

The Woodstock Mozart Festival's 19th Season Opens July 30

The Woodstock Mozart Festival's 19th season opens on Saturday evening, July 30, and will continue through Sunday, Aug. 14, at the Woodstock Opera House in Woodstock, Ill.

Each weekend features 8 p.m. Saturday evening and 3 p.m. Sunday afternoon orchestral concerts preceded by artist and conductor introductions, which begin one hour before each performance. A 2 p.m. chamber music sampler concert on Saturday afternoon, Aug. 13, will replace the preconcert discussions during the third and final weekend of the festival.

July 30 and 31

For July 30 and 31, conductor Gregory Vajda will be joined by pianist Hamish Milne. In keeping with one of the goals of the festival—to feature composers who influenced Mozart-the program will begin with Carl Philipp Emmanual Bach's Symphony in D Major, Wq. 183, No. 1. This work will be followed by Mozart's 17th Piano Concerto in G Major, K. 453; and by his 31st Symphony in D Major, K. 297 (300a), the "Paris Symphony. Prokofiev's first Symphony in D Major, Op. 25, the "Classical Symphony,"—called by La Revue de France, 1927, as "a sort of unpublished Mozart"-will conclude the program.

This season marks the second appearance of conductor Gregory Vajda with the festival. Originally from Budapest where he was music director of the New Theater Budapest and founder of the Arts Summer Festival in Hungary as well as permanent guest conductor of the Hungarian State Opera, Mr. Vajda is now the assistant conductor of the Milwaukee Symphony Orchestra. He has appeared as a guest conductor with several orchestras in North America including the St. Paul Chamber Orchestra, Calgary Philharmonic, Oregon Symphony and Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra. He led the Opera de Montreal in Bartok's Bluebeard's Castle and Schoenberg's Erwartung in 2004, and frequently appears with the Ensemble Intercomtemporain in Paris. Past and upcoming festival appearances include those of Avignon, Strassbourg, Round Top in Texas, Mostly Mozart in New York and Grant Park in

Pianist Hamish Milne has appeared as soloist with most of the leading British orchestras and has given over 200 broadcasts for the BBC. Overseas engagements in recent years have taken him to Australia, Japan, the United States, Africa and several countries of the former Soviet stock, Illinois, 60098.

A specialist on the music of the Russian composer Nikolai Medtner, Mr. Milne has documented Medtner's works on nine recordings and has been featured in the Medtner Festivals held in Moscow and at New York's Bargememusic. Currently a member of the Pro Arte Piano Ouartet and the Academy of St. Martin-inthe-Fields Chamber Ensemble, Mr. Milne is also a professor at the Royal Academy of Music and at the University of London.

Bristol Renaissance Faire to Open July 9

The sound of pounding hooves and clashing armor and the aroma of roasting turkey legs will again permeate the woods at the Illinois-Wisconsin border when the Bristol Renaissance Faire opens for its 18th season, weekends from July 9 through Labor Day, Sept. 5.

Widely recognized as one of the country's top Renaissance fairs, Bristol welcomed nearly 200,000 guests in 2004, each of whom walked away with a personal piece of the Renaissance-whether it be a hand-thrown vase or the memory of a witty barb exchanged with the village jester.

"The 16th century was a time of great beauty, art and music... and infighting, and treachery, and indulgence," said Linda McFeters, general manager of the Bristol Renaissance Faire. "We've got it all (and 30 acres in which it can all joyously coexist)!"

Sometimes bawdy but basically benign, the Bristol Renaissance Faire captivates visitors with an unparalleled spectrum of experiences, from unabashed revelry to first-rate people watching. For those who want to check their inhibitions at the gate, there's ample opportunity to whoop and holler at jousting knights, get down and dirty with raucous, earthclad mud beggars, or hurl a ripe tomato at a blustering braggart. Those inclined toward more serene pursuits will find a comparable bounty of enjoyments, from watching glassblowers create one-of-a-kind works of art, to joining in a round of 16th century court dancing or listening to the dulcet harmonies of world-class singers.

The Faire's Kids Kingdom is an enclosed play area filled with oversized sandboxes, a huge climb-aboard pirate ship, and a cast of fable-favorite characters presiding over a full day of interactive games, crafts and other child-friendly diversions. Each afternoon during the daily knighting ceremony, Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth herself visits the kingdom to make knights and ladies of all waiting children.

