Severance Agreements—The Importance of Review and Evaluation

As the economy continues to struggle, many companies are being forced to reduce their work force through employee layoffs. In a layoff, a departing employee is typically offered a severance agreement which is a legal contract. While there is no legal requirement for an employer to provide severance, employers do so in order to avoid potential claims by the departing employee by securing a release of all claims. In the agreement, the departing employee agrees not to sue the employer for various employment-related actions and in exchange the employer

provides extra compensation to the departing employee which is typically money and/or benefits. If properly prepared,

the release contained within the severance agreement is enforceable to prevent legal action against the employer.

As such, before signing the agreement, the departing employee should carefully consider the agreement with legal counsel. In particular, the agreement should be analyzed under state and federal laws. This evaluation should also include an analysis of the facts and circumstances surrounding the separation to determine whether there is any violation of state and federal statutes such as Title VII, Age Discrimination in Employment Act, Americans With Disabilities Act or Family Medical Leave Act. State law actions for retaliatory discharge, contract or quasi-contractual rights and final pay issues such as vacation, bonus and commission should be considered. Also, benefit issues such as health care and unemployment benefits should be evaluated. A significant concern


for most departing employees regards whether the agreement contains a noncompete or non-solicitation provision as a term of the agreement. Since such provisions may significantly impact future employment, these provisions should be carefully analyzed.

A Gray Area

One of the greatest challenges in dentistry is finding materials that can withstand the forces generated in the mouth. In the past, gold has been the material that combined biocompatibility with strength. It is still the standard by which all new materials are

But what do we do when we have to crown a front tooth? Decades ago, gold was used on the front teeth. But as you can imagine, their appearance was far from satisfactory. Technicians started to experiment with different plastics and porcelains to cover the gold and create a crown that was white in appearance. This is the system that is most frequently used today when making tooth-colored crowns. The drawback to this system has always been the opacity of the crown. Light cannot be transmitted through the restoration because of the gold substructure, and this resulted in teeth that looked like Chiclets. Another problem is the appearance of this gold at the gumline. When someone smiles and you see a gray area at the margin where the crown ends and the gums begin, you're looking at unpolished gold that appears to be gray. In some instances, this grayness will radiate into the gum tissue because the metal used under the porcelain was not gold but a cheaper substitute. The molecules of the cheaper metal are leached into the gum tissue creating a gray tattoo.




gray appearance and the opacity. Unfortunately, many of them have fallen short on the durability scale and resulted in fractured porcelain. That is, until now. A company from Europe produces a white substructure that is just as strong as gold without the undesirable appearance. The substructure is fabricated in a central lab using digitized information e-mailed to them using the dentist's impression. The substructure then has porcelain applied to it just like the gold ones do. The result is a natural-looking crown that doesn't show any gray at the gumline.

Our office has been delivering these crowns to our patients for over five years and has seen no signs of early breakdown or fracture. If you are seeing gray and want to make a change, now is the time you can do so with long-lasting, predictable results.





Help Reduce EAB Spread by Using Firewood from Local Sources

Many people enjoy the glow of the fireplace during the holiday season and many people use wood as a heating source during the fall and winter in Illinois. Firewood can be purchased from individuals, dealers or retail stores or cut by the user. But early winter weather such as last year's can reduce accessibility for people to cut their own firewood.

With the presence of the emerald ash borer (EAB), a relatively new pest to Illinois, persons are encouraged to use local sources of firewood, especially ash wood, and to know the source of the wood. The emerald ash borer has been found in over 50 locations in the northern one-half of Illinois since June 2006, from the Illinois-Wisconsin state line to as far south as the Bloomington area. It was first identified at one location in Kane County

The Illinois and U.S. departments of agriculture are working with communities and industry to try to control the spread. The emerald ash borer only affects ash trees. Since the borers do not typically travel far on their own, reducing human transport of the pest can help slow the spread of the problem. Areas identified with the emerald ash borer are officially

quarantined to restrict the movement of wood, wood products and the borer.

"One of the things that individuals can do to help reduce the spread of the pest is to use local firewood," says John Church, University of Illinois Extension educator, natural resources, Rockford, If buying ash firewood, be sure of its source. Don't bring in firewood, or other ash wood products, from infested areas or from a long distance. If camping in infested areas, leave unused firewood at that site.

The IDOA Web site contains control and quarantine information as well as information on what to do with downed trees and limbs from affected trees.



Choosing a Christmas Tree Variety

In recent years, there have been more varieties of trees to choose from when trying to select that perfect Christmas tree. Many families have a tradition of using the same kind every year. Traditional varieties include Scotch pine, white pine, balsam fir and others. More recently, other varieties such as Fraser fir, Douglas fir, Norway spruce, or even blue spruce have become common. "Depending on the variety, some may be more difficult to find, based on demand, size of tree needed and the number grown in northern Illinois," says John Church, University of Illinois Extension educator, natural resources, Rockford.

One that has increased in availability is the Fraser fir, but cut-your-own locations

for these trees may still be somewhat limited. It is not grown as often as others in this area, but it is gaining in popularity at farms and on sales lots. The needles are flat, 1/2 to 1 inch, and have a rich, dark green color with a silvery underside. It has excellent color and needle retention characteristics. They tend to be "naturallyshaped" Christmas trees

For a "full" appearing tree, white pines are often good. They are widely available in the Midwest. It has longer needles at 3 to 6 inches. It has generally good needle color and retention.

The spruces are gaining in popularity as Christmas trees, too. The needles tend to have good retention, and are shorter and stiffer than some of the other varieties. The spruce varieties are often popular when buying a live Christmas tree to plant in the yard after the holidays. Live trees need special care while inside for successful planting outdoors.

The traditional favorite Scotch pine has 11/2 to 3 inch blue-green needles, which have a delicate twisted appearance. The branches tend to be more open and stiffer than the white pine. Many people prefer it since it often is easier to hang ornaments on its branches. It is also often one of the most reasonably priced varieties.

"Certainly, there are other desirable varieties available too," says Church. Regardless of the variety of the tree, proper watering and keeping the home as moist and cool as possible will help lengthen the tree's enjoyment and safety.


