





"Chic Chicago: Couture Treasures from the Chicago History Museum"

More than 50 Couture Pieces Provide an Intimate View into the Past

"Chic Chicago: Couture Treasures from the Chicago History Museum" provides the rare opportunity to see more than 50 of the greatest couture treasures from the museum's collection. The exhibition will feature Gilded Age gowns by Worth and Pingat to modern masterpieces by Chanel



Designed by Jeanne Lanvin in 1927. The dress was "robe be style" in egg shell moiree and crystal beading. Chicago socialite Mrs. Charles S. Dewey wore this dress when presented to the Court of St. James in London.



Designed by Charles James in 1954, called the "butterfly dress." It weighed 17 pounds. Chicago socialite Mrs. John Z. Farwell III, wore this creation.

and Versace. The exhibition is a testimony to Chicago women of style who supported innovative fashion designers in the hope of claiming Chicago as chic. Fashion, they believed, was the most dramatic way to re-imagine Chicago as a sophisticated and cultured city. By purchasing and wearing couture fashion, these women aspired to overcome the city's image as a gritty, industrial, working-class metropolis and its negative reputations as hog butcher to the world, gangland, and the second city. The exhibition, running through July 26, 2009, displays some of the most significant pieces that helped shape fashion

The exhibition features examples of the history of fashion from 1861 through 1996; designed by international houses of couture that catered to Chicago women. "The pieces in the exhibition are brought to life through the stories behind the woman that wore them," said Timothy Long, exhibition curator. "The pieces were worn by notables such as Mrs. Potter Palmer II, Mrs. Charles S. Dewey, Ruth Page, and Mrs. William McCormick Blair to events such as the Coronation of King Edward VII; the Court of Saint James in 1927; and to meet the Queen of England in 1938."

The Chicago History Museum holds one of the largest and oldest costume collections in the country comprising over 50,000 pieces. Collection holdings date to the 1750s and consist not only of couture pieces, but also those worn by famous, infamous, and everyday Americans. The collection places an emphasis on the provenance of each piece and tells the history and story of each artifact. The Museum has been collecting historical dress since 1898 and exhibiting the collection for over 80 years; but there has never been a comparable exhibition that showcases such a broad range of couture masterpieces from the museum's collection.

The programming in conjunction with Chic Chicago: Couture Treasures from the Chicago History Museum will feature fashion-focused films. A program exploring the growing relationship between political movements, ethics, and the clothes worn by everyday Chicagoans called The Fashion Frontier, on Thursday, Nov. 6,

will be part of our In the K/Now seriesa monthly series looking at contemporary issues affecting people in the city. Admission for this series is free, but reservations are required. The museum will also offer a "Tea and Tour" on Saturday, Nov. 15, which includes a tour of the exhibition with Tim Long, and an afternoon of tea at the Drake Hotel. Tickets are \$55; \$50 for museum members. A bus tour highlighting Chicago artisans and designers will take place on Saturday, Jan. 10, 2009. This tour will be \$45; \$40 for museum members. New Law Significantly Expands the Americans with Disabilities Act

On Sept. 25, 2008, President Bush signed the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) Amendments Act of 2008 ("Act") which becomes effective Jan. 1, 2009. The Act makes important changes to the definition of the term "disability" by rejecting the holdings in several Supreme Court decisions and portions of Equal Employment Opportunities Commission's (EEOC) ADA regulations.

The Act retains the ADA's basic definition of "disability" as an impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities, a record of such an impairment, or being regarded as having such an impairment. However, it changes the way that these statutory terms should be interpreted in several ways. Most significantly, the Act directs EEOC to revise that portion of its regulations defining the term "substantially limits and expands the definition of "major life activities" by including two nonexhaustive lists which includes many activities that the EEOC has recognized (e.g., walking) as well as activities that EEOC has not specifically recognized (e.g., reading, bending, and communicating) and a second list which includes major bodily functions (e.g., "functions of the immune system, and reproductive functions"). The amendments also provide that mitigating measures other than "ordinary eyeglasses or contact lenses" shall not be considered in assessing whether an individual has a disability and clarifies that an impairment that is episodic or in remission is a disability if it would substantially



limit a major life activity when active. The new amendments provide that an individual subjected to an action prohibited by the ADA (e.g., failure to hire) because of an actual or perceived impairment will meet the "regarded as" definition of disability, unless the impairment is transitory and minor. Significantly, the Act emphasizes that the definition of "disability" should be interpreted broadly.

