





In 2004 alone, over 129 persons ranging in age from newborn to 60 were assisted in reaching their goal of avoiding or overcoming homelessness. Also in 2004, the acquisition of four more housing units has enabled Home of The Sparrow to finally realize a long-term goal of being able to offer these services to mothers with teenage boys (ages 13 to 17 years). Facilities are at 100% capacity.

Protecting Your Legal Rights— **Defamation in the Workplace**

Defamation is legally defined as a false statement concerning an individual for which there is an unprivileged publication of the defamatory statement to a third party, and the individual is damaged. Under Illinois common law, four categories of statements are considered defamatory per se: (1) words that impute the commission of a criminal offense; (2) words that impute infection with a loathsome, communicable disease; (3) words that impute an inability to perform or want of integemployment; and (4) words that prejudice or her trade, profession or business. to advance in the employment context, the Illinois Appellate Court recently held that an employer was liable for defamation where an employer failed to conduct an investigation of charges brought against an in his termination.

In that case, the employee's supervisor behavior during a performance review, and the supervisor prepared an internal memorandum which claimed that the plaintiff used profanity. Relying on the memorandum but conducting no investigation into the supervisor's claims, the employer terminated the plaintiff for poor performance. At trial, the plaintiff, a longstanding employee with an excellent performance record, denied his supervisor's allegations. The employer defended the action by claiming that internal corporate documents are privileged and thus cannot constitute a defamatory statement. However, the court found that while internal company communications generally are situation. protected by privilege, this privilege can be lost if there is a direct intention to injure the employee or there is a reckless disregard to the employee's rights. Computer imaging software has worked its way into dental offices. The dentist can take an image of his patient and make a limitless amount of changes to the teeth. A completely new set of teeth can even be introduced into the image. Patients can now see what they will look like, and for the first time they can be involved in the esthetic decision.

Once the image is approved, it is e-mailed to the dental laboratory and technicians use it as a guide for creating a 3-D model. This model is then used to make temporary veneers or crowns that will fit onto the patient's teeth. Now the patient can feel what the new teeth will be like. made, the patient can advise the dentist at the next appointment. The temporary teeth can be made longer, shorter, wider, flared in and out, or whatever else is required to satisfy the patient's esthetic and phonetic requirements. The Healing Process

Patients frequently become nervous during the healing phase following a surgical procedure. They see certain changes in the affected areas which are actually quite normal and predictable. It is helpful if patients are aware of these normal changes and the reasons for them, as it will help them feel more relaxed about the final outcome of the procedure.

Any surgical or traumatic injury to the skin and soft tissue results in the same steps of healing. There is an initial release of enzymes from the damaged tissue which starts the healing process. These enzymes actually cause inflammation, without which there would be no healing. This is the start of the first phase of healing called the "proliferative phase." During this phase, the tissue proliferates or buildsup. The ultimate goal of this phase is the buildup of collagen, which in turn mends and binds the tissue. The human body is very efficient and therefore very quickly binds the tissue with a crude form of collagen which is thick and bulky. In addition to the buildup of collagen, new blood vessels form, which explains why scars are pink at first. Also, many white blood cells, other repair cells and inflammatory components rush into the tissue. This causes swelling and a thickening where the incision or surgery was performed. The proliferative phase of healing lasts for approximately four to six weeks.

After this, the second phase of healing, the "remodeling phase," begins. During this period of time, the collagen that was produced in the first four to six weeks is broken down by the body's enzymes and reabsorbed while replaced by a finer, have any questions regarding facial plassofter and thinner collagen. 
this time that the blood vessels that formed during the proliferative phase shrink and disappear from the wound, which explains why scars fade over time. In facial wounds, much of the remodeling phase happens in approximately eight weeks. While three months after the initial trauma or procedure, facial scars are much softer and smoother, full maturation of a scar can take nine months to a year.

Our typical follow-up for patients is in one month, so that we can see the healing of the wound when it reaches the peak of the proliferative phase, and then again in two months, after the end of the remodeling phase.

