Fourth of July Celebration will be held. If you are new to the area, come experience this hometown tradition. It's fun for the entire family—with a lineup of great entertainment, games and food.




Special Garden Features: Country Charmer

Violations of The Computer Fraud and Abuse Act by Joette S. Doran, J.D.

The Computer Fraud and Abuse Act provides businesses with a remedy against employees, former employees or other individuals who compromise a computer system or who destroy data. Recently, the 7th Federal Court of Appeals held that a former employee was liable under the Act and also for breach of contract and loyalty when he left his employer to start his own business in violation of his employment contract. To make matters worse, before he guit, he deleted all the files on his laptop before returning it to his former employer. Not only did he delete all the data he had collected but also the data



that would have revealed his improper conduct before he quit. The facts revealed that not only did he hit "delete" but he loaded the laptop with an erasure pro-



their recovery. Based on these facts, the former employer sued arguing violation tionally accesses a protected computer under The Computer Fraud and Abuse Act which provides that whoever knowingly causes the transmission of a program, information, code, or command, and as a result of such conduct, intentionally causes damages without authorization, to a protected computer, violates the Act.

The former employee argued that merely erasing a file from a computer is not a transmission under the Act. However, the court rejected his argument finding that hitting the delete key did transmit a command and that he transmitted the erasure program to the computer by either a download from the Internet or inserting a data disk. The court pointed out that Congress was concerned not only with attacks by virus and worm writers which come from outside sources but also attacks by disgruntled individuals who decide to destroy

gram which overwrites the files to prevent out or threaten to do so to extort payments. The court held that whoever intenwithout authorization or exceeds that authorization and recklessly causes damage violates the Act. As such, the former emplovee violated the Act when he exceeded his authorized use of the laptop by destroying the files that incriminated him along with other company files that were the property of his former employer. Local Couple Supports Montana Museum

Jim and Wanda Hollensteiner of North Barrington recently received a prestigious award from the Museums Association of Montana for their support of the Museum at Central School in Kalispell, Montana. Central School was the oldest brick building in Kalispell, having been built in 1894 by Jim's forefathers, who established the first brickyard and were the first brick masons an the area.

For a number of years, Central School stood vacant and was the centerpiece of much local controversy as to whether it should be torn down or restored and given useful life. A number of local people organized to save the building. The Hollensteiners were major contributors to this effort and the museum now ranks as one of the outstanding museums in the state. Its focus is to preserve and promote the history of northwest Montana for the benefit of people who live and visit the area, which is close to Glacier National Park. Helping to educate the local school children is a major part of its mission and last year over 3,000 children received guided tours. The Hollensteiners continue to give considerable time to the museum with Jim serving on the Board of Directors for the past eight years.

Included among the many exhibits are what are believed to be the oldest preserved bald eagles in the world. Jim acquired these from his grandfather who had a Kalispell Main Street shoe store. In 1892, a trapper visited the store looking for a pair of boots. He had no money, but



he did have two bald eagles that he had just shot. The swap was arranged and the shoe store took the name of Eagle Shoe Co., and remained a Main Street fixture for over 75 years.

The Hollensteiners split their time between Barrington and Montana. They have always been active in community affairs. For many years, Wanda has been prominent in the Barrington Chapter of Lyric Opera, having served three years as president. She also was a longtime member of Chicago Lyric Opera's Chapter Executive Board. A piano teacher for over 30 years, she also served as president of the Northwest Music Teacher's Association.

"Don't Try This at Home!"

Dr. Phil I am not! Designing beautiful spaces is what I love to do. But at times, I'm forced to intercede for the benefit of a client's marriage. Not following? Let me fill you in.

I recently had a new client call me to discuss a design project they were contemplating. I had no idea I was walking into the middle of a domestic squabble. The wife was tired of the same old look of the family room. One morning, after everyone had left for work and school, she made up her mind to change the look. With a neighbor's help, she moved everything in the room. The sofa, the chairs, the TV, I mean everything! That evening, she encountered family anarchy. Nobody liked the change. Not her husband, not the kids. The TV was too far away for easy viewing. I noticed that the path to the kitchen was nearly completely obstructed by the position of the sofa. The room had completely lost its flow.

