#### Art a Part of Barrington!—Barrington Area Arts Council's 16th Annual Art Fair



#### **Barrington's Relay for Life** Scheduled for June 14 **Our Vision of Hope for the Future**

"What is the purpose of the Relay for Life besides raising money?" many people ask. Why are we doing this?

Our mission is to give cancer survivors an opportunity to go on with their lives. We do this to honor the ones that have won and lost the battle of cancer. The money received through the relay is given to the American Cancer Society. They perform research to find cures for cancer. This cancer-based research of genetics and blood cells goes beyond cancer to help find cures for other diseases such as heart disease and diabetes. The money also reaches out to help cancer victims such as providing them college scholarships and provide other programs, education and services to the community. Their ultimate goal is to improve the quality of life for cancer survivors and save millions of lives.

One person in the world dies from cancer every minute. In the year 2002, 57,000 people will be diagnosed with cancer in Illinois alone. Out of that 57,000 people, 25,600 will die. The entire population of the Barrington community is approximately 29,000 people. This is Barrington's fifth annual "Relay for Life." So far, our community has raised over 1.55 million dollars in four years. Our goal this year is to raise \$450,000. If we accomplish this, our community will have raised over two million dollars with five years of relays. How many lives have we touched? How many lives have we saved?

This year, the Relay for Life is slated for June 14, Barrington's Homecoming, at Barrington High School. Come join us! We are extremely honored, once again, to have honorary chairpersons, Connie Payton and Kim Duchossois speak at the event. With pride, we will have Barrington's own Nancy Nemec, Northwest Suburban Regional RFL Task Force Chairman and Survivor, and Deanna Nyenhuis, Barrington High School cancer survivor and now spokesperson for the American Cancer Society. They will share their inspiring stories with us and relay to us their message of hope. Bob Skopek and Jack Wood will cochair the event.

#### Taking Legal Action— Wrongful Discharge and Retaliation by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

"Wrongful discharge" is a term often used generally. But legally, a "wrongful discharge" is an unlawful termination of an employee. A wrongful discharge is in violation of a state or federal statute, such as Title VII (race, gender, religion or national origin), the Age Discrimination in Employment Act (an employee over 40), the Americans with Disabilities Act, the Family Medical Leave Act, or any other state or federal law. Additionally, an employee is protected from the retaliatory conduct of an employer when that employee asserts a legally protected right. For instance, if an employee complains of discriminatory conduct and is then demoted, terminated or otherwise adversely treated by the employer because of that complaint, than the employee would have a valid claim of retaliation. A violation in that regard can subject an employer to federal or state court action for damages, including the employee's lost wages, benefits, attorneys' fees, costs, compensatory and punitive damages.

If you believe you were terminated in violation of the law and especially if you were asked to sign a release in exchange for severance, you are advised to seek legal counsel to evaluate your situation. If properly drafted and presented, a release agreement is an effective means of preventing the assertion of your legal rights. Professional Women.

Because quick action is required as time limitations are strict, I encourage you to acquire information regarding your legal rights as soon as possible. 

Valerie Burke is a resident of Streamwood, Ill. She received an MFA in photography from the University of Illinois. Today, she is a fine art photographer and educator, balancing her art career with her lecture series at Columbia College Chicago. Her work has been in solo exhibits and group shows throughout the United States and abroad.

Ms. Burke specializes in pinhole photography, with her current work dealing directly with the sun's light and landscape. "A majority of the low-tech images are printed digitally with archival inks and papers. Many of the photographs were taken with 4" x 5" pinhole camera looking up at the sun. Sometimes, I would spin the camera on a lazy Susan tray or use objects like shells or call lilies directly over the pinholes during these exposures." Time extension and the exploratory nature of shooting with an obscured camera lens provides ample opportunity for chance results.

Michael Brown was born in the Kirby Moorside in the northern country of England. After emigrating to the United States via Canada, he received an MFA from the Rhode Island School of Design. Today, he resides in Palatine, Ill., where he is a professor of art at William Rainey Harper College.

#### **City Parks Focus for Art Associates**

meaning "city in a garden," was adopted by Chicago's government in 1837 when there were few green spaces. The slogan proved to be prophetic, as today there are 555 parks for citizens to enjoy. Some of the nation's most significant architects, artists and landscape designers helped create the city's parks, including Frederic Law Olmsted, Daniel H. Burnham, Jens Jensen, Alfred Caldwell and Lorado Taft.

On July 18, Jeanette Muench will conduct the second tour of "Chicago Parks and Boulevards" for the Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute of Chicago. This year's tour features parks on the south side of the city.

Douglas Park, named for Sen. Stephen A. Douglas, was created by William Le Baron Jenney, father of the skyscraper. In 1905, Jens Jensen began additional improvements, including a formal garden and flower hall that combines Prairie School and classical elements to the 173acre park.

