



Cézanne to Picasso: Ambroise Vollard, Patron of the Avant-Garde

Matisse called him a thief. Gertrude Stein remembered "a huge dark man glooming." He saved Cézanne's career. Picasso said he had the "vanity of a woman." He was Ambroise Vollard (1866-1939), one of the most significant dealers and patrons of modern art. The Art Institute of Chicago is pleased to announce the exhibition Cézanne to Picasso: Ambroise Vollard Patron of the Avant-Garde, which will run from now through May 12, 2007 in the museum's Regenstein Hall. Vollard was the seminal dealer of the Post-Impressionist era, having an active hand in the sale, commission, and exhibition of thousands of works of art by such masters of modern art as Cézanne, Picasso, Rouault, and van Gogh. He "became the single greatest source, before World War I, for the spread of modernism in Europe and across the Atlantic," according to Michael Kimmelman in the New York Times.

This vast exhibition of more than 250 works-paintings, sculptures, prints, ceramics, and books-also features works by Pierre Bonnard, Edgar Degas, Paul Gauguin and Édouard Vuillard, among others. Highlights include paintings from Vollard's landmark 1895 Cézanne exhibition: a never-before reassembled triptych from his 1896-97 van Gogh retrospective; the masterpiece Where Do We Come From? What Are We? Where Are We Going? from his 1898 Gauguin exhibition, a work never before seen in the city of Chicago; paint-

(1901) and Matisse's first solo exhibition (1904); and three pictures from André Derain's London series, painted in 1906-1907 with Vollard's encouragement and financial backing. Also on view will be numerous portraits of Vollard by leading artists, among them Cézanne, Bonnard, Renoir, and Picasso. Many of the works in the exhibition are from the Art Institute's permanent collection

Vollard was born in Ile-de-la-Réunion, ings from Picasso's first French exhibition a French colony in the Indian Ocean, and

arrived in Paris to study law, like his father, at the age of 21. His nascent legal career was brief, and within a few years of leaving law school he was dealing paintings out of his dining room. Shrewd early sales of Manet's drawings and unfinished paintings launched Vollard into the Impressionist circle, and his gallerywhich moved into successively more lavish spaces—became a wildly successful business as well as an artistic hub of finde-siècle Paris. Artists and collectors met there in informal salons, enjoyed Vollard's home-cooked meals, and traded their works for those of their friends and colleagues. Vollard is best known for rescuing

Cézanne from obscurity. When Vollard mounted his solo exhibition of Cézanne's work in 1895, the artist had not been regularly shown in Paris for nearly 20 years. Vollard's gamble—he acquired 150 canvases from Cézanne largely via Paul, his son-paid off and established not only Cézanne's career but Vollard's as well. He became the principal dealer of Paul Gauguin and a number of Fauve artists. Vollard gave Matisse his first solo exhibition and Picasso an exhibition when the artist was just 19. He assembled the largest exhibition of van Gogh's work seen up to that point. And when he died, somewhat suspiciously, in 1939, he was a multimillionaire who had shaped the history of modern art

Throughout his career, Vollard remained an enigmatic figure. He was notoriously rude to potential patrons, insisting that they wait for hours in his gallery before he would display works or refusing to admit he had paintings by a particular artist when they were in plain view. He napped and dozed constantly-a form of narcolepsy that has yet to be determined as intentional rather than physiological-and practiced a relaxed form of bookkeeping that the curators of this exhibition are the first to shed real light on. At the same time, he was a savior to many artists who relied on the dealer to keep their works in circulation or support them with stipends, as Vollard did for Gauguin, despite

their mutually vexed and mistrustful relationship. No more convincing evidence of some artists' affection for him is a series of portraits of the dealer included in this exhibition—often pictured with his cat, also named Ambroise-by such figures as Picasso, Cézanne, Renoir, and Bonnard.

Special dated tickets to Cézanne to Picasso are required, and advance tickets are strongly recommended. Tickets are now on sale to the public-call 1-312-930-4040 or purchase them at the museum. Tickets are \$15 (Monday through Wednesday visits), \$18 (Thursday through Sunday visits), and include general admission in to the museum.

The exhibition was organized by the Art Institute of Chicago, The Metropolitan Museum of Art, New York, the Musée d'Orsay, Paris, and the Réunion des Musées Nationaux, Paris.

