African Exhibit at the Garlands of Barrington

Mark your calendars for Nov. 3 because a special event you won't want to miss is coming to Barrington Area Art Council's (BAAC) Gallery at the Garlands of Barrington. BAAC is partnering with local photographer Al Buschauer, who is working with Hands of Hope, to bring you the moving, powerful, and beautiful photography of his trip to Africa. Hands of Hope, an organization partnered with World Relief, wants to call attention to the problem of AIDS in countries like Rwanda and Zambia. Buschauer flew to Africa and visited the families of children who have lost their parents to AIDS. Many of the children he visited were under the care of their grandparents, who were very poor and close to death. The powerful photographs depict the pain, suffering, and torment of an area being demolished by AIDS. But there is beauty in his work as well. There is a photograph of a small boy with bright, beautiful eyes. Hope swims through his expression, and the viewer gets the feeling that not all is lost in a land stricken with sadness.

Buschauer has been a photographer for 30 years and has served the businesses and residents of the Barrington area for the past 17 years. During his 2006 stint as a volunteer for Hands of Hope, he felt a spiritual prompting to travel to Africa to experience firsthand the daily issues of hardship facing citizens in Rwanda, Zambia and South Africa. "It was an emotionally raw experience to be in the midst of pressing needs no matter where I was. But underneath, through and beyond the depressing circumstances, I could see and feel hope in the children. They in turn inspired me that things could indeed turn around for the better with enough com-

passion, cooperation, extensive effort and supportive funding," Buschauer says. His intent with the Hands of Hope photographic exhibit is to accurately depict the spirit of the African people by illustrating their sorrows and joys. Much of Africa's story is told through the eyes of the chil-

Art prints from the African gallery images will be available to order and purchase in size 11 x 14 and larger. Twentyfive percent of the proceeds from prints sold will go directly to Hands of Hope's relief efforts. A secondary portion of funds will be set aside to help cover the cost of Buschauer's return trip to Africa within the next two years. He will continue his photographic recording of the AIDS epidemic in Rwanda, Zambia and possibly a third country not yet decided upon.

Barrington Area Arts Council is excited about the impact this show is going to have on the community. BAAC's Executive Director Corryn Hall-Lee says, "We're honored to be able to share Al's work with the Barrington area community. By partnering with him, as well as with Hands of Hope, we're offering a venue where people can experience the beauty of his artistry and walk away with a heightened sense of awareness concerning the growing global AIDS epidemic." BAAC hopes this exhibit shows people that artists can use their skills to motivate a community towards action. Al Buschauer's Hands of Hope photographic exhibit is showing at Barrington Area Arts Council's Gallery at the Garlands from Nov. 3 through Jan. 3. An opening reception will be held Wednesday, Nov. 8 from 5 to 7 p.m. Refreshments will be served. The Gallery at the Garlands is located at 1000 Garlands Lane,

Illinois Appellate Court Allows Deduction from Final Pay by Joette S. Doran, Esq.

Pursuant to the Illinois Wage Payment and Collection Act, an employee is to be paid all final wages upon termination from employment. In regard to deductions from final pay, the Wage Act provides deductions by employers from wages or final compensation are prohibited unless such deductions are: (1) required by law; (2) to the benefit of the employee; (3) in response to a valid wage assignment or wage deduction order; (4) made with the express written consent of the employee, given freely at the time the deduction is made. Recently, the Illinois Appellate Court considered whether restricted stock

was considered to be a portion of the employee's compensation and whether it was an allowable deduction from final pay un-

der the Wage Act. By agreement, the employee elected to have a portion of his compensation and wages paid in the form of restricted stock (CAP stock) and which contained a provision that provided for forfeiture of a portion of that stock upon termination of his employment during a two-year forfeiture period.

The election signed by the employee clearly stated that the employee elected to receive the following percentage of his annual cash compensation in the form of restricted stock. The forfeiture provision included on the election form also indicated that the restricted stock was part of the employee's compensation. Accordingly, the court found that the CAP stock was compensation and, therefore, governed by the Wage Act based upon the plain language of the election agreement. However, the court found that the employers' deduction was allowable under the Wage Act and that the employee made a voluntary forfeiture of earned compensation. The funds used for participation in the CAP program, although a portion Professional Women.

of the employee's wages as stated in the CAP agreement, were voluntarily used to purchase CAP stock by the plaintiff. The court found that this supported the inference that he was fully aware of the forfeiture clause upon participation in the CAP and that the employee chose to voluntarily participate in the CAP program. Accordingly, as with any written agreement, both employees and employers should carefully consider all documentation and how it may alter final pay issues under the Wage Act. 
Implant Placement Procedure

