

A boulder waterfall and trout stream has been created in a stone lined pond that was part of the quarry. Natural gardens and plantings envelop the shady areas. More formal gardens can be seen near the estate house. A tour of this incredible property will instill an appreciation not only of the beauty of the land but of the intricate design and engineering feats that have made it possible

Our second estate was once a dairy farm. In the 1930s a lake and dam were created on the property. The presents owners purchased six acres of the land in 1989 and began extensive renovations. The results of their diligence are a beautiful landscape encompassing distinct gar-

In the oriental influenced garden, a charming teahouse sits amid a shaded landscape surrounded by a lovely pond. Cross over the cobblestone path and enjoy the view from inside this unique struc-

Through a garden gate, wander down to the Euro-style gardens. Among the many plantings in this area, a delightful fountain is on display. From here views of the lake are wonderful.

A Wisconsin-made totem pole invites a stroll through the gardens of indigenous and immigrant prairie plants. Walk through a stand of birch trees to a unique bridge that leads to the woodland paths. Mature hardwood trees grace this site. Oak trees that are over 200 years old form a magnificent canopy. A secret garden will delight with beautiful climbing hydrangeas.

Illinois Supreme Court Upholds Employer Arbitration Agreement

In the employment relationship, both the employer and employee should carefully consider the documents which will become part of the employment relationship. Documents which employers have employees sign as a condition of the employment relationship often include a confidentiality agreement and/or a noncompete agreement. Additionally, employers are more frequently requiring employees to sign an agreement to arbitrate any and all disputes that may arise in the employment relationship. While there are pros and cons to an arbitration agreement for that an arbitration agreement may avoid


arbitration typically results in a significantly lower award than in a traditional cluded the arbitration agreement and the court proceeding where the dispute is heard before a judge or jury.

The Illinois Supreme Court recently ruled that an employer arbitration agreement was enforceable and affirmed the dismissal of an employee's retaliatory discharge action filed in state court. In that case, the court considered whether an arbitration agreement contained in the employer's Dispute Resolution Program provided to the employee a year after she commenced her employment was enforceable. The employee argued that even though she signed a form acknowledging the program, she did not knowingly and voluntarily consent to arbitration and as such, she should be able to proceed with her retaliatory discharge case in state court. The court reviewed the arbitration agreement found in favor of the employer under traditional principles of contract law. The court reasoned that the employer Area Professional Women.

a lengthy and costly legal dispute and that offered continued employment based on acceptance of the program which inemployee accepted the offer based on her continued employment. Since carefully drafted arbitration agreements may be enforceable even if offered after the start of employment, employers and employees should carefully consider and review all documents entered into during the employment relationship. 



Village of Barrington Updates Parking Regulations

The Village of Barrington announced today that the new parking regulations passed last week by the Board of Trustees are effective immediately and allow residents more flexibility and convenience including paid-in-advance overnight parking at a specific Barrington train station commuter lot.

"We welcome and embrace these changes," said Trustee Steve Miller. "With their input, the village has initiated these changes to meet the needs of our residents and businesses.'

Temporary overnight parking permits for the north Metra commuter lot bought in advance of the intended stay are now available at both the Barrington Village Hall located at 200 N. Hough Street, Monday through Friday from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and at the Public Safety Building located at 400 N. Northwest Highway available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. These "yellow" permits allow train commuters to park their car in the designated lot between the hours of 2 a.m. and 5 a.m. for up to three consecutive nights at a cost of \$10 per night.

Customer convenience parking now includes an increased number of designated 15-minute parking spots in the Village Center allowing for quick trips to stores and restaurants.

"We are pleased that we are now able to offer this convenience to our community," said Village Manager Denise Pieroni. "This is just one of the many changes to

the parking regulations that will make it easier for our residents to move about and visit our local merchants.'

"We've heard from our merchants and residents that there is a need for fast turnover parking spaces," Miller said. "These new, more flexible parking regulations allow that to happen."

Similarly, the Village Board last year designated spots in the Metra commuter lots for daily fee parking after 9 a.m. to accommodate those who do not need to leave Barrington so early in the morning. These "after 9 a.m." daily fee spots are available in lots located in both the BACOG South Commuter Lot on the south end of the lot and in the Employer/Employee Lot 3B located adjacent to the train tracks just west of the Train Station.