In 1880, Jackson Park was named in honor of the seventh president, Andrew Jackson. Ten years later, it was selected for the world's Colombian Exposition and transformed into "White City." Today, the lagoons remain and the Japanese pavilion stood until destroyed by fire in 1946. The Osaka Garden, created in 1935, has been improved and restored many times.

The Midway Plaisance connected Jackson and Washington parks. Originally a place to play ball and graze sheep, today a major aquatics center, it provides recreation in Washington Park. Fountain of Time, Lorado Taft's masterpiece, was recently conserved.

Burnham Park, 598 acres along the lakefront, connects Jackson Park and Grant Park. It includes McCormick Place, Soldier Field, Museum Campus and the Burnham Park Yacht Harbor. Spectacular views of the city skyline are seen at Promontory Point.

### **Replacing Missing Teeth**

#### When Should My Child See an Orthodontist?

When most people think of orthodontics, they think of teenagers. The fact is, many orthodontic patients begin treatment by the age of 7. At this time, they have a mix of adult and baby teeth. Children sometimes exhibit early signs of jaw problems as they grow and develop. An upper or lower jaw that is growing too much or not enough, or is too wide, too narrow, or asymmetrical can be recognized at an early age. If children 7 or 8 years of age have these jaw discrepancies, they are usually candidates for early orthodontic/ orthopedic evaluation and treatment. This treatment are: to help develop and direct is important, because some orthodontic problems are easier to correct if they are diagnosed early.

Orthodontic appliances can be used to correct jaw shape and direct the growth toward an ideal relationship between the upper and lower jaws. A good foundation can be established to provide adequate room for the eruption of the remaining permanent teeth. Interceptive treatment can also decrease the time necessary for the second phase of treatment once all the permanent teeth have erupted. Leaving a malocclusion or "bad bite" untreated until all permanent teeth erupt may result in a jaw discrepancy too severe to achieve an ideal result with braces alone.

#### What is Botox?

Many people have very active frown lines between their brows and would love to have a simple way to reduce them. These lines are the result of corrugator muscles. These muscles wrinkle the central brow into a configuration similar to corrugated cardboard, hence the name. A number of options are available to treat these lines. Collagen had been used to fill the resulting depressions and more invasive surgeries have been devised to interrupt the muscles and weaken them. Now a simple injection is available that can weaken these muscles and significantly reduce the frown lines. The injection is done with Botox, a protein derived from Claustridium Botulinium, the bacteria responsible for Botulism

What is Botox and How Does it Work? Botox is a highly purified form of the protein Botulinum toxin. When it is injected into a muscle, it blocks the nerve signals coming into that muscle resulting in complete or partial paralysis lasting from three to six months. Although it sounds scary, Botox is very safe and has been used effectively for years to treat spasms of the eye and face. We have used Botox for eight years with excellent results in reducing the frown lines and crow's feet at the outer corners of the eyes.

#### How is a Treatment Done?


#### Local Author Featured in New Book

### The One-Person 401(k) Plan A Good Choice for Today's Self-Employed

The passage of new tax and pension legislation has made possible the one-person the business owner, and your partners 401(k). The provisions offer a number of changes, but the 401(k) contribution and deduction changes for a single-person business are the most dramatic. William Allen and Debra Schoendorf, financial consultants with Salomon Smith Barney in Barrington, describe the one-person 401(k) plan.

With a one-person 401(k), you decide how much, if anything, you wish to contribute each year. The 2002 contribution limit for a one-person 401(k) is \$40,000 (or \$41,000 if you are 50 or older). The one-person 401(k) may permit higher contributions than other retirement plans, such as Simple IRAs, SEP IRAs and Keoghs

A one-person 401(k) is appropriate for corporations, partnerships, sole proprietors and nonprofit entities run solely by one or more owners and their spouses. All contributions are fully income tax deductible for your business. Your contributions may be invested in virtually any investment, including stocks, bonds and certificates of deposit.

Assuming the 401(k) covers only you, and spouse, many administrative and record-keeping requirements do not apply. This could reduce or eliminate related fees and expenses. When your 401(k) balance reaches \$100,000, you will have to file an annual return with the U.S. Department of Labor. Your CPA or tax advisor can easily prepare the required annual filing.

Should you hire employees at a later date, you'll have to offer those age 21 and older the opportunity to participate in your 401(k) after completing one year of service. The plan would now require administration, record keeping and investment monitoring to comply with government regulations. You can stop your 401(k) at any time. So, while you're on your own, the one-person 401(k) is a good option to consider.

## **REMODELING 2002...**

When Todd and Tamara Tabel decided it was time to remodel the kitchen of their 1970's Barrington home, they were anxious to incorporate as much light and openness as possible while adding much needed storage space. 