1. Dental implants can support a fixed bridge, eliminating the need for a removable partial denture.


2. Implants are placed into



Make a Tax-Free Rollover from Your IRA to a Qualified Charity

A Window of Opportunity for 2006 and 2007

If you are age 70½ or older, you may roll over up to \$100,000 in 2006 and 2007 taxfree from your IRA to a qualified public charity. The rollover amount will not be included in your gross income and you will not receive a charitable deduction for this donation. If you are married, your spouse may make another qualified distribution from his or her IRA of up to \$100,000 as long as all the other qualifications are met as well. This makes a married couple eligible for a total maximum contribution of \$200,000.

The tax-free rollover of qualified charitable distributions can be particularly attractive for donors who need to take required minimum distributions from their IRAs. Under the new law, you can satisfy your required minimum distributions of up to \$100,000 by making a tax-free qualified donation to charity using these funds.

Here's how to handle your charitable donation correctly: You must authorize the financial institution where your IRA is held to send a donation directly to the charity either through a wire transfer or by writing a check made out to the charity. You cannot write a check to the charity either from your IRA or from another account into which you transferred your IRA funds. Doing so would negate the tax-free transfer of the donation under the new rules because the amount would be considered a regular distribution and would then be added to your taxable income.

You must be age 701/2 on or before the date of the transfer and the charity must be a "qualified" public charity. You cannot receive anything of value in return

for your donation. The exclusion from gross income only applies to distribution amounts that would have been includible in gross income were it not for this provision. If you have made nondeductible contributions to your IRA, have your tax advisor determine how much of the donation is considered tax-free under this pro-

Transfers to charities from other retirement plans, such as a SEP or SIMPLE IRA, or a 401(k) or 403(b) plan, do not qualify. However, it may be possible to roll over funds from these accounts into a Traditional IRA and then make an eligible trans-





Elgin Academy Plans New "Green" Media, Science and Fine Arts Center

Elgin Academy announced this fall its plans to build a new 43,200-square-foot Media, Science and Fine Arts Center that will be among the leading "green" educational facilities in the country and that will teach students how to manage a building using the latest conservation technology.

The new four-story building, located at the corner of Dundee Avenue and Kimball Street, will become the "hub" of the private school's 18-acre Hilltop campus at 350 Park St. in Elgin's historic downtown district. It will house 14 new classrooms, a media and library center and a 300-seat theater for use by students, as well as local theater groups. Groundbreaking is scheduled for April 2007 with students scheduled to occupy the building in Fall 2008.

"This project will make **Elgin Academy** a leader among only a handful of schools across the country that have a certified environmentally responsible building," said Dr. John Cooper, Elgin Academy's head of school. "The sustainable design of the new center will provide students with an innovative educational experience and teach them environmental stewardship."

The \$9.5 million facility will be funded through private and public grants with \$4.5 million secured to date. A grant from the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation for \$155,000 was received this spring and the Academy has asked the City of Elgin for additional funding to support the theater, which will provide a new venue for the city's growing theater district.

The building was designed by Elgin-based architect Bruce Dahlquist, president of Dahlquist and Lutzow Architects, Ltd. It is registered with the U.S. Green Building Council's LEED Design Criteria seeking "Gold Level" status. It also supports the City of Elgin's recent initiative to become an energy efficient and "green building" city.

The new center is designed to provide an energy-efficient indoor environment using mechanical, electrical and control systems that exceed national and state energy-efficiency standards. It will use photovoltaic panels for educational purposes and feature a building envelope, which controls day lighting and heat gain/loss, as well as outdoor lighting that controls night sky pollution. It will use locally manufactured materials, recycled materials and low VOC emitting materials, as well as a construction waste management plan.

The goal of the design is to create the lowest resource-consuming facility possible and to enhance site and surrounding ecosystems, said Cooper. The building will provide long-term energy savings allowing funds to be redirected towards the educational process. In addition, over the next two years, **Elgin Academy** will "green" its entire campus, including using more energy-efficient lighting and implementing a campus-wide recycling program.

The new facility will also feature a unique science, math and computer instructional program for students centered on new understandings of indoor environmental quality and sustainability. The building will become a "living laboratory" for math and science students to study sustainable technology, materials, and design/construction techniques. It will provide optimum conditions for human learning through light, tempera-


ture, humidity and other controls. The building will allow the Academy to provide major enhancements to its science, math and computer instructional programs for high school students. Students and visitors also will use hand-held computers to measure building performance and resource efficiency.

