
Editor's Ink

situation should be analyzed for potential violations of state causes of action for retaliatory discharge, contract or quasicontractual rights. In that regard, the review should include a review of contractual agreements such as noncompete provisions, confidentiality agreements and nonsolicitation agreements. Naturally, employees are concerned regarding the former employers' enforcement of those provisions and the impact of the agreement on future employment. Employers may also be concerned about enforcement of the agreement due to concerns regarding the former employees' ability to unfairly compete against the company. As such, an analysis of the facts may also be warranted under the Illinois Trade Secrets Act and state law tort claims.

The separation review should also include an analysis of final payment issues under the Illinois Wage Payment and Collection Act for wages, vacation, bonus and commissions. Also, important is the review of benefit issues such as health care Area Professional Women.

Family Medical and Leave Act. Also, the and unemployment benefits. The review and evaluation should include not only whether a violation has occurred but the best way to resolve the situation. This determination will depend on the type of potential violation and the anticipated monetary damages. Most issues may be resolved by the employer and employee with the preparation of confidential separation agreement which includes a release of all claims.

Facelift Surgery

Most people who are familiar with modern facelifts and other facial cosmetic procedures are aware of their important benefits, in terms of improved appearance as well as self-esteem. However, many people who are good candidates for these procedures may be reluctant to actually have them out of fear of the process itself.

They fear that they might experience pain during the surgery, or that recovery might bring pain or discomfort, or that it might take too long to heal, or that they might find some other aspect of the surgery unacceptable. The truth is that virtually every one of our patients reports that their recovery was faster and more comfortable than they expected.

In this context, I would like to share with you the comments of one of our recent facelift patients, a 53-year-old female. She was asked to respond to some very direct questions we posed about her experience with the facelift surgery. While some patients may report more difficult recoveries, this patient's experience is fairly typical.

The following is our interview with W.S. three months following her facelift surgery.

• Did you experience any fear before vour surgery?

No, I would say that I had very little fear, if any. I recall having slept totally comfortably the night before. In fact, I had a photograph taken of me when we were leaving for the doctors' office, and I was smiling and looked very relaxed.

· How long did you think about having surgery before going through with it?

I had it on my agenda for about two years. I was looking for a time frame which was much longer than what I ac-

tually needed, and I had to juggle some other things in my life.

• Was the procedure itself painful?

No, I didn't feel anything. I really don't recall a thing about it.

· What was your recovery like?

I think that my recovery was phenomenal. I had the surgery on a Tuesday and we had a family party the following Sunday. I will admit that it was in a kind of controlled light, evening situation. But my daughter, who is a young woman, didn't notice anything, so I think that's a pretty good indication. By seven days, I was totally, totally functional. I had a little bit of concern about sleeping in a balanced way. I would sleep on my back. And then, after I slept on my left side, I would try to sleep the same amount on my right side. Other than that, I would say that I had barely any discomfort. I had very little bruising-very, very little bruising. It was a very positive experience, both spiritually and in a more concrete, tangible way.

• Would you go through it again?

In a minute. There is probably not a whole lot that I would do differently, except that I wouldn't tell anybody up front. Because in four or five days, no one would ever know

Although famous for high-profile cases, Lee says one of his most important cases was solving a murder without a body based on the amount of blood found pooled under the carpet pad.

"If she lost that amount of blood, she'd be dead," said Lee. "No body was found before it went to trial, but we used the information about the blood to get the conviction.

Currently chief emeritus of the Connecticut State Police Laboratory and professor of Forensic Science at the University of New Haven, Conn., Lee is also featured talking about his cases on Court TV's Trace

The forensic scientist is also the coauthor of Cracking Cases: The Science of Solving Cases by Dr. Lee and Thomas W. O'Neill; Famous Crimes Revisited: from Sacco-Vanzetti to O.J. Plant Materials

All plants are not created equal. A good design pays attention to variety in texture, color and size of plant material. A good mix of heights add dimension while large groupings of the same plant help create variety in texture and color throughout the seasons. Once the choice of plants are made, ensure that they are adapted to our climate. We recommend materials that have been grown in Northern Illinois/ Wisconsin nurseries. Many lawn and garden centers sell bulk plant materials with undersized root systems to accommodate volume shipping. These same plants often come from the south, allowing them to be more prone to disease and unable to handle our winters.

Another consideration is plant size. Professional nursery stock (only available to the contractor) is larger and helps create a more pleasing look during the first season before the plants are established.
