





Employment Anti-Harassment Policies and Training by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

The United States Supreme Court has addressed the importance of the language of employer policies and handbooks as it relates the issues of discrimination, harassment and retaliation. A written policy against harassment can help protect the employee and employer in certain cases involving discrimination and harassment. In accordance with the guidelines provided by the U.S. Equal Employment Opportunity Commission, it is recommended that employers have an anti-harassment policy that is properly worded and distributed to all employees. The policy should inform the employee as to what constitutes illegal discrimination, harassment, and retaliation, and where to make a complaint if they are a victim of discrimination or harassment.

While a written anti-harassment policy is the first step, providing employee training is an excellent way to educate employees as to the provisions of the anti-harassment policy. An individual knowledgeable about the laws against harassment and discrimination should train all employees including supervisors in the provisions of the policy. The training should also include a discussion of the written policy, advice to employees regarding the complaint process and assurance that the complaint will be investigated without fear of retaliation. The training should include both identifying the discriminatory behavior and instruction to those charged with the duty to conduct a proper investigation and to stop the discriminatory or harassing con-



If the policy is properly prepared and distributed to employees, in some situations the anti-harassment policy can be used to defend the employer where the employee legally pursues a claim for harassment but fails to inform the employer of the complaint as directed by the policy. To the contrary, if the employer fails to appropriately respond to the employee complaint of harassment or retaliates against the employee for making a complaint, the employer can be subject to liability under state and federal statutes. Peterson: Senate Approves All Kids Yet Proposal Leaves Much to be Desired

Despite mounting concerns over the timing, the cost and the lack of detail contained in Governor Blagojevich's "All Kids" proposal, the Senate hastily passed the measure, according to State Senator Bill Peterson (R-Buffalo Grove).

"All Kids' has a wonderful objective, until you scratch below the surface and find serious problems with the actual bill that passed," said Peterson. "These problems, among others, include the timing of the proposal, the cost of the proposal, the absence of meaningful discussion and debate on the proposal, and the lack of details in the actual bill.

Peterson explained that Medicaid's current financial condition is in a crisis state. with \$17 billion in unpaid bills—an alltime high in Illinois. Medical providers, consequently, are being forced to carry the state's financial burdens on their own backs, despite the fact that payments made to providers are already well below what is paid by other insurers and often fall below the actual cost of rendering

Furthermore, the proposal is coming at a time when the governor is pushing for the state to borrow over \$1 billion to pay down just half the backlog of bills owed

Facelift Surgery

tually needed, and I had to juggle some other things in my life.

• Was the procedure itself painful? No, I didn't feel anything. I really don't recall a thing about it.

• What was your recovery like?

I think that my recovery was phenomenal. I had the surgery on a Tuesday and we had a family party the following Sunday. I will admit that it was in a kind of controlled light, evening situation. But my daughter, who is a young woman, didn't notice anything, so I think that's a pretty good indication. By seven days, I was totally, totally functional. I had a little bit of concern about sleeping in a balanced way. I would sleep on my back. And then, after I slept on my left side, I would try to sleep the same amount on my right side. Other than that, I would say that I had barely any discomfort. I had very little bruising—very, very little bruising. It was a very positive experience, both spiritually and in a more concrete, tangible way.

· Would you go through it again?

In a minute. There is probably not a whole lot that I would do differently, except that I wouldn't tell anybody up front. Because in four or five days, no one would ever know.



Peterson's greatest objection stems from the governor's rush to vote on a plan of this magnitude, giving lawmakers only six days to analyze the details of this legislation. Peterson also pointed to the lack of substantive detail in the actual bill as a barrier preventing him from voting in favor of the plan.

"This bill was rammed down our throats with no substantive hearings, no bipartisan input and no serious analysis of the savings and costs," said Peterson. "It is irresponsible of us as elected officials to vote on something without asking all the tough questions, examining all the details and analyzing all the numbers—even if it is on something as commendable as

End-of-Year Tax-Planning Tips

Looking for ways to help slash your tax bill? Now's your chance

If you have realized sizable gains this year, you may be able to reduce your capital gains tax bill by selling off losing investments. Losses can offset capital gains dollar for dollar, with no maximum. If your losses exceed your gains, you may use up to \$3,000 in losses to offset ordinary income taxes in one year. The remaining losses may be carried forward to future years to offset capital gains.

A word of caution: Only sell off a loser if you are sure it's no longer a good investment. Over the long run, the benefit of a good investment can far outweigh the advantage of reducing your capital gains tax bill. Keep in mind that once you sell a stock, you cannot turn around and buy it again for 30 days thanks to the so-called wash-sale rules.

Maximize your contributions to 401ks, IRAs and other tax-favored accounts. Because 401k contributions are made with pre-tax dollars, the more you contribute, the less your taxable income will be. What's more, you'll also have more money potentially growing tax-deferred in years to come. Your 401k contributions must be made by year's end to count on your 2005 tax return. The maximum for 2005 is \$14,000 or \$18,000 if you are 50 or older. You have until April 15, 2006, or your extended tax-filing deadline to contribute to an IRA.

Whether you give a cash contribution to hurricane Katrina victims or a bag of clothes to your local goodwill, to get a tax deduction on your 2005 tax return, you must make the contribution before Dec. 31. You can get a double benefit if you give appreciated stock that you have held for more than one year rather than cash. That way, you avoid a future capital gains tax bill, and the charity doesn't have to pay it—under tax rules, capital gains taxes are waived for charities.

Gum Recession—What Does it Mean?

Exposed roots are the result of gum recession, not the natural aging process. There are many factors that contribute to a receding gumline. First, receding gums may be caused by bone loss beneath the gums, which cannot be seen. The supporting bone of the tooth could be deteriorating without the patient realizing it. Periodontal disease (bacterial infection) is most often painless and needs a dentist to diagnose the problem by X-rays and a clinical examination. Second, a receding gumline may be caused by a lack of strong gum tissue around the tooth. Genetics play a role in having strong or weak gum tissue surrounding particular teeth. Everyday brushing and chewing can make weak receding gum tissue even worse. Aggressive tooth brushing can damage fragile gum tissue as well.


Form, Function—Fabulous!