Beach Boys Bring Wave of Fun to Chicago: Splashy Bash Raises Cash for Infant Welfare Society

More than \$127,000 of benefit proceeds was raised by frenzied bidding on exclusive getaways and prize packages and a "paddle auction" of direct financial support to IWS facilitated by renowned auctioneer David Goodman. IWS leaders and guests alike were stunned by the amounts raised for the agency. "I've never seen anything like it," noted Paul Harvey Jr.

The black-tie evening opened with a festive reception and extensive silent auction, followed by a seated dinner and dancing to The Elite Band. South Barrington High School Senior Interns for a Cure For students, summer break typically con-

sists of sleeping in and lazy days. But for Marissa Suchyta, a student at the Lake Forest Academy, this summer has involved doing rigorous cancer research at Northwestern University's Feinberg School of Medicine. Fueled by her interest in the medical field, specifically neurosurgery, Suchyta hopes to make her mark in the war against cancer through this opportu-


Duck Stamp Contest Winners on Display







Cosmetic Dentistry: "I Hate My Teeth!" by James T. Gavrilos, DDS

Those words are heard in dental offices every day. But when the dentist asks the patient, "What do you hate about them?" the answer is usually, "I don't know, I just hate them!'


So many factors contribute to the appearance of teeth. These factors may not be clearly identifiable by the patient but are clearly evident to the dentist that has had training in smile design. When evaluating a smile, the dentist needs to ask himself many questions. Are the edges of the teeth worn? What is the patient doing to wear them down? Do the gums show when smiling? If they show, do they appear to follow the lips or are they canted? Do the edges of the upper teeth follow the shape of the lower lip? Do the upper teeth show while the patient is speaking? Does the midline of the upper teeth line up with the midline of the lower teeth? Do the teeth have a "windswept" appearance that makes the spaces between the teeth look angled? Is the pointed gum tissue that drops down between the teeth even from one side to the other? Is the tooth color appropriate for the patient? The list goes on and on, and it's important to identify what the problem is before trying to fix it.




St. Anne Catholic School Holds First Spirit Day and Walk to Citizens Park

Buildings with Radon Can Be Fixed

You can't see or smell radon. It may be in your home, posing a health risk to you and your family. The natural breakdown of uranium in the soil gives off a radioactive gas called radon, that can enter homes, polluting the air. While there is no safe level of radon, at high concentrations and prolonged exposure, radon can cause lung cancer, leading to many thousands of deaths each year in the United States. Radon is the second leading cause of lung cancer for smokers and the first leading cause of lung cancer for nonsmokers. Not everyone exposed to high levels of radon gas will get lung cancer.

Testing is the only way to know how much radon is in your home. Radon detectors are easy to use and low cost.

Homes should be tested for radon every two years. Free radon test kits are available from the Illinois Emergency Management Agency, while supplies last. The radon test kits can be ordered online at www.radon.illinois.gov or by calling 1-800-325-1245. Radon detectors are also available for purchase at many hardware stores and some county health depart-


It is recommended that homes with a radon level of 4 or more picoCuries per liter of air (pCi/L) be fixed to reduce the radon levels in the home. Radon levels of 4 picoCuries per liter of air is equal to 200 chest X-rays per year. It is recommended that professional mitigators be hired to install the system to reduce the level of



radon in the home below 4pCi/L. Mitiga- licensed professional radon mitigators in tion is the act of repairing or altering a building or building design for the purpose of reducing the concentration of radon in the indoor atmosphere. This may cost an average of \$800 to \$1,200 to mitigate the home of radon, depending on the extent of the work needed. A list of
