
Santa Claus came to town a little early this

Domestic abuse victim and recent Sparrow graduate Stephanie put a personal face on the program by relating the experience of suddenly finding herself and her three small children homeless. Desperate to create a better lifestyle, she was relieved to be admitted to Home of The Sparrow, and expressed appreciation for the opportunity thereby afforded to overcome the situation. Now employed, she has recently achieved the goal of buying her own home!

The home's executive director, the Rev Karen Stunkel, reported that 84 individuals are housed each night in Sparrow shelters, which are located in Crystal Lake,

Palatine and McHenry. In addition, at least another 20 persons receive mentoring, while staff also handles about 1,400 crisis calls annually requiring some type of supportive service referral. Clearly, volunteer generosity has made a huge difference and is crucial to program continuation.

## **Federal Court Finds Discrimination Laws** Apply to Protect Employee from Harassment by Independent Contractors

With few exceptions, employment laws apply only to employees and not to independent contractors. Federal and state laws vary regarding the criteria to determine legally whether an individual is considered an independent contractor or an employee. Generally, an independent contractor is an individual that performs services free from the direction and control of the company with regard to both the manner and method used to perform the work. Because the designation of an individual as an independent contractor has significant legal consequences for the individual and the business, the relationcontract should be prepared which details the terms of the relationship.

The determination is important since, unlike an employee, an independent contractor is not eligible for overtime pay, benefits, unemployment or workers' compensation benefits. Moreover, an independent contractor is exempt from protection under the federal and state laws that protect employees against discrimination. These laws include Title VII (race, color, religion, sex or national origin), the Age Discrimination in Employment Act (40 years of age or older) and the Americans with Disabilities Act. However, an Illinois Federal Court recently ruled that protection against workplace harassment under Title VII did apply to hold a company liable for the actions of its independent contractor where the company knew or should have known of the harassment against the employee.

In Dunn vs. Washington County Hospi-7th Circuit Court of Appeals held that the employer was responsible for the protection of its own employees and the desig-



contractor was irrelevant if the employer failed to respond to the complaints of the employee. The recent decision reiterates ship should be carefully analyzed and a a now long-standing opinion of the United States Supreme Court, which outlined the importance for employers to have a written policy against harassment that is distributed to all employees. The policy should inform the employee as to what constitutes illegal discrimination and where to make a complaint if they are a victim of discrimination or harassment by another employee, an independent contractor or a customer. Importantly, once the harassment is known, the employer has a legal duty to stop the behavior. For additional information regarding discrimination, please visit www.joettedoran.com.

## **Keeping Your Home in Perspective**



**per-spec-tive** n. The relationship of aspects of a subject to each other and to a whole

"Seeing the forest for the trees"; interior design constantly challenges the creative mind to see the forest and the trees. Even when I'm designing the interior for a 20,000-square-foot mansion, I try to keep that mantra in mind. You need to start with the forest (room use, space planning, lifestyle...) and complete the design with the trees (furnishings, lighting, accessories...). Grand homes and grand rooms may create grand interior design issues if you don't keep a few simple ideas in mind as you envision your dream home and keep it all in perspective.

Where I find myself helping my clients the most is with regard to the scale of the various items that will comprise the living area. These include furnishings, window treatments, lighting, accessories and color. Each item must be carefully planned for and selected to make an oversized room feel warm and inviting. Move too quickly and you might be left with a cave-like room with all the warmth of an igloo.

Before selecting furnishings for a room, space planning is critical. I typically work with my client to decide on seating requirements and room flow first. Oversized rooms provide tremendous opportunities to be creative. But you must first have a clear vision for how you will use the

#### **Furnishings**

It may sound simplistic, however, select furnishings larger in scale rather than size. The piece must look proportionate for the space. For example, upholstered furniture should use larger scale prints as opposed to smaller miniprints. Choose a high-back sofa with big fluffy cushions vs. a lowback tailored or petite sofa.

#### Window Treatments

Exotic window shapes and two-story windows are the norm for these oversized rooms. You need to be thinking in terms of color, style and fabric types to make the treatment work. I recently completed a two-story treatment that does a fantastic job of drawing your eye up to bring the ceiling down; a sort of optical illusion that makes the space much more inviting. Window treatments are critical for another more invisible reason. The use of fabric will not only soften the space but absorb sound to avoid sounding like a cave.

#### Lighting

A common lighting theme goes like this, "The room seems too dark once the sun goes down." The standard two-to-three table lamps just will not do. Consider a great chandelier. They're not just for the dining room. Try a tourchier lamp to project light upward to illuminate the ceiling. You'll also need lots of task lighting to create warmth in the room. A general rule of thumb is to double the number of lamps versus a more traditionally sized room.

#### Accessories

Here, you'll want a few carefully selected large items and resist the universal temptation to go with lots of small items. Some pieces to concentrate on include trees, artwork, screens, sculpture and mirrors. The their way into her projects.

larger accessories will not only accentuate the room, they will carry more impact.

#### Color

I'm always surprised by how many clients want to start with paint color. There are infinite combinations of paint colors but relatively few fabrics comparatively. So I suggest this task should be saved for last. I prefer to select paint colors and faux finishes based on my upholstery choices. Consider using colors and greenery to warm up the space. Don't be afraid to paint the ceiling or use darker colors. The room size allows for greater flexibility in color choices. Let your imagination run wild.

