Protecting Your Legal Rights— The Employment Agreement

An employment agreement can either provide you with protection and/or limit your ability to freely move to another employer. On the positive side, an employment agreement can provide protection from the loss of your position at the whim of your employer. As you may be aware, in Illinois, employment is regarded as "at will." This means an employee may be terminated for a good reason, bad reason or no reason at all. An exception to the "at will" doctrine is an enforceable contractual relationship with the employer. The best means of protection from "at will" termination is entering a written agreement which specifies under what conditions the employment relationship may be terminated. For instance, the agreement may specify that the employer may only terminate the employment relationship upon mutual agreement, advance notice or for specified reasons of cause.

Alternatively, the employment agreement can also be used by an employer to restrict your future employment. In highly competitive industries, employers will usually require a written employment agreement which contains a restrictive covenant or noncompete provision when the employer wants to protect their clientele after the employment relationship ends. In that situation, the employee should be careful to review the agreement to determine whether those restrictions are reayou will be able to find employment in Area Professional Women.



your industry. Also, be careful to determine under what circumstances your employment can be terminated.

Of course, the best time to determine the legal effect of an employment agreement is before the contract is signed. An employment agreement is enforceable when properly drafted. Know the names of the shapes of diamonds and which shape you like best.

Unbeknownst to most people, diamonds can be cut into any shape. The seven most popular cuts are: princess cut, round brilliant, pear (teardrop shape), emerald cut, heart shaped, oval and the marquise (boat shaped).

Familiarize yourself with the four Cs.

We have all heard of the four Cs, but many people are not completely sure what they are exactly. Color, clarity, cut and carat weight each affect the price of a diamond dramatically. Ask your jeweler to explain each area and it's significance.

Understand carats and points.

These terms are used frequently when purchasing gems. Both refer to the weight of the gem. There are 100 points in a carat. When a diamond weighs less than one carat, it's weight is measured in points. Also, weight and size are two different subjects. Like people, diamonds can be different sizes and shapes but weigh the

Understand the importance of cut and how it affects the overall beauty and value of the diamond.

A diamond's brilliance is dependent on how well the gem is cut. (Cut and shape are two entirely different subjects.) The facets (or cuts) are like tiny mirrors and need to be angled correctly to reflect off one another and create brilliance. Wellcut, ideally cut and perfectly cut diamonds offer the greatest brilliance but require the most time in the cutting process and the

Learn how to use a microscope and loupe.

a diamond under a loupe. What consumers don't know is, to accurately see most inclusions (flaws), a light source is requirsource, a steady view and the ability to increase the magnification to view the inclusion(s) closely.

Recognize what a grading report is and how it is used.

Many diamonds are now accompanied by diamond grading reports. A report simply

ed. Using a microscope provides a light provides all the technical information about a diamond. The information includes color, clarity, carat weight, proportion, finish, symmetry and fluorescence. A diamond-grading laboratory does not provide the value of a gem.

Be aware of why purchasing a loose diamond is the best way to purchase it.

When you purchase a diamond loose, you are able to view the entire diamond under magnification in many different positions. It is also a tremendous advantage to be able to compare multiple diamonds next to each other and see subtle differences. Many times an inclusion can be hidden under a prong once the gem is set in a mounting.

Always ask for a referral from friends and family if you don't have a jeweler.

Word of mouth is the best referral when you don't have a personal jeweler. People are happy to tell you about their own experiences, good or bad.

Ask the sales associate about their education.



Dr. James M. Wilson Celebrates 30 Years in Ministry

As a high school math teacher and coach at Marseilles High School in Marseilles, Ill., James M. Wilson began doing youth work at the church and felt compelled to become a pastor.

"I experienced God's call into the ministry... saw the needs of the youth... people offered encouragement... so, in 1969, I trudged off to Garrett [Garrett Theological Seminary in Evanston, Ill.]," he said.

Dr. Wilson is now senior pastor of Barrington United Methodist Church and just celebrated his 30th year in the ministry.

While a full-time student at Garrett, Wilson was also a youth minister at the First United Methodist Church in Elmhurst. The Reverend Arthur Landwehr, his pastor in Marseilles and a "lifelong mentor," was the senior pastor and Ray Rhoads was the associate pastor. While there, he learned valuable lessons in how a large church is

Wilson's first appointment was as associate pastor of Faith United Methodist Church in Elgin from 1972 to 1977. Dr. Donald Thomas, former pastor of Barrington United Methodist Church, was the church's senior pastor.

"It was almost like going home, because I grew up in Dundee," said Wilson. In 1977, Wilson was appointed pastor

at Memorial United Methodist Church in

"Those were delightful years. It was a great appointment. However, I've enjoyed all of the churches I've served really very much. Each one had their uniqueness."

Then in 1983, he was appointed senior pastor of Grace United Methodist Church in Joliet. During those years, he served on an antigambling task force, helped with Kiwanis Club and organized JACOB, the Joliet Area Church Based Organizing Body while concurrently completing his doctorate of theology at McCormick Theological Seminary in Chicago.


"Those were challenging years. Joliet led the nation in unemployment at 28.3 percent... it was a tough and exciting time, and we lived through it and grew in spite of it.'

