
Artist Franklin McMahon Designs Symphony Holiday Card, Reception and Viewing at Hilligoss Gallery

River Trading Post Features Extensive Collection of Museum-Quality Pueblo Pottery

When early North American Indians first engaged in agriculture and banded together in communities, they recognized the need for containers to store their grain. These containers, made as early as A.D. 50, were woven baskets. About A.D. 700, the first Pueblo Indian experimented with clay; and pottery, fashioned after the original baskets, soon appeared in the Indian home.

The early pottery was utilitarian and not considered art. The large containers stored dried materials; the smaller pieces, with concave bases for carrying on the head, were used to transport water and milk.

Thirteen hundred years later, Pueblo artisans continue to create pottery and maintain their ancestral inheritance of respecting "Mother Clay." Today, it is no surprise that Pueblo pottery is found as an integral part of fine art collections around the world and in every major mu-

Many highly prized pieces of Pueblo pottery are included among the extensive River Trading Post display. The collection ranges from ancient Anasazi and tures in Santa Fe.







However, there are other things that can be done to enhance your smile, which may be just as important or even more important than orthodontics in specific cases. The simplest and safest is probably a

thorough cleaning followed by bleaching treatments. These are usually doctor prescribed but patient-applied at home.

Slightly chipped or malpositioned teeth may be modified by reshaping them with a dental drill or by building them up in specific areas with bonding. Bonding usually involves the addition of a tooth-colored plastic to correct shape or mask color.

More severe irregularities may need something stronger and longer-lasting than plastic bonding. In these cases, a veneer or a crown is used. Veneers and crowns are made of ceramic material in a dental laboratory from impressions or dentist. The veneer or crown is returned 4040 in Barrington.





What medical lasers are now able to do is remarkable. Early lasers were basic units that delivered high-intensity light, accomplishing little more than burning the tissue. But today's lasers are finely tuned to accomplish very specific tasks with minimal side effects.

always some hair in the resting cycle. The number of treatments depends on the color, density and thickness of the hair. Even nose hair can be treated by applying the laser to the external surface of the nose, since the light penetrates through the skin to the follicles underneath.


"Everything is my own design," says



REMODELING 2001...STORY #10

When a house doesn't seem to be meeting the needs of a growing family, it is tempting to take a shotgun approach and try to expand it in all directions. Of course, we'd all love a huge new family room, an inviting sun-room, a more functional laundry room and a less cramped kitchen. But how would each of these affect the existing structure, the lot and landscaping and the budget? 



Employment Agreements—Protecting Your Employment Relationship

As you may be aware, employment in Illinois is regarded as "at will." This means an employee may be terminated for a good reason, bad reason or no reason at all. An exception to the "at will" doctrine is an enforceable contractual relationship with the employer. Typically, a written employment agreement specifies the terms and conditions of an employment relationship. Such terms may include job title, responsibilities, compensation and

The agreement may also set forth under what circumstances an individual may be terminated by the company. For instance, the agreement may specify that the employer may only terminate the employment relationship upon mutual agreement, advance notice or for specified reasons of "cause." The term "cause" will be defined in the agreement and may include failure to satisfactorily perform the job duties or for theft or dishonesty.

Employers will often offer a written employment agreement when they want to protect their clientele after the employment relationship ends. In that situation, the employer may offer to terminate the employee only for "cause" or with prior notification or severance pay in exchange for a restrictive covenant or noncompete agreement which extends after the end of the employment relationship. If such provision is proposed, review the language carefully as such provisions are enforceable when properly drafted.

Where you are offered an employment agreement, you should not rely on verbal promises since they are difficult to enforce, if at all. This is especially true where



the written agreement between the parties contains a provision known as a "merger" or "integration" clause. A "merger" or "integration" clause is a contractual provision which states that the contract contains all the agreements between the parties. Therefore, if the verbal promise is not contained in the written agreement, it is contractually presumed to not exist.

In any employment relationship, the best time to determine the legal effect of an agreement is before the contract is signed. As such, it is highly advisable to consult with an attorney to review the proposed employment agreement to determine the legal ramifications should you need to take action after you leave that employment.

The most common areas for Botox use are the frown lines between the eyebrows, the horizontal forehead lines and the wrinkles around the eyes.