Sixteen entertainment stages feature nonstop music and merriment. The Minstrels of Mayhem deliver rousing songs and spirited tales of adventure, and MooNiE the Magnif Cent masters mind over matter in amazing displays of rope walking and fire juggling. Among this summer's special musical guests are: Owain Phyfe of the New World Renaissance Band on the weekends of July 9 and 16; the Bard O'Neill, July 30 through Aug. 14; and folk singers Pint & Dale on the final three weekends

New for 2005, an all-out musical blowout in the Cheshire Chase Action Theatre will end each day with a rollicking ensemble performance by scores of faire singers, instrumentalists and other colorful characters. Robin Hood-one of the most popular inhabitants of Bristol since he and his streetfighting band of merry men made their first appearance in 2003 -will lead the revelry; and as with almost everything else at the faire, the audience will get in on the act.

Among more than 1,200 period performers and merchants who make the Bristol Renaissance Faire their home each summer, a wide variety of artisans display wares in more than 175 shops, tents and carts in the marketplace. From fine handmade jewelry and handworked leather to hickory longbows and authentic armor, visitors strolling the shady lanes of the village can't help but discover must-have treasures around every corner. Renowned for its diverse offerings, the Bristol Renaissance Faire Marketplace continues to be an enchanting place to explore.

Then there's the food! Fresh roasted turkey legs, fish and chips, garlic sauteed mushrooms, corn on the cob, steak sandwiches, savory grilled chicken, ice cream, fruit crêpes and other delicacies tempt fairegoers to bring their royal appetites and leave their willpower at home.

Located just west of I-94's Russell Road exit, the Bristol Renaissance Faire will be open rain or shine, 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. every Saturday and Sunday, July 9 through Sept. 4, and on Labor Day, Sept. 5. Protecting Your Legal Rights— Harassment and Retaliation in the Workplace

Harassment is generally defined as unwelcome conduct which adversely affects an individual's employment by unreasonably interfering with an employee's work performance or conduct which creates an intimidating, hostile or offensive work environment. The federal antidiscrimination statutes such as Title VII (race, gender, religion or national origin), the Age Discrimination in Employment Act (an employee over 40) and the Americans with Disabilities Act are created to protect employees from illegal discrimination and

policy against harassment, which is generally distributed to employees. The antiharassment policy should direct the employee as to whom to complain regarding the offensive conduct without fear of retaliation. After receipt of the compliant, the employer is legally obligated to investigate the allegations and take prompt remedial action to stop the harassing behavior. An employer can be held liable if prompt remedial action is not taken to stop the offensive behavior.

Additionally, any adverse action by the employer against the employee for reporting the harassing conduct can subject the company to legal action for retaliation. Terminating an employee because of a complaint of harassment is a violation of certain state and federal laws and is known as retaliatory discharge. Also, if an employee complains of discriminatory conduct and then is demoted, terminated or otherwise adversely treated by the employer because of that complaint, then the employee would have a valid claim of retaliation. Damages for harassment and retaliation can subject an employer to a federal or state court action for damages


including the employee's lost wages, benefits, attorney's fees, costs, compensatory and punitive damages.

If you believe that you were terminated or adversely treated for making a complaint of harassment, you are well advised to promptly seek legal advice. In order to pursue a case for harassment or retaliation, most often a Charge of Discrimination must be filed with the state or federal administrative agency. Because quick action is required as the time limitations are strict, I encourage you not to delay receiving information regarding your legal rights. Facelift Surgery

Most people who are familiar with modern facelifts and other facial cosmetic procedures are aware of their important benefits, in terms of improved appearance as well as self-esteem. However, many people who are good candidates for these procedures may be reluctant to actually have them out of fear of the pro-

They fear that they might experience pain during the surgery, or that recovery might bring pain or discomfort, or that it might take too long to heal, or that they might find some other aspect of the surgery unacceptable. What are Lumineers and DaVinci Veneers?

The recent popularity of ABC's Extreme Makeover and The Swan has prompted dental manufacturers to capitalize on the publicity. Patients are showing up in dental offices around the country with information on cosmetic procedures that they get from the Internet, television or magazines. Two of the major marketers are Lumineers and DaVinci veneers.

Lumineers are porcelain veneers that are made from porcelain produced by the Cerinate Company. Their marketing suggests that their veneers are so thin, no tooth structure needs to be removed. The patient can visit their dentist, and with just a simple impression, a full set of veneers can be fabricated and bonded directly to the unprepared teeth. While this sounds like a great concept, there are very few people that are actually good candidates for this type of procedure. The patient would have to have large spaces between their front teeth and their teeth would have to have a "peg" appearance to them. Trying to put Lumineers on normally shaped teeth that have normal contacts between them will make the teeth feel bulkier and will not allow for reshaping and coloring in the areas where the teeth touch one another.