There you have it. You need not get lost in space when designing the interior of your large home. When planned for properly, a grand room can have all the comforts of a small cabin in the woods... surrounded by trees!

## Focus on Rhinoplasty

"It's as plain as the nose on your face.

This old adage says a lot about this central feature of our anatomy. Occupying the middle third of the face, probably no other single feature can so dramatically affect our appearance. The nose determines to a great extent the balance and symmetry of our faces. If one's nose is out of proportion to the rest of their features, it can dominate their looks. Someone who doesn't like their nose can focus on it, becoming self-conscious and insecure. A change in the appearance of their nose can make all the difference in the world to them. This is why rhinoplasty surgery is one of the most common plastic surgical procedures being performed in the United States today

#### What is rhinoplasty?

This is the part of nasal surgery that changes the outer shape of the nose. This is accomplished by a combination of removing and/or repositioning cartilage and bone which is already present. The goal is to shape the nose in a natural way so it is balanced and in harmony with the rest of the face and does not appear to have been "done

#### What is external rhinoplasty?

In traditional rhinoplasty there are multiple incisions made inside the nose in order to reach the cartilage and bone. In addition, the cartilage usually needs to be "delivered" or pulled out of the nostril in order to operate on it.

External rhinoplasty is a technique we use in which one single incision is made starting just inside the nostril on one side and extending across the base of the nose to the other side. This allows the cartilage to be worked on in its natural position without distortion and provides a much greater visibility during the operation. Also, there is very little bleeding during consultations.

We can also eliminate the need to pack the nose which significantly reduces the post-operative discomfort. External rhinoplasty is used on the majority of our patients

#### What is a septoplasty?

The central support structure of the nose is the septum. It is made up of cartilage in the front of the nose and bone further back. This is what divides the nose lengthwise into two separate sides. The septum is often "deviated" or crooked due to some type of trauma earlier in life. This can lead to sinus infections as well as a chronic stuffy nose. If the deviation is located just beneath the bridge of the nose, it can cause the external form to look crooked. During a septoplasty, both the cartilaginous and bony portions of the septum are straightened and repositioned to the midline in order to improve the airway. This can be done as a separate operation or in conjunction with a rhinoplasty

#### Computer Imaging

Computer imaging allows a patient to preview what changes are possible and how they might look after surgery. This is done with a special computer and software. Computer imaging is available in our office and used on all our rhinoplasty

- 2. The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS) is the only board recognized by The American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) that certifies individuals as plastic surgeons of the face and entire body
- 3. The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS) does not contain the words "facial" or "cosmetic". Any board containing these words has no relationship to The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS).
- 4. The American Society of Plastic Surgeons (ASPS) will only allow plastic surgeons who are certified by The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS) into its membership.
- 5. The American Society For Aesthetic Plastic Surgery (ASAPS) will only allow plastic surgeons who are certified by The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS) into its membership.
- 6. Any U.S. medical school graduate, regardless of an absence of proper training in plastic surgery or certification by The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS), is allowed to call themselves a plastic surgeon and to perform plastic surgery on you, your face, and your body.

By asking the following questions and by asking them in the following precise manner, you can determine with certainty the two most important facts you need verify about a plastic surgeon; does the individual before you possess hospital privileges to perform aesthetic plastic surgery of the face and body, and is the person before you certified by The American Board of Plastic Surgery, Inc. (ABPS)?

- 1. Ask: "Are you allowed to perform response should be yes and not no. A lengthy response is also a red flag. Do not phrase the question as: "what hospital are you on staff at?" or "do you have hospital privileges?" Don't expect honest and truthful answers to your questions... demand them.

The coalition is made up of area school districts, social service agencies, community parents, law enforcement and the member governments of the Barrington Area Council of Governments. The purpose of the organization is to implement a proactive, nonenforcement approach to the problem of drug and alcohol abuse by youth. The organization was formed in December 2004 "to create a caring community free from substance abuse." The organization's mission is "to reverse the trend of alcohol, tobacco and other drug abuse in our community through education, prevention and intervention strategies and encouraging healthy alternatives.'

A new initiative of the CDPC is the formation of a Youth Advisory Committee. comprised of area teens, which is kicking off during Red Ribbon Week. The Youth

The League of Women Voters of the Bar- Advisory Committee will join teens from area churches to communicate what they are presently doing about alcohol, tobacco and other drug problems, what can further be done, and how youth can work

> In January 2006, the CDPC will distribute a survey to Community Unit School District 220 parents of middle school and high school students. The survey will cover the perception of alcohol, tobacco and other drug use by area students. Replies will be completely anonymous. Area parents are encouraged to complete and return the survey so the CDPC can establish a baseline of perceptions as a tool to measure progress of CDPC efforts. Statistics on actual alcohol, tobacco and other drug incidents and service provisions also are being collected as a baseline against which to measure the effectiveness of new



## Gum Recession—What Does it Mean?

Exposed roots are the result of gum recession, not the natural aging process There are many factors that contribute to a receding gumline. First, receding gums may be caused by bone loss beneath the gums, which cannot be seen. The supporting bone of the tooth could be deteriorating without the patient realizing it. foods or liquids? You may not be in control of what caused the recession. Prior to treatment, Dr. Patrone will help you identify the factors contributing to the problem. Once these contributing factors are controlled, a soft-tissue graft procedure will repair the defect and help to prevent additional recession and bone loss
