Illinois law, the dissenting opinion stated that the Illinois Supreme Court has made it clear that continued employment is adequate consideration sufficient to make a restrictive covenant enforceable and as such, the dissenting judges thought that seven months of continued employ- tional Employment Lawyers Association.




ment was sufficient consideration to support the restrictive agreement. Accordingly, under this majority analysis some consideration other than continued employment would be required by the employer to ensure the enforcement of a non-compete or non-solicitation agree-

Early pewter contained lead, but all of our products are LEAD-FREE, as required by the U.S. government. Pewter does not tarnish, however, over time it will patina, or darken in color. This unique aging is what endears many people to pewter. Its original luster may be preserved with the finest steel wool and a gritty toothpaste. There is something incredibly special about a metal (pewter) that has been in constant use by countless civilizations (including the ancient Chinese and Egyptians) for the past 2000 years. In 18th century America, pewter tankards, plates, and other serving ware were a vital part of most households and taverns. Tin Woodsman measuring pieces are designed to be used. They are accurate for both liquids and solids. However, please restrict your usage to scooping and measuring and never use them over any type of heat source. Pewter is dishwasher safe, however, this will speed the darkening process. Hard water and certain detergents may dull the finish over time.

Healthy Pregnancy

Many women become more interested in their health once they find out that they are pregnant. However, the foundation for a healthy pregnancy begins before conception. All women, who are thinking about becoming pregnant, should see their health care provider to gain some insights into nutrition, vitamin supplements, exercise and laboratory testing, which can ensure a successful pregnancy.

Women who are planning pregnancy and who are pregnant should choose a well-balanced diet to get the essential nutrients they need each day. Women need several servings of protein-rich foods (meats, poultry, fish and eggs), grains, calcium-rich foods, vegetables and fruits per day. Women also need adequate fluid intake; eight or more 8-ounce servings per day. Women who are vegetarian may need to take additional supplements. The recommended weight gain in pregnancy is normally between 25 to 35 pounds. Women who are underweight may need to gain a little more and women, who are overweight, should limit weight gain to 15 to 20 pounds.

Women often have questions concerning the safety of certain foods in pregnancy. Caffeine can be consumed in moderation, as studies have not shown that it causes birth defects. Artificial sweeteners, such as aspartame and Splenda, are also acceptable. Certain fish, such as swordfish, should be avoided because of high



A prenatal vitamin, which contains folic acid, is essential to a healthy pregnancy. Many studies have shown that folic acid reduces the risk of a baby developing a type of birth defect called a neural tube defect.

Unhealthy behaviors, such as smoking, alcohol or drug use, should ideally be addressed before conception. Pregnant women are advised to avoid alcohol because this has been linked to learning disabilities and birth defects in babies. Smoking can lead to poor fetal growth, preterm birth and sudden infant death syndrome.

Most women can continue to exercise in pregnancy. In fact, this may benefit the health of both the mother and the fetus. Women who maintain a fitness program have decreased weight gain and fat deposition during pregnancy and an improved sense of well-being. They may also have

Dancing Stallions Celebrate 50 Years in America

Tempel Lipizzans Launch Anniversary Performance Season, Now through Aug. 31



The Tempel Lipizzan stallions will perform breathtaking Pegasus-like leaps called "Airs Above the Ground" during a special anniversary performance season, now through Aug. 31.

The Chicago area's own "dancing" white Tempel Lipizzan stallions will celebrate 50 years in America with summer performances through Aug. 31. Performances will be held at Tempel Farms in far north suburban Old Mill Creek, Ill., every Wednesday at 10:30 a.m. and Sundays at 1 p.m., through Aug. 31.

Tempel Farms, recently selected as the site for equestrian events in Chicago's 2016 Olympics bid, is the only place in the United States where rare Lipizzan horses are bred, trained and perform on the same property. Each summer, visitors from around the world travel to Tempel Farms to enjoy Lipizzan "horse ballets," similar to those that entertained European royalty during the late Renaissance.

Among the highlights of the hour-and-20-minute Tempel Lipizzan performance are dramatic Pegasus-like leaps and lifts known as "Airs Above the Ground." Lipizzans are one of very few breeds that possess the combination of physical power and suppleness to perform these seemingly gravity-defying moves, which were originally used as medieval battle maneuvers.

It was during a visit to Vienna's famed Spanish Riding School in 1957 that the late Tempel Smith, owner of Chicago's Tempel Steel Company, and his wife, Esther, first encountered the magnificent Lipizzans. The performance inspired Smith. He had a vision of establishing an American performing arts center in the tradition of the Vienna's Spanish Riding School. Following a year of sensitive negotiations with the Austrian government, the Smiths received clearance to import their first 20 Lipizzans. Over the past 50 years, nearly 900 Lipizzan horses have been born at Tempel Farms. About 80 of these rare horses reside on the property today.