An indemnity for this exhibition has been granted by the Federal Council on the Arts and the Humanities



Court Enforces Non-Compete Agreement Based on Former Employee's Access to Confidential Information

Illinois provides protection for the wrongful use of confidential information under the Illinois Trade Secrets Act. A trade secret is generally defined as information that is sufficiently secret to derive economic value from not being generally known to other persons who can obtain economic value from its use or disclosure. the information to the employer and its competitors, the amount of money expended by the employer in developing the information and the ease or difficulty with which the information could be properly acquired or duplicated by others. Recently the 7th Circuit Court of Federal Appeals considered whether an employee who signed a confidentiality agreement was in violation of the agreement when the employee went to work for a com-

In that case, the employee agreed as part of a promotion to sign a confidentiality agreement wherein he agreed that he would not go to work for a company that manufactured a product for which he had access to confidential information during his employment. After his termination, he went to work for a direct competitor and his former employer sued alleging violation of the agreement. Although the former employee had access to confidential information, he denied using the confidential information in his new position. Professional Women.

The court found that because he had knowledge of the manufacturing process which was not known to the competitor, he may be tempted to use his knowledge in performing his work. As such, the court found that keeping a business executive with a wealth of information from taking an equivalent position at a rival is reasonably necessary for the protection of the employer's business interests when the executive's use of trade secrets would be hard to detect. 
Steinmeyer Selected to Display Globe on Chicago's Lakefront

Local artist Nancy Steinmeyer has been selected to paint a globe for this summer's "Cool Globes: Hot Ideas for a Cooler Planet," a public art project designed to increase awareness of and promote solutions to global warming.

The Cool Globes Exhibit will be on display along Chicago's lakefront adjacent to the Field Museum and Navy Pier from June to September. Cool Globes is a partnership between Field Museum and the City of Chicago Department of the Environment formed to inspire individuals and organizations to implement solutions to global warming.

Steinmeyer's globe design, titled "First We Scream, Then We Act," features a background of brightly painted concentric circles with a black outline of a drawing of Edvard Munch's famous "The Cry." On the other side of the globe, brighter colors outline and cover the continents to depict the jet stream. Over this colorful pattern is an outline drawing of James Montgomery Flagg's Uncle Sam, challenging us to act now.

Steinmeyer was invited to create and submit a design for the exhibit in October. After her design was accepted, she was confronted with the logistics of dealing with a 200-pound, five-foot globe delivered to her home during February's cold temperatures. Steinmeyer created a painting environment in her garage using heavy plastic and white painter's tarp and complete with two space heaters, carpet-

ing, a TV and thermometer. The outdoor enamel paint she used required at least 50 degrees for application and proper drying.

A professional artist for more than 30 years, Steinmeyer has been working full time on her art for the past 19 years. Her various media and methods include drawing, 3-D paintings, mixed media constructions, murals and paper sculptures. For the past year, Steinmeyer has worked to create solution-based global warming educational materials for school-aged children, including board games, a story book, picture puzzles and a pledge to the planet.







The successful banker and Chicago Board of Trade president had hired local architect Otis Wheelock to design a stately home for the area that was Chicago's first "Gold Coast." One hundred years later, however, this historic property lay abandoned, ready to be torn down and replaced by a parking lot. 



More on CPAP, Apnea and Snoring

Our office received numerous phone calls last month when I wrote about CPAP, sleep apnea and snoring awareness. I also discussed a dental orthotic device that is an alternative to CPAP. This device helps position the jaw forward to help hold the airway open. Because of the great interest, I will try to answer the most common questions that we handled over the phone, here in this article.

How much does it cost? The fees for this type of appliance can range from \$1,000 up to \$2,200. The lower-priced ones are not adjustable and limit jaw movement when the appliance is in. The best ones are adjustable and allow the wearer to slowly adjust the position of his jaw. The adjustable section is usually made of titanium. Discuss this with your dentist to see which one he prescribes.

Does insurance cover it? Yes. Health insurance covers this appliance the way it covers the cost of a CPAP machine. It is not an appliance that is usually covered by dental insurance. If you are getting one just for snoring and have not had a sleep study, there will probably be no coverage.

Are there any contraindications? Yes. Patients with loose teeth or dentures cannot wear this appliance. The appliance snaps over the teeth and uses them as anchors. Implants are also good for this



Another contraindication is TMJ disease. Because the jaw is being held forward during sleep, pain can increase in those that suffer from TMJ pain.

Can you use it together with a CPAP? Yes. While most patients get significant improvement with a CPAP machine, some still have apnea. Some studies have shown that CPAP patients can reduce their frequency and duration of the apnea episodes with the introduction of a dental orthotic. If you plan to use both, a new sleep study would have to be performed to measure the efficacy of the orthotic.