It can be helpful and reassuring to patients to realize that there are sound, scientific principles behind much of what we do in our practice of medicine. When patients understand the natural course of healing and what to expect, they are less anxious about their recovery from facial surgery. We always try to educate our patients so their concerns are addressed and their fears are minimized.

Salvation Army Relief Efforts Continue in Response to Hurricane Katrina

From California to Maryland, The Salvation Army is assisting Hurricane Katrina survivors who have evacuated or been relocated to communities throughout the nation. It is estimated that The Salvation Army is meeting the immediate needs of at least 500,000 people in directly impacted areas. In addition, The Salvation Army is working closely with federal, state and local governments as well as faith-based and nonfaith-based organizations to determine and meet the needs of disaster survivors across the country.

The Salvation Army has 76 emergency disaster services vehicles (canteens) serving in Alabama, Louisiana and Mississippi alone.

In Mississippi, 33 Salvation Army canteens and seven Southern Baptist feeding kitchens are currently serving along the Gulf Coast, and The Salvation Army has established a command center in Biloxi.

"As more people return to the area, we expect that our feeding operations in the Gulf Coast will reach 100,000 meals a day in the Long Beach, Miss., area and 50,000 in the Biloxi, Miss., area," said Major Darryl Kingsbury, incident commander for The Salvation Army's relief efforts in Alabama, Louisiana and Mississippi.

The Salvation Army is coordinating its efforts in Louisiana through a command center in Baton Rouge. Twenty Salvation Army canteens are serving hurricane survivors in New Orleans and the surrounding communities.

From California to Maryland, The Salvation Army is assisting Hurricane Katrina survivors who have evacuated or been relocated to communities throughout the nation. It is estimated that The Salvation

As disaster survivors continue to be relocated, The Salvation Army in surrounding states is working with local governments and other aid organizations to assist people in looking for shelter and food.

The Salvation Army in Arkansas and Oklahoma is working with state emergency operation centers to provide aid to disaster survivors who have come to those states, including assisting disaster survivors who are being housed at Camp Gruber near Tulsa, Okla. Two canteens are providing food service there, and The Salvation army is working with the YMCA to coordinate activities for children, including providing toys. In addition, Salvation Army officers (ministers) are providing pastoral care.

The Salvation Army is also providing clothing to survivors in Davis, Okla., and food service to the 25,000 survivors and 250 personnel at Fort Chaffee near Little Rock, Ark.

In Houston, Texas, Salvation Army personnel continue to support feeding operations with seven canteens stationed outside the Astrodome. The Salvation Army is also providing food to survivors who are being sheltered in large arenas in Dallas and San Antonio.

The Salvation Army is responding in the Carolinas as well. Survivors with medical needs are being sent to the Columbia Airport in South Carolina, where The Salvation Army is providing meals to patients, staff and families.

Our Local Trees Suffer Damage

The weather conditions of 2004 and 2005 have placed many of our local trees in serious stress. Symptoms of this stress have been showing up as early fall color, yellow/brown leaves and premature leaf drop. Plants that were already weak from last year are at the most risk of damage or possible death. It may take years before the full extent of these abnormal weather conditions are evident.

Here's What Happened

Late spring 2004 produced record rainfalls, which gave rise to an increased outbreak of diseases. The heavy rains also saturated our soils, cutting off vital oxygen to the roots, forcing them to grow towards the surface. Shallow roots were unable to get moisture deep in the soil. Summer and fall brought on drought conditions, that caused even more stress and root damage to these already weak plants.

Spring 2005 left us with below average rainfall at a critical time when plants require large amounts of moisture to develop new roots and leaves. Most root systems were ill prepared for the summer months ahead, let alone the drought of 2005 which went down on record as being the sixth driest in the last 100 years. This drought resulted in further stress, root loss and tree decline.






Illinois State Treasurer Judy Baar Topinka Celebrates Disability Act Anniversary