Tempel Farms is located in northern Lake County, near Great America. Tickets, available at the gate, are priced at \$18 for adults, \$15 for senior citizens and \$10 for children, ages 4 to 14. Veterans and active military personnel with identification receive half-priced admission. In case of inclement weather, performances are held indoors. Parking is free. 

What Makes a Good Facelift?

How does the face age?

There are essentially three ways the human face ages. Tissue elasticity deteriorates leading to tissue laxity and sagging, the deeper supporting tissues such as bone and fat shrink leading to deflation, and damage to the skin from exposure to ultraviolet light leads to photoaging with pigment changes and wrinkles. Different people age differently depending on their genetic predisposition and environmental factors. What procedure a patient chooses to refresh their appearance depends on their unique combination of aging factors. Most classic surgical procedures performed by plastic surgeons improve the signs of aging caused by laxity. Perhaps the best-known procedure to the public at large is the facelift.

What is a facelift?

The answer to that is both simple and complicated. A facelift seeks to improve the laxity of the cheeks and neck. But what exactly does that mean and why is there a common conception that facelifts make patients look unnaturally pulled? There is a layer just beneath the skin called the SMAS (superficial musculoaponeurotic system) that sags as we get older. This layer is a sheet of fibrous and muscular tissue that connects the skin to the muscles underneath. After a lifetime of muscle movement, the SMAS stretches out and sags with gravity. As it does, it pulls the skin down with it. In a well done facelift this layer is repositioned to where it was in youth. If a surgeon, through lack of experience or poor techniques, distorts

or pulls the SMAS in an unnatural direction, the results will not be good. Unfortunately, this is all too common. A well done facelift will give the patient a rejuvenated appearance without a pulled look.

There is another issue to understand about facelifts. The term facelift is rather general and can mean many different things. Calling a facelift a catchy name such as a "fast lift," "lunchtime lift," or a "you-name-it lift" does not make it a better lift. It just makes for better marketing. What's more, most of these gimmicky lifts have serious limitations in their results. So why do patient's fall for less effective procedures with impressive names? Because they believe the hype that they will get the same results with less recovery time from a simpler procedure. As usual, if it sounds too good to be true, it is too good to be true. So patients need to be educated and understand exactly what is being lifted, where the incisions will be placed, and talk to their surgeon, not a sales person.

Can a New Smile Make You Appear More Successful and Intelligent? New Research Says It Can. by James T. Gavrilos, D.D.S.



Two had mild improvements through cosmetic dentistry, two had moderate improvements and four had major improvements to their smiles, to give a wide range for respondents to view. 



Obviously a natural appearance is crucial. This is obtained by releasing the skin from the SMAS layer, repositioning the SMAS in the correct direction with the right amount of tension, and then re-draping the skin over the top. Excess skin is removed and the incisions closed meticulously. The location of the incision is critical, the tension on the skin is critical, and the degree of release is critical. Basically, every step is critical and the more experienced the surgeon is, the better. My incisions are designed to maintain natural hairlines and closed with tiny absorbable sutures.

A "face lift" lifts two anatomic regions, the neck and the cheek. While I can lift just one or the other of these in select

cases, most patients get far better results lifting both the cheek and neck together. I spend a great deal of time with each individual in the consultation going over the procedure in far greater detail than I can here. 

New Illinois Children's Eye Examination Law

Effective Jan. 1, 2008, the new Illinois Children's Eye Examination Law requires that all children, grades kindergarten and up, have an eye examination performed by a trained eye care professional, and submit a copy to the school no later than Oct. 15. This examination must be performed by a licensed optometrist or opthalmalogist; a screening performed at school by a nurse or even by a pediatrician is considered insufficient for meeting the requirements of the new law. The goals of this law are to maximize children's learning potential and behavioral development, and to establish a foundation for early intervention and treatment of eye diseases amongst children and adolescents.

These goals are based on extensive studies conducted by the Illinois Optometric Association, which found that 80 percent of a child's learning occurs visually, that one out of every four children have some type of visual disorder, and that more than 50 percent of students who are considered problem learners are living with some type of undetected visual problem. These facts demonstrate how closely interrelated vision and learning are among children. Therefore, by ensuring the early treatment of visual impairment, the state hopes to increase the success of learning within the classroom, decrease learning set backs-which could significantly affect your child's future, and increase the overall health of children's eyes.

Some red flags of vision disorders to

look out for are: frequent rubbing of the eyes, skipping words or getting lost in reading passages, difficulty completing assignments or detailed tasks such as coloring, below-average classroom performance, frequent headaches, red eyes or eye lids, holding books or papers very close or far from the face, and squinting. As stated earlier, however, most parents are unaware that their child is even experiencing a vision problem. To safeguard your child's education and health, and to meet the new state law requirements, schedule an eye exam for your child this summer.