Eyelid Surgery

"The eyes are the windows to the soul!" Eyes are one of the most expressive features we have and reveal a lot about us. Subtle changes in their appearance let people know if we are happy, sad, well rested, or tired. We are able to "read" people and at the same time be "read" by others through our eyes. Many have found that an energetic, youthful appearance can enhance others' perceptions of their performance at work. If their eyes look half closed due to excess upper eyelid skin or have "bags" beneath them because of excess fat bulging from beneath the lower eyelids, the overall appearance is one of tiredness and lack of energy. Even when they get plenty of sleep they can still look tired. Many people just feel younger than they look and would like to improve their overall appearance.

These are some of the reasons that a large portion of the cosmetics industry is devoted to enhancing the appearance of our eyes; through makeup, antiaging and rejuvenating creams. Cosmetic companies realize that a first step in improving our looks is to improve the look of our eyes.

How Do the Eyes Change as We Age? The effects of aging are usually seen first in our eyes. As we get older the skin of the upper eyelid tends to increase and become redundant. This can hide the smooth skin just above the eyelashes where women wear eyeshadow. If enough excessive skin forms, it can actually hang over the eyelashes and obstruct vision. There can also be bulging of fat from behind the eyelid, causing a fullness


or discreet bulge in the middle corner of the evelid.

In the lower eyelids the first sign of aging normally seen is a bulging of the orbital fat creating the puffiness most people refer to as "bags". This is caused by a relaxation of the septum, a membrane beneath the eyelid muscles, which allows the fat of the eyesocket to bulge out beneath the skin. This relaxation is a normal consequence of aging but can occur in young people as a family trait. As pressure is applied to the closed eye one can see this bulge increase. Excess skin of the lower eyelid can also form but not usually to the same degree as in the up-

What Can Surgery Accomplish?

In the upper eyelid excess skin is removed to allow a smooth contour when the eye is gently closed. When the eye opens this results in a normal crease approximately 7mm above the lash line. Excess fat, if present, is removed with the skin to reduce the fullness of the upper eyelid. The incision line is closed precisely at the crease to hide it during the healing process. Eyelid skin heals very





rapidly. Special techniques are used in in our office surgical suite, however if Asian eyes and selected others to create a more prominent crease.

In the lower eyelid an incision is made just beneath the lashes or in selected patients on the inside of the lower eyelid. The excess fat, which is contained in three separate compartments, is then removed. Any excess skin is removed taking care not to place too much tension on the lower eyelid.

An upper and lower blepharoplasty can be performed together or in combination with other facial rejuvenation procedures such as a facelift or rhinoplasty. The eyelids can also be improved in certain individuals with chemical peeling and/or brow lifting. The need for these are determined at the preoperative consultation.

Where is Surgery Performed?

preferred, surgery can be performed at a number of different hospitals or ambulatory surgery centers in the area.

What is the Recovery Period?

Dissolving sutures are used in the lower eyelids and do not have to be removed. Nonabsorbing sutures are normally used in the upper eyelids and are removed on the fifth postoperative day. Makeup can be worn the day following suture removal and most people return to work at this time. There can be swelling of the eyes for one to two days following the operation which might interfere with vision so we recommend not driving until the swelling is down. After this most people can easily be out in public with sunglasses. Any bruising that occurs fades in the first 7 to 10 days. Makeup can conceal Eyelid surgery is most often performed this after the second postoperative day.




The octagonal eating area features a turret ceiling with generous windows for lots of light.






- Improper Choice of Plants and Shrubs -The choice of specific plants is key to is enjoyed in all seasons. The question be- ensuring their adaptation to our climate and their vitality on your property. We recommend materials that have been grown in Northern Illinois and Wisconsin nurseries. For instance, evergreens can be finicky. Sometimes, they brown out or lose growth. Why? With not enough snow to protect them, our winters may be too cold.
 - Planting in the Wrong Place-Keep in mind "the right plant for the right location." Always consider a plant's mature size. Sun or shade tolerance is also an issue. Popular shrubs like rhododendrons should be replaced after one season if they receive too much sunshine.

Many types of shrubs remain puny if planted in northern exposures. Broadleaf evergreens planted under taller trees may die off. When the trees lose their leaves, they lose their protection from the winter sun and wind.

- · Lack of Variety and Imagination-In your design, try to pay attention to variety in the texture, color and size of your plant materials. A good mix of heights give a landscape dimension, while large groupings of the same plant can help create variety in texture and color throughout all seasons. All green is boring. Also, mixing deciduous plants with evergreens creates interest in all seasons.
- Not Having an Overall Plan-When creating a plan, it's important to envision (Please continue on page 48)

A History of the Art of the Exploration of North America from the Bender **Collection of Rare Maps & Prints**


raise the funds, Oakwood Mallards, will be on display at the exhibit.