Building improvements in residential or business areas often displace employees or homeowners or leave construction workers with no place to park. The "orange" construction permits are issued by the Village of Barrington to make available on-street parking at the discretion of and subject to the conditions established by the chief of police for a fee of \$20 per

Business owners and employees also benefit from the modifications made to the parking permits. A "discounted" Employer/Employee (ER/EE) permit is available for \$40 per year sold as a single permit in the name of an eligible business that allows multiple employees to use it at different times for parking in areas specifically designated for "discount" ER/EE permits. A "premium" ER/EE parking permit is also available for \$160 annually or \$45 quarterly allowing parking at any lot designated by the Village of Barrington for employers and employees.

'We have tried to take into consideration the many different needs of business owners," said Pieroni. "We have some single employee businesses and many others who utilize a great number of shift workers and part-time employees. There is a permit to fit each of these

The new parking regulations also accommodate seasonal employees that contribute to the work force between November 1 and December 31. These permits can be purchased for \$5 by employers for their employees and can be used to park in areas specifically designated for "discount" ER/EE permits parking.

porary "pink" parking permit that is only issued for special projects within the Village of Barrington. A "visitor" parking permit can be purchased at least two days in advance at the Village Hall for \$10 per day by a village employer who is expecting a guest to their business. These visitors are allowed to park in any of the designated lots on the date indicated on the

"And we also need to remind our residents of the free underground three-hour parking garage at Cook Street Plaza," Miller said. "There is ample parking there and the garage can be easily accessed from East Station Street." Other parking alternatives include the "Harris" lot located on the east side of South Cook Street, between Station Street and Lake Street which is leased by the Village for free three-hour parking for shoppers.

All parking permits issued by the Village of Barrington must be displayed at all times while the vehicle is parked in a designated area. Vehicles will be ticketed for failing to properly display the required





I heard from a friend that you're not sup- fer that you've been working for two posed to make a big purchase before buying a home. I have good credit. Should I be concerned about this? Is there anything else I should avoid doing?

Your friend was correct. It is best to postpone any major purchases until after closing, regardless of your credit standing. Any increase in the debt-to-income ratio reduces the amount of income available for your monthly mortgage payment. Being saddled with a higher car payment could make the bank decide you cannot afford the home you so dearly desire. Using cash for a large purchase can be a problem as well. Banks consider cash reserves when approving a loan and prefer to see a balance of three times your monthly payment.

It goes without saying that you should be mindful of your credit, make all payments on time, and avoid "maxing out" any credit card. In fact, it's best to keep balances at 50% or less of the credit limit. You should also avoid consolidating debt or taking out any new credit cards.

Canceling a credit card will lessen the total amount of credit available to you, and it could reduce the age of your credit file. Taking out a new credit card, or seeking any type of credit approval, will result in an "inquiry" that will lower your FICO score. An inquiry occurs every time a creditor pulls your credit report.

Another thing to avoid if you are looking to purchase a new home is moving assets from one bank account to another. These transfers show as new deposits and complicate the application process, as you must then disclose and document the source of funds for each new account. Your lender can verify each account as it currently exists. You can consolidate your accounts later if you need to.

Also, do not change jobs. Lenders pre-

years with your current employer. If not, then it's best to be able to make the case that you're in the same line of work.

In addition, you should also not assume your credit is good. Inaccurate or missing information-even identity theft-can occur without your awareness. Experts say you should review your credit reports at least once a year from the major credit bureaus (Equifax, Experian and Transunion). You can obtain a free copy of your credit report once a year from the three credit bureaus by visiting-

www.annualcreditreport.com.

Another thing to avoid is packing or shipping information that will be needed for the loan application. Important paperwork such as W-2 forms, divorce papers and tax returns should not be sent with your household goods. Duplicate copies take weeks to obtain, and could stall the loan closing date on your transaction.

Five Strategies That Will Make Moving Easier on Your Children

Moving to a new community is a very stressful experience for a family, and it can be especially hard on the children. Being the new kid on the block, it seems as if everyone else has a best friend or a secure group. A child also is thrown into a new curriculum, in which he or she is ahead in certain subjects and behind in others, causing boredom and anxiety.