In 1993, Wilson was appointed superintendent of the DeKalb district and was responsible for supervising 76 churches, mainly "town and country" churches.

"Those were interesting years. I enjoyed being with the people... to help churches revision themselves and be more effective in the ministry.'

However, Wilson struggled with being "on the road" a lot. And when his young daughter, Mary Beth, came into Wilson and his wife, Charlene's, lives, they decided a change was in order.

In 1997, Bishop C. Joseph Sprague asked him to come to Barrington, which was cal beliefs."

very familiar to him because his father had been in business there and his mother had taught in the school system.

"It was not an unknown entity, but it had changed as far as growth."

Then on Oct. 28, 1998, the whole nature of Wilson's ministry at Barrington United Methodist changed dramatically when the church's historic building was destroyed by fire.

"The fire has been the landmark of my tenure here. And I've learned a lot. I remember telling the church board that this was not how I had planned to spend my time in Barrington. But if I had to go through this, I couldn't think of a better group of people to go through it with."

Since that time, the congregation has persevered in their efforts to rebuild, and their new church home at the corner of Route 59 and Algonquin Road will be completed before Easter of 2003.

"This congregation is incredibly faithful and committed... even through this time of wandering in the wilderness. And we did it! We were even able to grow and develop new ministries."

Wilson is also very grateful for the community support the church as received, through other pastors, businesses and the service sector.

"The community has been very supportive, and it has meant a lot. I am also very thankful for the congregation's support through Charlene's illness with cancer, and I'm grateful for her love and support throughout this journey.

"One of my fundamental beliefs is that our God is a redemptive God. We see that in Jesus Christ, but now we've experienced it... God's grace reaching into this tragedy and bringing something new. It has been a confirmation of my theologi-

Is Your Child Getting the Right Kind of Protein?

Protein is essential for growth and development. It's needed to manufacture hormones, antibodies, enzymes and tissues. It's also necessary in maintaining muscle, bone, cartilage, teeth and every system in

We eat protein to obtain amino acids, the building blocks of all proteins. Eight of the amino acids are "essential," because we cannot manufacture them ourselves and must obtain them from the foods we eat. The other 11 are called "nonessential," because our bodies can produce them.

Children need a steady supply of amino acids because their bodies are in a constant state of growth. To be most effective, their daily protein intake should be spaced out throughout the day.

Complete proteins are found in animal foods such as eggs, dairy, poultry, meat and fish, and provide ample amounts of all the essential amino acids. Incomplete proteins, which contain only some of the essential amino acids, are found in grains, legumes and leafy green vegetables.

You don't need to rely only on animal proteins to consume the full range of amino acids. In fact, most of these foods should be eaten in moderation due to their fat content as well as the risks of antibiotics and other chemicals used in the raising of poultry and beef.

To make sure your child is getting enough complete protein in their diet, add protein-rich foods to meals and snacks as often as possible. For example, add nuts and seeds to salads and vegetable casseroles. All soybean products, such as tofu and soymilk, are ideal complete proteins as they contain the essential amino acids plus several other nutrients. Try mixing up a tofu- or soymilk-based smoothie for your child for a great after-school snack.

At What Age Should Your Child See an Orthodontist?

The American Association of Orthodontists recommends that every child first visit an orthodontist at age 7. This may surprise you, because orthodontic treatment is generally associated with adolescence. An early examination, however, is very important to ensure maximum dental health for your child. 






Facelift Surgery

No, I didn't feel anything. I really don't recall a thing about it.

• What was your recovery like?

I think that my recovery was phenomenal. I had the surgery on a Tuesday and we had a family party the following Sunday. I will admit that it was in a kind of controlled light, evening situation. But my daughter, who is a young woman, didn't notice anything, so I think that's a pretty good indication. By seven days, I was totally, totally functional. I had a little bit of concern about sleeping in a balanced way. I would sleep on my back. And then, after I slept on my left side, I would try to sleep the same amount on my right side. Other than that, I would say that I had barely any discomfort. I had very little bruising-very, very little bruising. It was a very positive experience, both spiritually and in a more concrete, tangible way.

• Would you go through it again?

This marks the first time Michelangelo's marble sculpture, Apollo-David, has been sent from Florence to America. It is the first North American exhibit to reveal the remarkable story of the Medicis, the legacy of Michelangelo Buonarroti and the artistic culture they profoundly shaped.

On Nov. 21, The Barrington Community Associates of the Art Institute of Chicago will sponsor a bus trip to "The Medici, Michelangelo and the Art of Late Renaissance Florence.'

This major international exhibition of approximately 200 paintings, sculptures, graphics and other works of art will provide a detailed survey of the art and culture of Florence between 1537 and 1631.

The exhibit brings to life the colorful Medici family of the 16th and early 17th centuries, from the reign of the first Grand-Duke Cosimo I, through those of his sons, Francesco I and Ferdinando I, to that of his grandson, Cosimo II. Under their intelligent and discerning patronage and inspired by the works of Michelangelo, the arts flourished in this period. This time also saw the creation of the Florentine Accademia Del Disegno, the first art academy in Europe, and the Arazzeria, the first tapestry manufactory in Italy. Blue and white porcelain was invented by Francesco I dé Medici more than 100 years before the porcelain-making technique was rediscovered in France and Germany.
