

# "Chihuly Over Venice" to be Viewed by Art Associates



On Wednesday, September 19, the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute of Chicago will travel to the Milwaukee Art Museum to view "Chihuly Over Venice."

The exhibit highlights 11 of the spectacular glass chandeliers created by Dale Chihuly, the renowned glass artist, for exhibition over the canals and in the courtyards of Venice in 1996. Each chandelier reflects the country where it was made. A pendulous red chandelier with myriad sombrero-shaped surfaces was made in Mexico; a shimmering waterfall of clear glass with etched surfaces was made in Waterford, Ireland.

These beautiful creations may weigh as much as a ton, yet appear "as weightless as galactic globules of light."

Chihuly's work reflects his pioneering and collaborative approach toward art and his against-all-odds spirit. He has not blown glass since a car accident cost him the sight in his left eye. Instead, he draws and paints his designs in vivid colors and oversees an army of assistants who bring his ideas to life.

A new \$75 million expansion of the Milwaukee Art Museum takes advantage of the museum's unique position on the shore of Lake Michigan. Designed by Spanish-born architect and engineer Santiago Calatrava, it sits just south of the fore September 7.

existing museum and will house new galleries and a towering reception hall. The hall is outfitted with an enormous, mechanically-operated sunshade that resembles the wings of a bird taking flight. A bridge, resembling a ship's gangway, will lead pedestrians into the hall. Its dramatically pitched exterior has been compared to a billowing sail.

After a guided tour of the spectacular space, there will be time to view some of the permanent collection that contains nearly 20,000 works from an Egyptian mummy case to a first/second century Roman torso to contemporary works. It includes 15th to 20th century European and 17th to 20th century American works in various media by artists such as Winslow Homer, Claude Monet, August Rodin, Henri de Toulouse-Lautrec and Joan Miró.

Lunch will be at the Wisconsin Club, formerly the Mitchell Mansion, which began in 1848. It is an example of French second empire and includes a grand staircase, a ballroom, a Moorish room, an Oriental room and an Italian belvidere. There will be time to view the many examples of fine Old World craftsmanship.

High atop three desolate and remote mesas in arid northern Arizona, the Hopi people live their lives today and practice their religion much as they have since before A.D. 1300.


The Hopi religion is a complex series of rituals and societies that is driven by the urgent need for water in any form: rain for farming, for drinking water in the springs or snow to replenish the land. One element of the very complex religion is the Kachina Cult, with every Hopi over 10 years old being a member.

To the Hopi, Kachinas are the spirit essence of everything in the real world. Hopi children are given dolls that represent the many Kachinas so that they will learn about each of the spirits that are so important to their life.

Today, Hopi carvers create Kachina dolls from a single piece of cottonwood root, not only to educate children, but as prized items for collectors of the prized Hopi pieces.



#### Restrictions on Future Employment— Non-Compete Provisions in Release **Agreements** by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

As downsizing and layoffs continue, companies are increasingly offering severance pay in exchange for a release which not only waives the employee's legal rights but also tries to restrict future employment. Typically, a non-compete agreement provides certain restrictions on competing with the employer based on a certain time period and geographical area. In order to be an enforceable non-compete agreement, courts generally find that the restrictions must be narrowly drafted so that it is designed to protect the legitimate business concerns of the employer. Various factors are considered in determining whether the company has a legitimate business concern in restricting employment. These factors include a detailed analysis of the employer's business, where the company and the employee performed work, the employee's skills and knowledge of the company's business and the type of position held by the employee.

Courts analyze each restrictive covenant and employment relationship independently to determine whether the restrictive covenant is enforceable. In doing so, they generally find that executive employees who have had significant responsubject to broader restrictions. Also, geographical restrictions are generally limited



to enforcement in the area the employee serviced during employment, but this depends on the nature of the industry. Overall, a covenant which has very detailed time and geographic restrictions and which identifies the particular customers and business is more likely to be enforceable than one which has broad restrictions. Accordingly, because a non-compete provision in a release agreement can effectively restrict future employment if properly drafted, you should carefully consider the release with legal counsel before signing the agreement. 





# **How to Choose a Dance School** for Your Child

4) Are the students well behaved and attentive for their age?

Many people have very active frown lines between their brows and would love to have a simple way to reduce them. These lines are the result of corrugator muscles. These muscles wrinkle the central brow into a configuration similar to corrugated cardboard, hence the name. A number of options are available to treat these lines. Collagen had been used to fill the resulting depressions and more invasive surgeries have been devised to interrupt the muscles and weaken them. Now a simple injection is available that can weaken these muscles and significantly reduce the frown lines. The injection is done with Botox, a protein derived from Claustridium Botulinium, the bacteria responsible for Botulism.

What is Botox and How Does it Work? Botox is a highly purified form of the protein Botulinum toxin. When it is injected into a muscle, it blocks the nerve signals coming into that muscle resulting in complete or partial paralysis lasting from three to six months. Although it sounds scary, Botox is very safe and has been used effectively for years to treat spasms of the eye and face. We have used Botox for eight years with excellent results in reducing the frown lines and crow's feet at the outer corners of the eyes.

#### How is a Treatment Done?


The Botox is mixed from its freeze-dried state and diluted to the strength desired. Usually, two injections are done on each side of the eyebrows to reduce frowning

or on the sides of the eyes to reduce the crow's feet. The effects are not seen immediately but take place over two to three days. Over that time, the muscles will gradually become weaker until there is almost no ability to frown. If the crow's feet area is injected, the crinkling of the skin in that area will be reduced as well. If further weakening is desired, a second injection can be done after one week. But this is rarely necessary

There are no absolute contraindications for using Botox. Allergic reactions are virtually nonexistent.

different. One full bath was not enough. Every morning, there were "bathroom" fights in Napoleon's household. No one left home cheerful or with a bright smile.




