Elbridge Ayer Burbank, Harvard's Greatest Artist, has Major Exhibition in Chicago

Grandson of Town's Founder Went West in 1897 to Paint Geronimo's Portrait, Made More Than 4,000 Paintings and Drawings of Indians

Elbridge Ayer Burbank—if you've never heard of him, you're not alone. This Harvard-born artist hasn't had an important show for almost 100 years. But Burbank (1858-1949)—once very successful with high society patrons and a big studio in downtown Chicago-made his name painting portraits of American Indians.


In 1897, Burbank was commissioned to paint Geronimo, the Apache Indian leader, and journeyed to Fort Sill in the Oklahoma Territory, intending to enjoy this summer excursion and come home. Instead, he stayed four months, made numerous portraits and declared that he had "never [been] so taken with a subject as I am with these Indians." Later, he vowed to "paint every single Indian tribe in Amer-

By the time he was done, Burbank had produced about 1,000 oil portraits of Indians and 4,000 Conté crayon drawings. Sixty-eight oils executed between 1897 and 1910 are on view at Chicago's Newberry Library until July 13. The exhibition includes drawings, letters and photographs. Admission is free.

Harvard's Founder

Elbridge Ayer, the artist's grandfather, arrived in present-day Kenosha, Wis., from Massachusetts in 1836. Ayer and his friend, Abner Burbank, helped organize the Wisconsin Territories and send a delegate to Washington. They cleared land and fought off Indian raids. Ayer opened a general store and blacksmith shop.

In 1855, the Illinois & Wisconsin Railroad was laying track through the area. Elbridge Ayer learned that a junction was planned just south of the state line, purchased 400 acres of land on that spot and moved there. Later, he helped build the railroad, named the new town Harvard Junction and became owner of the railroad hotel. In autumn of 1856, the first


thought of the journey west as a summer outing. But days turned into weeks, and it was four months before Burbank returned to Chicago to show his first 19 Indian portraits, 17 of which sold immediately. Burbank had found his niche-American Indian portraits sought as much for their ethnographical value as their artistry.

marriage in Harvard was celebrated between Elbridge's daughter, Annie, and Abner Burbank, Jr. The first of their three children, Elbridge Ayer Burbank, was born in Harvard on August 10, 1858.

Young Burbank's earliest memories were probably of wounded Union Soldiers who passed through Harvard Junction on the railroad and were lodged-and often cared for-in his grandfather's hotel. Educated in Harvard, Elbridge showed an early talent for art and enrolled at the Academy of Design in Chicago (now the Art Institute). Later, he had studios in Chicago and Minnesota and traveled and studied in Europe

Salvage Ethnograpers

In 1897, when he made his first trip out West, Burbank was well known for society portraits, also for his thoughtful paintings of black people. The commission to depict Geronimo came from Edward E.

Ayer, Burbank's uncle, who was a collector of American Indian artifacts. Ayer had been the first president of the Field Museum of Natural History.

In those days, the Indians were militarily defeated and living on reservations. Most people believed that Indians would soon be integrated into American society and that their culture would disappear. Before this happened, Ayer and other "salvage ethnographers" collected objects and sought to make records of Indian life. Burbank, who made ethnographically correct portraits of numerous Indian tribes as he traveled all over the West, was perfectly in tune with his times. Ayer bought his paintings in quantity.

In Burbank's portraits, we see individual human beings who happen to be American Indians-and not just types. The artist loved the Indians and preferred the West to life in Chicago. He never condescended to his sitters, but found what was unique in each one. All this comes through in his wonderful exhibition.

Geronimo, 1899, Apache, Fort Sill, OT (Oklahoma Territory), oil on canvas mounted on panel, 13" x 9", The Butler Institute of American Art-Geronimo, whose Apache name means "one who yawns," was a medicine man and a highly respected warrior and tribal leader. One of the most well-known Indians during Burbank's time, he led raids against the U.S. Government and defended the traditional ways of the Apaches. In 1886, he surrendered and was incarcerated for a brief time. Toward the end of his life, he participated in Buffalo Bill's Wild West show and appeared in Theodore Roosevelt's inaugural parade and at the St. Louis World's Fair. He survived several wives and 10 children before dying of pneumonia in 1909.

The dining room and sunrooms overlook the beautiful natural gardens and grounds. The wooded environment surrounding The Redfield Estate includes two gazebos, a reflecting pool and tranquil gardens.







Barrington Junior Women's Club Determines 2002 Scholarship and Grant Recipients

Barrington Junior Women's Club's Philanthropy Committee is hard at work this month, sifting through college scholarship applications and grant requests from local charitable organizations.

Each year, the club selects five Barrington High School graduates to receive college scholarships totaling \$10,000, based on merit or service qualifications. Two \$4,000 scholarships are given based on academic merit, and two \$1,000 scholarships are given based on community service hours.

Additionally, local charitable organizations last year received a total of \$58,000 from club grants. Charitable organizations are selected each year based on their written grant requests for funding. The club's Philanthropy Committee reviews the requests, interviews and visits the organizations, and recommends how the funds will be distributed. Each year, the club makes a dynamic impact on charitable organizations which directly affect women and children, seniors, the abused and the underprivileged in the northwest suburban area of Chicago.

This year, the club hopes to increase their giving level through various fundraising efforts. Their most recent effort is the 2002 Designer Showhouse, currently underway in Barrington. Stag's Crest, a five-acre estate north of downtown Barrington, is named in honor of the heritage of its owners, a young family who lent their home for the showhouse event. The 3838. colonial-style country manor house was

built in 1928 during the affluent post-World-War-I period known as the roaring

The showhouse is open through May 19. House hours are 10 a.m. to 2 p.m., Tuesdays through Fridays; 6 to 8 p.m. Fridays; 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. Saturdays; and 1 to 4 p.m. Sundays. Mondays are reserved for private tours. Wednesdays are designated Designer Days, and the participating designers will be in their respective spaces to meet and interact with visitors. Tickets are \$18, available at the showhouse. Because parking is prohibited in the residential neighborhood near the estate, complimentary parking and continuous shuttle bus service is provided at Richard Honquest Fine Furnishings, 1455 S. Barrington Road (just north of Dundee Road, Route 68) in Barrington.

Proceeds benefit the Joyful Hands chapter of Habitat for Humanity, a nonprofit ecumenical Christian housing organization building simple, decent, affordable housing in partnership with people in need. Habitat is one of several charities which Barrington Junior Women's Club helps support each year.

Changes in the Employment Relationship by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

As part of my law practice, I often consult with employees who raise some very valid concerns about sudden changes in their position, such as a transfer, alteration of job duties or reduction of compensation. Where an employee has a good history of performance and suddenly finds that they are faced with an unwarranted negative employment evaluation, change in responsibilities, demotion or other adverse change in their employment status, it should be of particular concern.

In an employment-at-will relationship, it is legal for an employer to change or alter job duties, responsibilities and pay. However, to do so for a discriminatory reason is not legal. As such, any adverse change in employment status which is unwarranted is a legitimate issue that should be

Careful analysis of the situation under federal and state laws is especially recommended where the employee believes the motivation behind the decision is discrimination. State and federal laws are designed to protect an employee from discrimination and include protection from a decision based on an employee's age, race, gender, national origin, religion and dis-

If you suspect that an adverse change in your employment relationship is dis-

criminatory, you are advised to have a legal evaluation of your employment situation. The time frame for addressing a claim of discrimination with a state or federal agency is limited. As such, quick action is recommended.
