Protecting Your Legal Rights— Supreme Court Expands Claims for Age Discrimination by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

A recent Supreme Court ruling makes it easier to sue for age discrimination. The court ruled that older workers may take their employers to federal court even in cases in which the alleged adverse impact on them was not intentional. The ruling means that workers age 40 and over now have less of a burden to raise their claim in court when suing under federal law. The decision is important, since just over half of the nation's 147 million-member Bureau of Labor Statistics. At issue were but actually disproportionately hurt older

A five-justice majority said the protected by the Civil Rights Act, com-Act (ADEA), which protects all workers older than 40, permits a limited range of "disparate impact" lawsuits, or claims that older workers are disproportionately harmed by policies an employer applies to its entire workforce.

The Supreme Court already has ruled that disparate impact claims are allowed under Title VII of the 1964 Civil Rights Act, which bans discrimination based on race, gender, religion or national origin. The decision provides that it should be no different for age discrimination, although it ruled the scope of liability is narrower. In fact, all five members of the majority agreed that disparate-impact suits based on age discrimination should be more limited than racial discrimination suits, ruling that older employees must identify a specific policy or practice that harmed them. This limitation was necessary, according to the court, because the ADEA allows employers to treat older workers differently because of "reasonable factors other than age." The court reasoned that age, unlike race or other classifications

federal Age Discrimination in Employment monly has relevance to an individual's capacity to engage in certain types of employment. Accordingly, the Supreme Court agreed with the federal appeals court that dismissed the case of 30 police department employees in Jackson, Miss. The employees argued that a new pay plan gave greater raises to officers under 40 than to older officers. However, the court found that this was an "unquestionably reasonable" attempt by the city to keep its police salaries competitive with those of nearby jurisdictions.

Thousand-Year-Old Anasazi Pottery: River Trading Post Collection

Over a 1,000 years ago, people were set-Canyon, Mesa Verde and Kayenta. It is estimated that these early New Mexico and Colorado villages were established as early as A.D. 490.

The people, known today as the Anasazi, were known for their exceptionally high level of architectural design and beautiful art. Around A.D. 1000, masonry houses were being built with stones stacked on top of each other and mud being used for mortar. The dwellings were impressive.

Pottery was an important art form durpeople created elegant white pottery with geometric designs in black. Much of the pottery was used in everyday life, and much was used for ceremonial purposes. The Anasazi were prolific potters.

The pots were made from sandstone tling into population centers in Chaco and shale clay and the beautiful designs were carefully painted on with "brushes" made from the yucca plant.

By A.D. 1300, the Anasazi had mysteriously disappeared, leaving their cities and their art behind.

Though the ceremonial use of the pottery remains unknown, today's Pueblo people who are Anasazi descendants believe that the spirit of Mother Earth residing in the clay had influenced the de-

Do You Own Too Many IRAs?

be distributed tax-free in retirement, some investors mistakenly feel that maintaining these in a separate account will allow full tax-free distributions from that account later on. In reality, the calculation to determine the tax-free portion of any distribution in retirement is based upon all the investor's IRAs, not solely on the account from which the distribution is taken. There is little benefit, therefore, in maintaining separate accounts for deductible and nondeductible IRA contributions.

Until a few years ago, investors were encouraged to maintain their rollover IRAs separately from their contributory IRAs, to keep the option of transferring the rollover back to an employer-sponsored plan. Combining the IRAs would have forfeited this opportunity. Under current legislation, however, the need for separate accounts is eliminated.

Many self-employed business owners Minimum Distributions have established a SEP IRA that allows annual contributions of up to 25% of compensation, not to exceed \$42,000 for 2005, whichever is less. Except for the larger contribution limits, these accounts operate similarly to traditional IRAs. In fact, a business owner can contribute the maximum SEP and traditional IRA amounts into the same account.

Roth IRA distributions are tax-free provided the owner is age 591/2 or older and five years have elapsed since the first Roth Member SIPC.

Because nondeductible contributions may contribution or conversion was transacted. Under the original rules, a separate fiveyear holding period was required for both contributions and conversions. Recently, the five-year period was combined and begins upon the first contribution or conversion. Consideration can be given to consolidation of Roth IRAs.

For IRA owners with multiple beneficiary designations, the old distribution regulations mandated that distributions would be based upon the life expectancy of the oldest beneficiary. Again, regulations changed this rule, eliminating the need for an IRA owner to establish multiple accounts to accommodate various beneficiaries.



For any investment portfolio, it is impor- characteristics your goals required tant to determine an appropriate asset allocation, which simply means diversifying investments over a broad range of asset classes. Your asset allocation should be based on your time horizon and risk tolerance. However, this does not signal the end of the investment process. Without periodically reviewing your asset allocation, your original plan can drift off in a way you had never intended.

What is rebalancing?

Rebalancing is the periodic adjustment of a portfolio to restore the original asset allocation mix. The need for rebalancing comes from one asset class in a portfolio outperforming another. Not all asset classes provide the same annual return, which is the whole reason for asset allocation in the first place. Over time some asset classes tend to grow or shrink, beyond the allowable range you established in your investment policy statement. When this happens, it's time to rebalance and bring your portfolio back to your original target allocation. Unfortunately, many investors fail to recognize the benefits of rebalancing a portfolio. These investors view rebalancing as selling off the securities that have done the best, and buying more of the securities that have under-performed. In reality, there are advantages to rebal-

· Provides a built-in "sell high/buy low" signal that may enhance returns over time

How often should you rebalance?

You should review your asset allocation at least annually, although quarterly is more common. If you find your portfolio has drifted significantly from your desired allocation, usually defined at +/- five percentage points from the original allocation, it's probably time to rebalance. As part of your rebalancing discussions with your advisor, you may even determine that your personal situation has changed, and that a new target allocation is appropriate. Rebalancing should be standard procedure for every investor. Regardless of your risk tolerance or time horizon, maintaining an appropriate asset allocation can help you reach your stated objectives.

Are there tax considerations?

Rebalancing can trigger taxable events. You are strongly advised to seek advice from competent legal and tax counsel to determine the applicability of this information to your estate and financial planning decisions.



• Clean Up Your Act—Remove all leaves and debris from your beds and lawn areas. If you never got around to trimming or pruning your shrubs at the end of last season, you may consider doing this prior to debris removal.
