

The Boston Museum of Fine Art Exhibit Drawings from the Great Age of the American Automobile-1945 to 1975, sketches from the Jean S. And Frederic A. Sharf Collection, is now on display at The Barrington Area Historical Society, Old Barrington Center, 212 W. Main St., Barring-

The exhibit includes over 140 original drawings from the "Great Age of the American Automobile." The images comprising this exhibition showcase the beauty and ingenuity of American automotive design during the decades following World War II, a landmark period in car styling. Providing a rare glimpse into the creative process behind the scenes at some of Detroit's premiere car companies, they include an eclectic mix of illustrations, from preliminary sketches to fully rendered works intended for presentation to company executives. Some offer concepts

that would later be incorporated into specific models, while others represent fun or whimsical ideas that never made it past the drawing-board stage. Dating from an era when speed and power were increasingly important factors in automotive sales. one sees ample reference to the shapes of airplanes and rockets, along with other emerging technologies that influenced postwar car design. The exaggerated body contours, fenders, and chrome in these designs feel decidedly retro to us now, but in their time they were all about envisioning the future. As such, they offer engaging lessons in both industrial and graphic design, as well as a nostalgic look back from anyone who has ever succumbed to the lure of the great American automobile.

Court Holds Infertility Treatment Covered by Pregnancy Discrimination Act by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

The Pregnancy Discrimination Act (PDA) prevents discrimination based on a woman's pregnancy and childbirth, and medical conditions related to pregnancy or childbirth. Recently, the Seventh Circuit Court of Appeals held that an employee's allegation that she was terminated for undergoing vitro fertilization (IVF), stated a valid claim under the PDA. In that case, the employee sought leave from her employer to undergo IVF treatment which is a procedure that takes weeks to complete and often requires multiple treatments in order to produce a successful pregnancy. Because the first treatment was unsuccessful, several months after the employee returned from her initial leave, she made a second request for leave. At the time of her second request for leave, the company informed her that due to a corporate reorganization which required the consolidation of her position, she was being terminated. As a result of her termination, she filed suit alleging a violation of the Pregnancy Discrimination Act. The trial court dismissed the case ruling that infertility is a medical condition that afflicts both men and women, and could therefore not lead to a gender-based personnel decision. However, on appeal, the



Seventh Circuit reversed, finding that because the IVF treatment is only available to women, the decision was gender-based and therefore covered under by the PDA.

Citizens for Conservation (CFC) has joined with the Spring Creek Stewards (SCS) on a goal to collect enough prairie seed to cover 250 acres. According to CFC board member Tom Vanderpoel, "We've been nursing our woods and prairies back to good health for decades. Now we

So they've offered to share with the Spring Creek Stewards, who are working to restore a whopping 3,910 acres of the Spring Creek forest preserves in Barrington Hills. > The Spring Creek forest preserves are big and beautiful. More important, they have enough potential habitat for sustainable populations of many rare animals of the ancient prairies, oak forests, streams, ponds, and wetlands. Many pairs of sandhill cranes, least weasels, and other rare species already breed there, but all need more quality habitat. Acre by acre, CFC and SCS volunteers are nursing their preserves back to a healthy wild habitat, but the crying need is for rare local seed.


Around Thanksgiving, shelves of collected seed will be processed for sowing back to those 250 acres. Volunteers have a short opportunity to capture the millions of seed before they fall. One seed volunteer can collect enough seed for an acre over these next few weeks.

Every Thursday, Saturday, and Sunday, from now through October, local volunteers will gather seeds from over 140 different types of Illinois plants. People of all ages hunt through prairies for ripe seed produced by plants with names like rattlesnake master, compass plant, and turkey foot. It's not uncommon for one volunteer to collect literally tens of thousands of seeds in an hour or two-a huge contribution. Then in November, these

same volunteers will "broadcast" the rare seeds on land where brush has been cleared and weeds controlled.

"Community seed-gathering events are rewarding, inspiring, and fun," said hunter-gatherer Ryan White. "It's an ancient drama of reaping and sowing-an opportunity to get in touch with your inner past and really help the planet."

Volunteer groups meet at CFC headquarters across from Good Shepherd Hospital on Route 22. They start at 9 a.m. on Thursdays and Saturdays, and at 3:30 p.m. Sundays through the end of October. Check out www.CitizensforConservation. org for further details, or call Sam Oliver at 1-847-382-7283.

Without a doubt, one of the most frequently asked questions in a dental office concerns tooth whitening. Patients want to look their best, but with the tremendous amounts of advertising that bombards them, they turn to us for answers.

How does it work? All tooth-whitening procedures accomplish one thing: they penetrate the enamel with oxygen. The oxygen changes the way the enamel reflects light. Instead of absorbing some colors and reflecting the yellow ones out, it reflects all the colors out. White light in ...white light out! The tooth whitener's effectiveness is based on two thingsconcentration and duration.

Whitening toothpaste-with a low concentration of oxygen and a short duration, it is the least effective method for whitening. Rarely are the results reported as ac-

Over-the-counter whitening gels-better results than the toothpaste. Major problems in the past have been the ill-fitting mouth trays that can cause TMJ (bite/jaw) problems or can cause gum irritation because they hold the whitening gel up against the gum tissue.

Whitening strips—Crest introduced these and they eliminated the TMJ and gum irritation issue associated with the over-thecounter gels. The patient places the strips on their teeth so that minimal gel is touching the gums and the strip is so thin, it doesn't alter the bite enough to cause a TMJ problem. 


Professional tooth whitening-Dentists custom make trays that hold whitening gels against and in between the teeth. This method is very effective because the custom fabrication allows the tray to keep the gel off of the tissue and will cause no TMJ problems. The trays are worn for an hour during the day and in some cases can be worn at night. Most of the gels require two weeks to reach their full whitening potential. If your teeth start to stain again, you can reuse the trays and purchase additional gel to touch them up.

Laser tooth whitening-this method is just as effective as professional tooth whitening with custom trays but the advantage is time. In just about 90 minutes, your whitening is completely finished. The gels that are used for this process are so powerful that the gums must be isolated with special barriers. Bright lights help energize the gels and get the job done quickly. The cost is similar to that of the custom trays, but you cannot touch up after your teeth
