

#### **Protecting Your Legal Rights—Illinois** Workers' Compensation Act: Injury Illness and Employment by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

On Jan. 1, the Industrial Commission changed its name to the Illinois Workers Compensation Commission. Workers' compensation is a no-fault system of benefits paid by employers to workers who experience job-related injuries or diseases. Workers may also be compensated for the aggravation of a pre-existing condition. Injuries are accidental if they happen unexpectedly, without plan or design. This includes injuries brought on by a repetitive use of a part of the body, as well as strokes, heart attacks or any other



The employee is entitled to receive all necessary first aid, medical, surgical and hospital services reasonably required to cure or relieve the effects of the injury or disease. Employees that lose time from work in order to recover from the injury or disease are entitled to receive weekly payments until they are able to return to work that is reasonably available to them. Additional benefits are provided when an employee has sustained an injury or disease which results in permanent disability or scarring or other disfigurement. It is against the law for the employer to harass, discharge, refuse, rehire or, in any way, discriminate against an employee from exercising his or her rights under the Workers' Compensation Act. Such conduct by an employer may provide a cause of action for retaliatory discharge and a separate suit for damages

Additionally, if an employee is injured or suffers serious illness, numerous federal and state laws may be implicated such as The Family and Medical Leave Act a given work site to provide up to 12 ton Area Professional Women.

In addition to the FMLA, The Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) may also apply in the situation where an employee suffers from a permanent disability as a result of an injury or illness, whether it occurs on or off the job. Moreover, the employer may provide the employee with an insurance policy which provides coverage for a short-term or long-term disability.

The Barrington Area Arts Council is pleased to announce the opening of Terrence Karpowicz: Craftsmanship, Materials, Geometry" on Friday, June 3, at the BAAC Gallery at Barrington Commons Court. The compelling sculpture exhibition is the work of accomplished sculptor Terrence Karpowicz of Chicago.

Terrence Karpowicz studied art when the theories and practices of minimalism and conceptualism dominated the art world. After receiving a master's in fine arts degree from the University of Illinois, he was awarded a Fulbright-Hayes grant to study in the United Kingdom. While there, he served as a millwright's apprentice, discovering the beauty and craftsmanship of watermill and windmill construction. This understanding of the traditional techniques of joinery and his interest in the interactions of wind, water and gravity on natural materials are evident throughout his work.

Karpowicz is drawn to tension at the point of contact, the joint, between disparate materials. By joining irregular, organic materials such as wood limbs or granite shards to machine-tooled geometric shapes of metal, he creates actual or implied kinetic relationships among the elements of the sculpture. The various ways in which these unlike materials interact with each other mark the artist's relationship to his world. Oak and granite nesting in congruent harmony, stainless steel orbs spinning within walnut ellipses, granite shards twisting against armatures of steel -all elements held together with Karpowicz's signature dedication to refined and skillful craftsmanship.



#### What to Consider When Evaluating an Asset Management Firm

important factors—not simply past performance. Investors should carefully consider a firm's overall investment philosophy and process, its buy and sell disciplines, and the experience and qualifications of its key investment personnel, among other important criteria.

The education, credentials and experience of a firm's investment professionals as well as their ability to work together as a team is very important. An inexperienced team, or one with a high degree of changes, may be unable to meet the challenges of a volatile investment climate.

Sound portfolio construction rules may include specific diversification requirements, sector constraints or review procedures. A loosely defined sell discipline or overly broad investment guidelines could damage performance over time.

Investment managers should have a plan that assigns qualified personnel to specific tasks, delegates duties appropriately and ensures adequate supervision. Is the firm able to produce original investment ideas? Or does it simply collect large quantities of information from other sources?



#### **Zuni Animals That Protect, Heal** and Help Their Owners


For the people of Zuni Pueblo in New Mexico, fetish carving is an art that is passed down from generation to generation. It is a way for the Zuni to pay respect to their heritage and to supplement their income through a constantly evolving art form.

The Zuni people (A:shiwi) have venerated fetishes, or objects in the shape of animals, for at least 1,000 years. They believe a fetish is imbued with the spirits of powerful beings that will protect, heal and help their owners.

In the old days, Zuni hunters and holy men would collect a stone, bone or piece of wood that resembled an animal. Often, inlaid eyes were added or the tiny animal bound with feathers or an arrowhead, which represented lightening, then blessed, creating a sacred icon.

In the Zuni religion, the Warrior Twins used lightening to transform beasts into shriveled stone miniatures and trapped their spirits inside the stone to be used for the good of the people.

A sacred fetish would never be sold, but might be given to a child to learn about stone by the leading Zuni carvers. Zuni religion.



Small stone animals heal and protect, according to Zuni belief.

When fetishes are sold today, they are not blessed, but many believe they still aid the owner by instilling qualities of the various animals.







#### **Gum Recession—What Does it Mean?**

Exposed roots are the result of gum recession, not the natural aging process. There are many factors that contribute to a receding gumline. First, receding gums may be caused by bone loss beneath the gums, which cannot be seen. The supporting bone of the tooth could be deteriorating without the patient realizing it. "When people step through the gate, we want them to feel like they're slipping back 100 years," says Suzanne Branding about her vintage home along the shores of Lake Zurich.







#### Daria Sapp Receives Citizens for Conservation's William H. Miller **Conservation Award**

At its recent annual meeting, Citizens for Conservation awarded its highest honor, the William H. Miller Conservation Award, to Daria Sapp.

She was on CFC's Prairie Committee in the mid-'80s and helped make the momentous decision to recreate a prairie on the old farmland, which is now known as Grigsby Prairie. She initiated CFC's restoration program, now a model among restoration programs, by organizing a group of callers, including herself, to call all CFC members to collect seed three times a week-Thursday, Saturday and Sunday-in the fall of 1986. This schedule continues for CFC restoration workers rectors over five years, serving as restoration chairman and vice president.