While Cerinate is an excellent company, they are not the only ones that produce porcelain for veneers. The others also make "contact-lens thin" veneers. The major concern for the patient should not be the type of porcelain but rather the laboratory that fabricates the veneers. The artistry involved in making a lifelike veneer is extensive. Asking for a specific brand of porcelain will not guarantee a natural and lifelike appearance. If that were true, then all of the artists that bought their painting supplies from the same place that Picasso did would be

The term "DaVinci Veneers" was popularized by Dr. Bill Dorfman. When he did makeovers on ABC, he would describe the porcelain veneers as being "DaVinci Veneers." DaVinci was not a type of veneer but was actually the name of the dental laboratory that was fabricating the veneers for Dr. Dorfman. The DaVinci Dental Studio is based out of California and has been providing excellent work for years. To capitalize on the popularity, a marketing group was formed that uses the DaVinci name. A dentist can visit their Web site at www.davinciveneers.com and sign up in the area that is marked "For Professionals." For \$950 a month, the DaVinci Group will provide the dentist with marketing material, patient referrals and a list of about 40 different dental labs around the country that are now part of the program. DaVinci will also help the dentist provide financing for the patient's cosmetic dentistry.

If you are thinking about cosmetic dentistry, talk to your dentist and ask him for guidance. The marketing can be confusing, and he is the best source for facts about the final product. Don't let all the hype keep you from getting the new smile you've always wanted.








Gum Recession—What Does it Mean?

Exposed roots are the result of gum recession, not the natural aging process. There are many factors that contribute to a receding gumline. First, receding gums may be caused by bone loss beneath the gums, which cannot be seen. The supporting bone of the tooth could be deteriorating without the patient realizing it. Periodontal disease (bacterial infection) is most often painless and needs a dentist to diagnose the problem by X-rays and a clinical examination. Tempel Lipizzan Performances to Salute U.S. Military and Dramatic World War II Rescue of Prized Horses

Among this summer's 60th anniversary commemorations of the conclusion of World War II, perhaps none will tell a more intriguing story than that of the Tempel Lipizzan stallions. During public performances on Wednesdays at 10:30 a.m. and Sundays at 1:00 p.m., now to Aug. 31 in northern Lake County, the "dancing white stallions" will demonstrate the unique attributes of a breed so treasured by Gen. George S. Patton that he staged a dramatic military rescue to save

Revered in Europe for centuries for their unusual combination of beauty, strength and intelligence, Lipizzans are best known for Pegasus-like leaps and lifts called "Airs Above the Ground." During a 90-minute program set to classical music, the Tempel Lipizzan performances will follow the horses' training progression from newest foals frolicking around the arena to the highly refined Quadrille or "Ballet of the White Stallions," in which four highly trained adult horses perform difficult, dancelike movements in exquisite unison. In the crowd-pleasing "Airs Above the Ground," talented stallions will demonstrate the blend of physical strength and suppleness that make Lipizzans one of few breeds able to perform these gravitydefying leaps and lifts.

As a special tribute to the American military's role in the Lipizzans' World War II rescue, one veteran will be selected during each performance for a ceremonial entrance in a Lipizzan-drawn carriage. Half-price tickets will be available to all veterans of foreign wars throughout the summer performance season.

It was in the closing days of World War II that Patton learned of Lipizzan horses from Europe's breeding farms being held as prisoners of war by German troops in Hostau, Czechoslovakia. A venerable cavalry officer and Olympic equestrian, Patton ordered a daring two-fold military mission first to liberate the town and its horses and then to move the Lipizzans out of the path of the rapidly advancing Soviet Red Army, which would have destroyed them. This action is credited with protecting the rare breed from probable extinction.

Months later as the war in Europe and the Pacific ended, Patton rode a Lipizzan during the restoration ceremonies. That particular Lipizzan carried more than




A Tempel Lipizzan stallion demonstrates a levade.

Patton, it carried strong symbolism: The horse had been selected by Adolf Hitler to be presented to Emperor Hirohito of Japan if the Axis powers had prevailed.

Patton's unprecedented action found a worldwide audience with the 1963 Disney movie Miracle of the White Stallions, which recounts the World War II rescue. Even earlier, it captured the attention of Chicago industrialist Tempel Smith and his wife, Esther, who in 1958 began a year of highly sensitive negotiations with the Austrian government to import 20 Lipizzans to America. Tempel Farms in Wadsworth, Ill., soon became home to the largest privately owned herd of Lipizzans anywhere. In the past 47 years, there have been more than 850 foals born at Tempel Farms, which remains one of only a few places in the world where rare Lipizzan horses are bred, trained and perform on the same property.

Tempel Farms is a 50-minute drive from either Chicago or Milwaukee, near Great America and the Gurnee Mills Mall. Tickets are available at the gate. Prices are \$16 for adults, \$14 for senior citizens and \$9 for children, ages 4 through 14. Any veteran of a foreign war may present appropriate military identification (including America Legion, VFW, honorable discharge or Veterans Administration hospital card) to receive half-price tickets.
