




Woodstock Early Learning Center


Hospice of Northeastern Illinois Kicks Off 25th Anniversary Celebration with Performing Arts Showcase





Are Physicians Subject to Non-Compete Agreements? by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

Generally, a non-compete agreement provides restrictions on competing against an employer for a specific duration and geographical area. In order to be enforceable, the courts generally find that the restrictions must be narrowly drafted to reasonably protect the legitimate business concerns of the employer. Various factors are considered in determining whether the employer has a legitimate business concern in restricting employment. These factors include a detailed analysis of the employer's business and its relationship with its clientele, where the company and the employee performed work, the em-

ployee's skills and knowledge of the company's business and the type of position held by the employee. Courts analyze each restrictive covenant and employment



relationship independently to determine whether the restrictive covenant is enforceable.

Recently, the Illinois Supreme Court considered whether a covenant not to compete was enforceable against a physician. In finding that a non-compete agreement was enforceable the court examined the physicians employment contracts which contained restrictive covenants which stated that upon termination of employment, the doctors would not practice medicine within a geographic area of three miles for up to five years. The doctors argued that the covenants should be declared void as against public policy however, the doctors failed to show that such covenants were contrary to the law or injurious to the public welfare. The court held that such covenants protected the business interests of established physicians and, in this way, encouraged them to take on younger, inexperienced

doctors which could have a positive impact on patient care. The court also stated that historically, covenants restricting the performance of medical professional services have been held valid and enforceable in Illinois as long as the duration and geographic scope are reasonable when considering the effect on the public and any undue hardship on the parties to the agreement. As such, the court held that based the time and effort it took to develop the medical practice, the geographic restriction of three miles and time restrictions of three and five years were reasonable. Accordingly, careful consideration should be given before signing any employment agreement and especially one that contains a non-compete provision since the agreement can potentially restrict future employment and require the payment of monetary damages. 

Are Your Teeth Getting Short?

Many adults find that their front teeth are wearing down, getting thin or even chipping away. The cause of these problems is not what you eat, chewing ice or those pencils you hold in your mouth. More likely, it is unconscious, usually nocturnal movements of your lower jaw called bruxism or "night grinding". The cause may be that your back teeth do not fit together properly. It may be caused by brain waves or it may even be associated with R.E.M. sleep patterns. There may be headaches, sore muscles or jaw joint pain associated with the tooth destruction from bruxism.

If a long-term solution is desired, proper diagnosis of the type of bruxism that exists is required before your teeth are repaired. This diagnosis may require a combination of a careful history, muscle and jaw joint examination, radiographs, impressions for models, mounting these models on a simulator, a plastic oral splint 381-4040.

Fat Injection

Fat injection is a cosmetic procedure, which uses the patient's own fat cells to fill that same patient's facial lines and creases. Structural fat is harvested or removed from one part of the patient's body (i.e. abdomen, thigh) and reinjected into a facial line or crease. As we all know, softening facial lines and wrinkles helps maintain a more youthful appearance, and fat transfer is a great way to accomplish this look.

Fat injection has been used for many years now, but a new technique for placing the fat (the Coleman technique) gives better, longer lasting results. The old technique involved placing large parcels of fat in an atrophic area. Fat cells are fragile and once ruptured, they would die and be reabsorbed into the body. In addition, the fat cells would need a blood supply to nourish them, and providing enough blood to a large parcel of fat was quite difficult. Using the old technique, the fat would eventually die and the patient would need to return to the office for retreatment every two to three months.

The new fat transfer technique is a simple office procedure done with local anesthesia. The fat is harvested from the donor site and cleaned, and is then injected into the atrophic area using a very small, blunt-tipped, side-port needle. The needle is advanced into the tissue with multiple planes of injection, using a crisscross pattern to fill the area with very larger parcels of fat because the blood haps fat transfer is right for you.



In Citizen's Garb: Southern Plains Native Americans. 1889-1891, from Feb. 4 through March 10

In Citizen's Garb: Southern Plains Native Americans, 1889-1891, explores the ways dress-and lifechanged for the Kiowa, Comanche, and affiliated tribes during the 1880s and 1890s. Indian reservations in Oklahoma and Indian Territories opened during this era, coinciding with large-scale efforts by the United States government to force western Native American tribes to adapt Euro-American ways. These efforts were meant to "civilize" the native peoples.

William J. Lenny and William L. Sawyers were among the many white entrepreneurs quick to capitalize on the romantic lure of the tribes. They set up shop in Purcell, Okla., one of the many towns that sprang up on former Indian lands, to make





photographs of formerly "wild Indians" for eastern U.S. consumption, where there was a great appetite for images of the West. The 53 photographs that comprise this exhibition are modern restrikes made from Lenny and Sawyer's original glass

Some of the photographs show obvious-yet powerful-details of the acculturation process. Images of Native Americans in both citizen and native dress reflect the transition that occurred between the tribes' past and their radically different future.