From my perspective, she could have taken one of three paths.

- 1. Leave it be, live with the status quo, but for how long?
- 2. Call another neighbor or friend, floor plan maybe they have a better idea-confusion may now rule
- 3. Call a designer, get professional advice and guidance with a real solution to your problem




Strawberry Fields Forever! Long Grove **Hosts 25th Annual Strawberry Fest!**

Focus on Rhinoplasty

"It's as plain as the nose on your face."

This old adage says a lot about this central feature of our anatomy. Occupying the middle third of the face, probably no other single feature can so dramatically affect our appearance. The nose determines to a great extent the balance and symmetry of our faces. If one's nose is out of proportion to the rest of their features, it can dominate their looks. Someone who doesn't like their nose can focus on it, becoming self-conscious and insecure. A change in the appearance of their nose can make all the difference in the world to them. This is why rhinoplasty surgery is one of the most common plastic surgical procedures being performed in the United States today.

What is rhinoplasty?

This is the part of nasal surgery that changes the outer shape of the nose. This is accomplished by a combination of removing and/or repositioning cartilage and bone which is already present. The goal is to shape the nose in a natural way so it is balanced and in harmony with the rest of the face and does not appear to have been "done."

What is external rhinoplasty?

In traditional rhinoplasty there are multiple incisions made inside the nose in order to reach the cartilage and bone. In addition, the cartilage usually needs to be "delivered" or pulled out of the nostril in order to operate on it.

External rhinoplasty is a technique we use in which one single incision is made starting just inside the nostril on one side and extending across the base of the nose

to the other side. This allows the cartilage to be worked on in its natural position without distortion and provides a much greater visibility during the operation. Also, there is very little bleeding during external rhinoplasty due to the single incision. We have found this technique gives much better control and predictability of the final result. We can also eliminate the need to pack the nose which significantly reduces the post-operative discomfort. External rhinoplasty is used on the majority of our patients.

What is a septoplasty?

The central support structure of the nose is the septum. It is made up of cartilage in the front of the nose and bone further back. This is what divides the nose lengthwise into two separate sides. The septum is often "deviated" or crooked due to some type of trauma earlier in life. This can lead to sinus infections as well as a chronic stuffy nose. If the deviation is located just beneath the bridge of the nose, it can cause the external form to look crooked. During a septoplasty, both the cartilaginous and bony portions of the septum are (Please continue on page 31)

Previous consumer studies have proved that a beautiful smile will make you more attractive. But according to research conducted by Beall Research & Training of Chicago, a new smile will make you appear more intelligent, interesting, successful and wealthy to others as well.

Pictures of eight individuals were shown to 528 Americans, a statistically valid cross section of the population. The respondents were asked to quickly judge the eight people as to how attractive, intelligent, happy, successful in their career, friendly, interesting, kind, wealthy, popular with the opposite sex and sensitive to other people they were.


Two sets of photos were created, with each set showing four individuals before undergoing cosmetic dentistry and four after treatment. Half the respondents viewed set A, the other half set B. The eight subjects viewed by respondents were evenly divided by gender. Two had mild improvements through cosmetic dentistry, two had moderate improvements and four had major improvements to their smiles, to give a wide range for respondents to view. None, however, had visibly





rotten teeth, missing teeth or catastrophically bad dental health in the before shots. Respondents were not told that they were looking at dentistry, but were asked to make snap judgments rating each person for the 10 characteristics, on a scale of one to 10, with "one" being "not at all," and 'ten" being "extremely."

The results indicated that an attractive smile does have broad-ranging benefits. While the change was most dramatic for attractive, popular with the opposite sex, wealthy and successful in their career, the change was statically significant in all ar-