"This center will allow **Elgin Academy** to influence the future course of environmental studies and science and math instruction among the leading college-preparatory schools in the Midwest and the United States," said Cooper. "It supports Elgin Academy's mission to provide outstanding educational opportunities and to encourage its students to assume increasing levels of social responsibility."

The new building also will offer the additional classrooms that **Elgin Academy** needs to accommodate more than 200 former Summit Academy students who will move to its Hilltop campus in August 2008. The students will move from Elgin Academy's River Road campus at 333 River Road in Elgin.

"The new Media, Science and Fine Arts Center provides multiple benefits to our students and the community from teaching students environmental responsibility to enhancing science and math instruction to providing increased support for the city's theater district and revitalization plans," said Beth Keyse, director of development for **Elgin Academy**. "It is a new cornerstone for the school's and community's future."

"Usual and Customary" Fees and Insurance Companies by James T. Gavrilos, D.D.S

Insurance companies use the term "usual and customary" to compare your dentist's own fees with what the insurance company has already decided to allow as coverage. Of course, their focus is their bottom line, not the patient's oral health. Allowed fees are derived from their own databases which include significant numbers of HMO clinics and other forms of managed or discounted care. They do not publish their sources. If it were a fair and complete system, all the insurance companies should come up with the same fees as "usual and customary" ...they don't.

Managed care in dentistry usually equates to insurance providers determining care. The dentist is forced to use lower fees to be a part of the plan in exchange for patient flow. He will usually limit treatment that number. options to those procedures that are covered under the plan. There are only a few ways to offer lower fees while making the same income. One is to use less-expensive, less-experienced employees or laboratory. A second is to use less-durable or less-esthetic materials. A third is to see a large numbers of patients. If fees are lowered about 30%, the average dental office would have to see 42% more patients, necessitating a decrease in the amount of time they allow for procedures.

Eyelid Surgery

"The eyes are the windows to the soul!" Eyes are one of the most expressive features we have and reveal a lot about us. Subtle changes in their appearance let people know if we are happy, sad, well rested, or tired. We are able to "read" people and at the same time be "read" by others through our eyes. Many have found that an energetic, youthful appearance can enhance others' perceptions of their performance at work. If their eyes look half closed due to excess upper eyelid skin or have "bags" beneath them because of excess fat bulging from beneath the lower eyelids, the overall appearance is one of tiredness and lack of energy. Even when they get plenty of sleep they can still look tired. Many people just feel younger than they look and would like to improve their overall appearance.

These are some of the reasons that a large portion of the cosmetics industry is devoted to enhancing the appearance of our eyes; through makeup, anti-aging and rejuvenating creams. Cosmetic companies realize that a first step in improving our looks is to improve the look of our eyes.

How Do the Eyes Change as We Age? The effects of aging are usually seen first in our eyes. As we get older the skin of the upper eyelid tends to increase and become redundant. This can hide the smooth skin just above the eyelashes where women wear eyeshadow. If enough excessive skin forms, it can actually hang over the eyelashes and obstruct


vision. There can also be bulging of fat from behind the eyelid, causing a fullness or discreet bulge in the middle corner of the evelid.

In the lower eyelids the first sign of aging normally seen is a bulging of the orbital fat creating the puffiness most people refer to as "bags". This is caused by a relaxation of the septum, a membrane beneath the eyelid muscles, which allows the fat of the eyesocket to bulge out beneath the skin. This relaxation is a normal consequence of aging but can occur in young people as a family trait. As pressure is applied to the closed eye one can see this bulge increase. Excess skin of the lower eyelid can also form but not usually to the same degree as in the up-

What Can Surgery Accomplish?

In the upper eyelid excess skin is removed to allow a smooth contour when the eye is gently closed. When the eye opens this results in a normal crease approximately 7mm above the lash line. Excess fat, if present, is removed with the

Where is Surgery Performed?

Eyelid surgery is most often performed in our office surgical suite, however if preferred, surgery can be performed at a number of different hospitals or ambulatory surgery centers in the area.

What is the Recovery Period?

Dissolving sutures are used in the lower eyelids and do not have to be removed. Nonabsorbing sutures are normally used in the upper eyelids and are removed on the fifth postoperative day. Makeup can be worn the day following suture removal and most people return to work at this time. There can be swelling of the eyes An upper and lower blepharoplasty can for one to two days following the operation which might interfere with vision so we recommend not driving until the swelling is down. After this most people can easily be out in public with sunglasses. Any bruising that occurs fades in the first 7 to 10 days. Makeup can conceal termined at the preoperative consultation. this after the second postoperative day.

Is This the Right Time to Buy or Sell a Home?
